# I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

Your Excellencies, Reverend Fathers and Dear Brothers,

"Do not be afraid! You are looking for Jesus of Nazareth who was crucified. He has risen... Go, tell the disciples..." (Mark 16, 6-7). With these words spoken at the empty tomb, we are invited into the heart of the paschal mystery. Do not be afraid. Do not look for Jesus among the dead. He is not to be found in an empty tomb. The Crucified One is risen! Go and tell his disciples. Tell the world.



This same "Good News," which we call "Gospel" is entrusted to us: The One who was crucified is risen, never again to die! And the Lord has given us the mandate to share this news with "all creation." You and I are messengers to our world that what happened long ago, first in the upper room and in the hall of the praetorium guard, then through the streets of Jerusalem and on the hill of Calvary. At the end we know that the tomb could not contain the Lord, that He rose: this is the joyful news that we share with others..

This joyful news has not only changed the course of humanity, but it has transformed our very lives. We are heirs to the message given to Mary in the garden that Easter morning, heirs to the first believers who heard the news from her and who then encountered the Lord on Easter night. The message which we bring to the world is this: in the Risen Jesus, love has triumphed over hatred, mercy over sinfulness, goodness over evil, truth over falsehood, and life over death. My friends, do we transmit this joy to those we meet? Do we give credible witness to our encounter with the Risen Lord, whose word we hear and whose Body and Blood we share? Do we allow the Resurrection to turn even the darkness that is in our lives and

our world into a bright promise of hope?

Resurrection is about seeing our world in a new way. Early that Easter morning, Mary Magdalene did not find what she was looking for, the dead body of Jesus. But she found something better than she could have imagined: the Risen Jesus. Sometimes, the things we think we want most are not granted to us. What we get instead is an experience of God's new ways of working in the world. That's the power of the Resurrection. When those moments come, we must spread the news—just as Mary Magdalene did: We have seen the Lord! From hearts immersed in Easter joy, we are compelled to share this Good News that the Lord is truly risen. Like the holy women, we too must obey the Angel's command to hasten and announce to others the message of joy and hope that is Jesus' triumph. It is more urgent than ever that the men and women of our age come to know and encounter Jesus. We believe in a Risen Lord who has defeated evil and death. Let us have the courage to bring this joy and this light into every corner of our lives, our families and our communities. Jesus' Resurrection means that He is alive and walks side by side with us in life. It is the message that Pope Francis wants us to bring to the world, going out to our streets, to the peripheries of our cities.

My prayer in the period of Easter is that our lives may be filled with His Spirit and be penetrated more and more by the presence of Jesus the Redeemer, so that we become signs and witnesses before the people and proclaim the Gospel ever anew! May we experience ever more fully the joy, peace and power of the Risen Jesus, our Redeemer! May Mary, our Mother of Perpetual Help, accompany us as she accompanied the first disciples! And May St Thomas our father in faith help us to proclaim our Christ experience with the acclamation, "My Lord and My God". Jesus is risen! Alleluia! In the joy of those words, I wish you all a blessed and happy Easter.

#### II. NEWS FROM THE GENERALATE

(From 20 December 2018- 10 April 2019)

#### 1. Priestly Ordinations

The priestly ordinations of seventeen *ordinandi* took place in their respective home-parishes, between the days from 26 December 2018 to 5 January 2019. The Director General, the members of the General Council, representatives from the MST seminaries, especially the Rector and staff of Ruhalaya, Ujjain took part in all the ordinations. There were several of our priest-members in Kerala and from the missions, the missionary collaborators including the religions sisters, the lay faithful of Santhome Fellowship, the benefactors and the major seminarians of the MST who took the trouble for attending the ordinations. The ordinations were opportunities for missionary animation in the parishes and in cementing our relations with the eparchies in Kerala.

The Prelates who ordained our deacons have been very generous and kind to speak good about the MST by recognizing our missionary commitment, in their messages. His Beatitude Major Archbishop Mar George Cardinal Alencherry presided over five ordinations and blessed the MSTs with appreciatory words. His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel also presided five ordinations. Other ordaining prelates were Archbishop Mar Joseph Perumthottam, Mar James Athikalam, Mar Thomas Thuruthimattam, Mar John Nellikunnel, Mar Joseph Pamplany, Mar Jacob Muricken and Mar Sebastian Vaniapurackal who ordained one each ordinandus. Bishop Mar Joseph Kunnathu was present for one of the ordinations. The Director General personally wrote to all of them and thanked them for availing their time for the MST. A separate circular was issued to all the members of the MST (Circular No. X/8) recognizing the vocation promoters, the formators in various seminaries, the benefactors and other collaborators who contributed in the making of seventeen new priests for the MST.

#### 2. Gathering of the Rectors of the MST Seminaries

A short gathering of the Rectors of all our seminaries was held on 04 January 2019. It was to create an occasion for all the rectors to

converse with all the members in the General Council in common, and to develop seamless accompaniment in the formation programme, in all the stages of formation. All the Rectors and the members in the General Council were present for the meeting. Each rector was given the opportunity to share his concerns in common, and discussions were held on matters that needed deliberations. It was felt among the Rectors that the students need to be given training in Hindi and English languages at all the stages of formation.

The gathering was also made use as an opportunity to plan out the themes, resource persons and programmes of the upcoming refresher programmes of all the formators during the summer holidays. The Director General and the Vice Director - who is also the formation secretary, led and guided the discussions.

#### 3. Regional Assignment of New Priests

Immediately after the ordinations, on 9 January 2019, the regional assignment of the new priests were done following C.44 of the Constitutions and Directives of MST and it was announced through Circular No. X/8 (to retrieve the Circular, See Appendix I of this Bulletin). The regional assignments were done primarily based on the places of their missionary training in the field (regency) as mentioned by D36c of the MST C&D. Out of 17 new priests, six each were assigned to St Thomas and St Alphonsa regions, while five were assigned to St Paul Region.

In addition to the regional assignment, the General Council also selected and appointed priests for Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation (MQMD), Delhi and for the recently launched Orissa Mission. One priest each from every region was chosen for MQMD and thus three new priests were assigned to delegation. For Orissa mission, one each was chosen from St Paul and St Thomas regions and two from St Alphonsa, with total of four new priests for Orissa Mission. One of the new priests assigned to St Thomas Region was sent to the mission eparchy of Sagar, M.P., in response to the request of the Bishop of Sagar, Mar James Athikalam MST.

#### 4. Orissa Mission: Co-ordinator and Members

With the consent of the General Council, the Director General appointed Rev. Fr Joseph Ayyankanal as the coordinator of Orissa Mission of the MST with effect from 7 January 2019. As the mission co-ordinator, he is asked to take lead in making studies and consultations for starting new programmes and centres, following the guidance of Rev. Fr Thomas Karamel, the Councillor-in-Charge of Mission Expansion. He will also be the local director of the MST members working in Orissa.

Following the spirit of the General Assembly-2018, the General Council has given the directions to the mission co-ordinator and the new members of Orissa mission to focus more on direct evangelization and on building up communities, following unstructured patterns and a lifestyle of simplicity. The joint meeting of the General Council together with the co-ordinator and the members of the Orissa mission was held on 7 February 2019, to explain and discuss the new approaches to be applied in Orissa.

At the request of FIAT Mission (a lay organization for mission *ad gentes*), the service of Rev. Fr Jose Cheriampanatt has been offered and he is accompanying the FIAT missionaries in Orissa. The MST has promised the service of one of our priests to the FIAT, to assist them with sacramental ministry in their expeditions.

The members of the new missionary team in Orissa are preparing themselves by receiving orientation and training in language and culture of the place. They started living in a rented house now and will be dispersed to different centres after the national elections.

#### 5. Sleehusa - Commissioning of New Priests

In view of orienting the new priests to the ground realities of priestly-missionary living, a programme named *Sleehusa-2019* has been introduced by the General Council, which was executed by the expert team constituted for the Ongoing Formation of the MST. The orientation included practical sessions led by lay leaders, religious sisters and experienced priests. At the conclusion of the Sleehusa, a ceremonious 'sending forth' of the new missionaries to the mission

territories was included to signify that the new priests were being sent by the MST to the whole world for doing the purpose of the Society—mission *ad gentes* (MST C&D, C2). The General Council has planned to set *Sleehusa* as part of the ongoing formation at the beginning of the priest ministry and to conduct this programme for every new batch of priests. A detailed report of *Sleehusa 2019* is presented towards the end of this Bulletin by the co-ordinator of expert team for ongoing formation.

#### 6. Joint Meeting of GC and RC

From 15 to 16 February 2019, the members Regional Councils (RC) and the Council of Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation came together at Deepti Bhavan, for series of joint and separate meetings with the General Council (GC). This joint meeting of the GC and RC began with spiritual animation led by Rev. Fr Saju Thuppalanjiyil MST. The Director General welcomed the gathering and presented the scope of the joint meeting, emphasizing the need of collective thinking, evaluation and action plans for the Centre and for every administrative unit. Every member of the General Council and the Treasurer General presented the report of the portfolios they are entrusted with, discussed and gathered the opinions of the council members from the region and delegation.

The Regional Directors and the Delegate, together with their Council members presented the developments in the regions/delegation and sought suggestions on their future plan of actions. The mutual exchanges were helpful for the members from the administrative units to capture a wider picture of the Society.

There were separate forums organized for the leaders in the administrative units to meet with the General Council. And finally, there was the concluding session that discussed on selected items in view of the quinquennial planning of the common programmes and for fixing our priorities and thrust areas.

#### 7. Meeting of the MSTs in Preaching Ministry

A short meeting of the MST priests involved in preaching ministry was organized in Deepti Bhavan, under the leadership of the portfolio in charge, Rev. Fr Peter Kavumpuram. Nine MST priests directly

involved in the preaching ministry attended the meeting. The Director General and the members of the General Council were also present. The meeting discussed about: (1) the possibility of holding one day prayer meet for the public at Deepti Mount, (2) intensifying direct preaching in our mission regions/areas and (3) organizing a retreat team for leading mission retreats for the missionary personnel and communities in the mission areas.

Rev. Frs Saju Thuppalanjiyil and Jacob Purayidom volunteered to lead 'one day prayer meet' for the public at Deepti; and Rev. Fr James Kurikilamkatt volunteered to take up the challenge of forming a retreat team of MST priests, specialized in sharing Thomasine Spirituality for the communities and missionary personnel in the Syro-Malabar missions.

#### 8. Celebrations of Foundation Day

#### a. One Day Prayer-meet for the Public

Making use of the facility of the roofed gathering space in front of the Guest House of the Generalate, the General Council planned to launch the proposed one day retreat for the public beginning with the celebration of the foundation day of the MST. The permission of the local ordinary was also secured in this regard. Rev. Fr Saju Thuppalanjiyil led the prayer session and preaching from 9.30 am on 22 February 2018. Facility for the reception of Sacrament of Reconciliation was arranged in the public chapel. Rev. Fr Binoy Purayidom also joined him in preaching in the afternoon. There were more than 400 people who participated in the prayer-meet. Sharing the joy of the Foundation Day, lunch was served for all of them.

The one day prayer for the public is now being repeated every fourth Saturday. The second one was conducted on 23 March, which was led by Fr Zacharias Thadathil and the next one will be on 27 April.

## b. Solemn Holy Qurbana by Bishop Kallarangatt

The foundation day was marked with the solemn Holy Qurbana presided over by Bishop Mar Joseph Kallarangatt of Pala, at 11.00 am in the gathering hall. All the priests in Deepti Mount and many

others working in different places in Kerala were also present for the Eucharistic celebration. There were almost 40 MST priests present for the Holy Qurbana of the Foundation Day.

#### c. Promise of Association and Associate Missionaries

During the solemn Holy Qurbana of the Foundation Day, 16 lay faithful made the promise of association before the Director General, to be the formal associate missionaries of the MST. In accordance with Appendix I of the Constitutions and Directives of the MST and following the Guidelines for the Associate Missionaries of the MST, they have been selected by our coordinators and were given training for several months. They have been collaborating with the MST for many years as members of Santhome Fellowship. Some information about the promise of association and on the first associate missionaries has been shared through Circular No. X/9 in the second week of February 2019. The final pages of this Bulletin give more details of the associate missionaries. Reading the signs of the times, it is time that the MST plans and involves the missionary associates in our apostolic activities. Please get to know about our associate missionaries and dream about involving them in our missionary programmes in the future

The MST appreciates Fr Monse Karuvankunnel, the coordinator and Rev. Fr Peter Kavumpuram, the Councillor in charge of this programme, in realizing the provision of missionary associates, according to the nature of the MST. Let us also place on record our gratitude and appreciation to those who initiated the programme of Santhome Fellowship, the coordinators and General Councillors who nurtured this programme and all those who have collaborated with them in various ways. We hope and pray that with the inclusion of missionary associates, the MST may take the lead in developing and displaying a different participatory missionary approach and attitude in the Syro-Malabar Church.

# 9. Completion of Higher Studies

The following members have completed their assigned study programmes and have returned with advanced degrees and skills, for missionary involvement. Congratulations to all of them. They are:

**Thekkemuryil Scaria (Jiby):** Obtained Master Degree with A Grade, in Educational Administration (M Ed.) in the month of December 2018, from Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio, USA.

**Vernakunnel Joseph (Bibin):** Secured Master Diploma in Interior Design with Silver Medal in January 2019 from St Francis Institute of Art and Design, Mumbai.

**Kavunnukattil Joseph (Lijo):** Completed Masters in Business Administration (MBA) as the topper from Christ University, Bangalore in the first week of April 2019.

# 10. Sponsors of the Seminarians

The MST is grateful to all its benefactors for their support through prayer and financial assistance. We have several generous minds who regularly support the formation of our seminarians. We assign to the donors only major seminarians who have been promoted to theology studies after completing their regency, since dropouts are minimum at the theology studies. Multiple benefactors are allotted to the theology students; and the contributions by the benefactors is a vital means to gather resources for the formation programmes.

The seventeen new priests who were ordained after Christmas 2018 were supported by 48 benefactors. The MST thanks all of them for their annual bursaries of contributions. A few among them have agreed to continue their support by taking up new seminarians. Out of the 48 sponsors, nine of them were mentored through Fr Jacob (Lalu) Kulathoopurayidom in Australia, six were connected through Fr Thomas Plappallil of Switzerland, five through Santhome Fellowship programmes and two each through Frs George Olickal and Joseph Koren (Italy). Others were connected through Rev. Frs Kisincher Aniyekatt, George Thotteeparampil, Antony Thundathil, Sebastian Earthedath, Joseph Vandanoor, Binu Thottiyil, George KMP and Jose Palakeel. The MST appreciates the initiatives of our members in finding sponsors for the formation programme and for other needs.

As of now, we have 97 sponsors supporting the seminarians of three batches in theology, who are almost regular in paying the bursaries.

These sponsors have been connected through our priests working in Germany, America, Italy, Australia, Sweden and Switzerland, and also through the ministry of Santhome Fellowship and through the efforts of some of our priest-members in India. This year (2019-2020), we are expecting to promote 11 seminarians to theology. The sponsors are expected to pay the sum of Rs 35,000/ (or its approximate equivalent – USD 500, Euro 500, GBP 400, CAD and AUD 600) every year for one seminarian, for four years. One can also make the onetime payment of Rs 140,000 or its equivalent, if they wish so. There is also the scheme of endowment of Rs 500,000/- which entitles the donors to be a lifetime sponsor of MST seminarians. Once the assigned seminarian gets ordained, they will be assigned with a new seminarian of first year theology and the process will be repeated lifetime (of the donor). Kindly recommend sponsors from your families, friends or contacts for the 11 seminarians entering to theology, and refer the details of the sponsors to Fr Justin Vettukallel, the Councillor in charge of the sponsorship programme.

# 11. Santhome Ayurveda: Handed over to St Alphonsa Region

In the light of the discussions held between the Regional Council and the General Council during our last two meetings held in August 2018 and February 2019, the ownership of Santhome Ayurveda – Bedshi, including both its Assets and Programmes, is transferred to St Alphonsa Region with effect from 1 April 2019.

It was clearly evidenced from the letter of the Former Director General that 'Santhome Ayurveda will be owned by the Sangli Mission Society' (Prot. No. 116/2018, 12 April 2018). The former Regional Director of St Alphonsa Region had formally taken up the responsibility of implementing the project of Santhome Ayurveda (Letter of Regional Director dated 21 September 2017). Therefore, considering the original plans and decisions on the Santhome Ayurveda Centre by the previous General Council and Regional Council, and the functional difficulties in executing the project and in achieving the missionary goals of ministry by operating from the Generalate, it has been strongly felt by the present General Council that it shall be handed over to St Alphonsa Region. The Director General will contine to be the patron of the Aurveda centre and the ministry.

From the very beginning of this venture, St Alphonsa Region has been involving in the execution of the project by using the amount due to the Generalate from the prescribed contribution of the institutions of the Region to Generalate. The present regional administration has informed the General Council that a sum of Rs 89,50,00.00 is spent for the construction of the building so far, which forms part of the amount that had to be transferred to the Generalate during the past two financial years (2017-2019). St Alphonsa Region has been taking care of the maintenance of the centre by regular payment of the monthly allowance as well. The General Council has asked the regional administration to pay its due contributions to the Generalate of the past two years, including the amount used for the construction of the building of Santhome Ayurveda at Bedshi. We thank and appreciate teh regional administration for its untiring efforts in taking up the challenge towards materializing the dream of this new apostolate in the area.

The General Council has promised to St Alphonsa Region that its support for Santhome Ayurveda will be continued by way of sharing the trained personnel in this field and other expertise, facilities, etc. available to the Society. Recently, a project that has been submitted to the Italian Bishops' Conference is approved and a substantial amount is expected to be released in May 2019 as the first instalment. We wish the Regional team and the members involved in this ministry all the best in realizing the missionary goals through Santhome Ayurveda Centre and intercede the blessings for the Lord for the same

# 12. Committee for Feasibility Study on Utilization of Underused Land of Ruhalaya

Considering various suggestions for proper utilization of the land property of Ruhalaya (theology section) and the apprehensions about the risk in owning the underused land in that area due to government regulations, General Council of the MST constituted a committee for gathering expert opinion on options and methods of using the said land asset towards financial self-sufficiency of Ruhalaya Major

Seminary. The committee is requested to submit the report latest by 31st August 2019. The members of the committee are:

#### 13. Visits Abroad

The Director General, Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor visited the MST priests working in Germany, Switzerland and Austria from 5 March to 10 April 2019. He had scheduled visits with the Bishops and Vicar Generals of many of the dioceses in Germany and with the Cardinal of Vienna in Austria, seeking more opportunities of pastoral involvement and other supports. The available chances were also made use to submit project proposals and special requests for the support of seminary formation. There were positive responses in several instances. The ordinaires in general are happy with the committed ministry of the MST priests.

Fr Justin Vettukallel visited the United States of America from 7 to 20 March 2019, primarily to celebrate a memorial Holy Mass for one of our deceased benefactors in Dayton, Ohio. He visited our priests working in Florida and had a meeting with the Bishop and other officials of the diocese of St Petersburg along with Rev. Fr Sebastian Earthedath. He also visited Bishop Jacob Angadiath of Chicago, along with Fr Thundahtil, the Coordinator of MST in USA. The bishops appreciated the service of the MST priests in their dioceses and some positive responses were given to the requests made.

#### 14. Upcoming Common Programmes (April-May 2019)

a. Review of the Proposed Draft of MST C&D (14 May 2019) For those MSTs in Kerala and around, a study and discussion on the proposed draft of the MST Constitutions and Directives is being held at Deepti Bhavan from 10.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on 14 May April 2019. (It is rescheduled from 23 April - the day of parliament election purpose. All those MSTs in Kerala and around, and anyone who missed this study session in the mission regions or delegation are invited to join here at Deepti.

# **b.** Refresher Program for Formators (28 April to 1May 2019) All the formators of the MST both serving in MST formation houses as well as in other formation centres are invited to join the refresher program for the formators being held at PDS, Peerumedu from 28 April to 1 May 2019.

# c. Gathering of the Major Seminarians, Vestition and Temporary Promise (6-8 May 2019)

The annual gathering of all the MST major seminarians will be held from 6-8 May 2019, at the Generalate. On the concluding day (8 May), there will take place the first temporary promise by the seminarians who have been promoted to Philosophy after the MOC, and the vestition and renewal of the promise by the seminarians promoted to Theology after regency. May I place our seminarians for your prayerful support.

#### 10. AASTHA CBR Project for the Disabled, Sangli

- a. A baseline survey to identify the need of the community in line with the goal and objectives of Aastha Project was carried out in all the 15 project villages by MSW Professors and Students of Tilak Maharashtra University, Sangli Branch and a Base Line Report prepared.
- b. Training for the intellectually challenged Children: Various teaching and learning materials such as slates, slate pencils, visual charts, flash cards, sketch pens, drawing books, puzzles, etc were used to teach intellectually challenged children as per their intellectual quotient/capability to read, write, identify alphabets, numerical, animals, birds, flowers, vehicles, parts of the body, colors, etc. The intellectually challenged children are taught actions songs and are made to take part in educational games, indoor & outdoor games, group physical exercises and Yoga.
- c. Christmas Celebration in the villages: During Christmas, celebrations were conducted by the project in all the 15 project villages the intellectually, physically challenged and children with speech and hearing impairment took part in dance and skit. They got a platform to explore their talent and boosted their confidence. The children got a different kind of joy while performing. They were also given the Christmas gift of steel plate, steel bowl and steel cup.
- d. Training for the intellectually disabled on daily living skills: Referring the Individual rehabilitation Plan of 372 differently abled children, training the intellectually challenged children in their basic

activities of daily living skill like brushing, washing, grooming, teaching them to identity & tell pictures, colors, shapes, cut, fold, paste, read & write alphabets, numerical and giving them physical therapy and speech therapy are carried out respectively.

- **e.** Workshops for preparing teaching and learning materials: 01 workshop at project office and 06 workshops at six project villages on preparing teaching and learning materials were conducted. 15 village staff, special educator, speech therapist, respective cluster coordinators, 64 parents of the differently abled children, 43 differently abled children, 6 members of Adolescent Group, 3 members of Children's Parliament and 01 Anganwadi Sevika participated in the workshops respectively.
- **f. Training for the Anganwadi Sevikas:** 10 trainings were conducted for 127 Anganwadi Sevikas of 10 project villages. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards inclusion of special children in mainstream education and early childhood education.
- **g.** Trainings for the Mobile Teachers: 6 trainings were conducted for 60 mobile teachers. The mobile teachers were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards inclusion of special children in mainstream education and early childhood education.
- **h. ENT Medical Camp at Miraj:** An ENT (ears, nose & throat) and eye checkup camp were simultaneously arranged by the project on the 23<sup>rd</sup> of February 2018. The camps were arranged with collaboration with Yashashree ENT Hospital and Lions Eye Hospital both situated in the *Miraj* Tehsil. 10 children and 45 adults came for

the ENT camp. Ear cleaning of 02 children was done and 53 patients are per investigation are suggested medications, *Tympanoplasty*, Mastoidectomy speech therapy, hearing aid and cochlear implant respectively. 60 patients came for the Eye checkup camp. 12 adults and on 01 child were given spectacles to correct their vision. 01 adult and 01 child underwent cataract surgery and lens implant.

- i. Artificial limbs and assistive devices investigation camp: The Artificial Limbs Manufacturing Corporation of India (ALIMCO) which had conducted the artificial limbs and assistive devices investigation camp at 4 Tehsil (block) level, provided 280 patients of 15 project villages with assistive devices like wheel chair, tri-cycle, ADL kit, sensor therapy kit, guiding stick for the blind, hearing aid, elbow stick, walker, caliper and artificial limbs.
- j. Corrective Surgeries: A girl Sampada Maruti Salunkhe had surgery for her knee. A boy Rudra Deepak Gurav had surgery for hole in his heart; pace maker is implanted in his heart. Two children, Varad Rajaram Mane and Omkar Bajrang Suryawanshi had surgery for both legs. One boy had surgery for his eyes and one girl had surgery for her cleft-palate. An adult Shewanti Chougule and a girl Aarti Sonawne had surgeries for cataract and lens were implanted. 3 children were provided corrective shoes, one child was provided a hearing aid, one child was provided a knee belt and a walker and one child was given a wheel chair with commode.
- k. Prenatal and Postnatal Care program for the Pregnant Ladies and Nursing Mothers: 04 Prenatal and Postnatal Care programs were conducted for pregnant ladies and nursing mothers of 04 project villages. 30 pregnant ladies and 11 nursing mothers participated in the program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards preventive measures to be taken to avoid giving birth to malnourished or disabled child.

- **l. Nutritious Food Supply for the needy:** 18 needy special children were helped to purchase nutritious food, medications for epilepsy, vitamins and iron deficiencies respectively which are unaffordable to purchase by their parents. 04 children were helped to do medical tests. 01 child was given support for nutritious food.
- m. Physiotherapy and speech therapy provided for the disabled Children: Physiotherapy was given to 115 children and it included giving children therapies on the gym ball, air-bike, reflex and massage therapy. As a result there is improvement in the mobility of children, the tightness in the muscles of their limbs have become loose & relaxed and they are able to move their limbs adequately than before. Some children are able to sit, stand and even walk with a help of a support. Speech therapy was given to 152 children and it included techniques such as candle flame blowing, confetti blowing with a straw, corrective tongue movement and pronunciation. As a result children are able to pronounce better than before and some children have learnt to say a small simple word and even a short simple sentence.
- **n.Training program for the Aasha Health workers:** 05 training programs were conducted for paramedical (Aasha) health workers in 05 project villages. 30 paramedical workers participated for the training program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of disability.
- o. Training program for the parents on health and hygiene: 10 training programs for parents on health and hygiene of their children were conducted in 10 project villages. 139 parents of special children participated in the training program. They were made aware on the importance on health and hygiene of their children and were also told to give training on the same to their children at home.
- **p.** Training for the adolescent boys and girls on health and hygiene: 11 training on health and hygiene for adolescent boys and girls were conducted in 11 project village. 653 adolescent girls and

- 118 adolescent boys participated in the training program. The training was separately given for boys and girls in their respective schools. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics objectives. results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of disability.
- q. Training for pregnant ladies on health care: 06 training program on health care were conducted for pregnant ladies of 6 project villages. 101 pregnant ladies participated in the training program. They were told about the importance of healthy living during pregnancy such as healthy eating habits, medications, immunization and its effects on delivery. They were told to avail free services of the Primary Health Care Centre in the villages, for normal and surgical deliveries. They were also told about the schemes from the government such as Sukanya Postal Life Insurance, Janani Suraksha, etc. for their child. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of disability.
- r. Awareness program for the disabled on forming Disabled Persons Organization: 08 awareness programs for person with disabilities on the topic of Disabled Peoples Organization (DPO) were conducted in 8 project villages. 211 differently abled adults (127 men and 84 women) participated in the awareness program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village.
- s. Awareness and training program for women on SHG **formation:** 12 awareness and training program in 12 project villages were conducted for women on Self Help Group (SHG). 322 women

participated in the training program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were made aware on the importance of SHG. They were told that SHG is a medium for unity, social and financial independency of women, betterment of their families and women empowerment. They were told about the rules and code of conduct of SHG. They were told not to fall prey to micro finance banks, which lure people by giving loan and chunk out large amount in return through high interest rates. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards development of children and persons with disabilities and their families through Self Help Groups and prevention of disability. As a result 24 Self Help Groups are formed consisting 308 members and 01 mixed Self Help Group is formed consisting 05 men and one women.

t. Awareness program on forming Village Development Committee: 10 awareness program on forming of Village Development Committee (VDC) on village level was conducted in 10 project villages. A total of 286 participants which included head of village council, deputy head of village council, members of village council, school teachers, key persons of the village, leaders from the village and people from the community participated in the awareness program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were made aware on the importance of VDC. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards development of children and persons with disabilities and their families and prevention of disability through VDC. Key persons and leaders from the village assured their involvement and support. Very soon the DPOs of all the 15 villages will register their respective groups.

u. Awareness and Training program for forming village level SHGs: 09 awareness and training program in 09 project villages on

Village Level Self Help Group (SHG) Federation were conducted for women, and members of Self Help Group (SHG). 303 women SHG members participated for the program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were made aware on the importance of SHG. They were told that SHG is a medium for unity, social and financial independency of women, betterment of their families and women empowerment. They were told not to fall prey to micro finance banks, which lure people by giving loan and chunk out large amount in return through high interest rates. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards development of children and persons with disabilities and their families through Self Help Groups and prevention of disability.

- v. Exposure Visit: The project arranged an exposure visit at Swayansiddhi women's business group at Kolhapur. 67 women members of Self Help Group participated. The members were introduced various small scale business undertaken by the women at Swayansiddh. A mother of a sponsored child of Dudhgaon project village inspired from the business has started her own business of selling pickles in the village. She puts up the stall in the weekly market and earns good profit.
- w. Women's Day Celebration: On International Women's Day which was celebrated on 8th March 2018 women in large number took part in all the 15 project villages. The women participated in games in their respective villages. The women of the villages got an opportunity to come out of their homes and socialize and have a memorable with other women of their village.
- x. Training for adolescent girls on forming and strengthening of Adolescent group: 08 programs in 8 project villages were conducted for adolescent girls on forming and strengthening of adolescent group. 101 girls participated for the program. They were told about the objective of forming group of adolescent girls. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and

reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of disability. As a result 02 groups of adolescent girls are formed. As a result 06 groups consisting 68 adolescent girls are formed

- y. Awareness programs for the members of Panchayati Raj Institutions: 04 awareness programs for members of Panchayat Raj Institution (PRI) were conducted in 04 project villages wherein there were 101 participants. Village Council President, Vice President, Village Council Members, Elderly Citizens of the village and retired School Teachers were present for the program. They were introduced to Sangli Mission Society, Aastha CBR Project and reason for intervention in the village, project dynamics, objectives, results and impact. They were made aware on causes of disabilities, types of disabilities, disabled and data of disabled of their respective village. They were also made aware on their role and responsibilities towards prevention of disability and their work towards the better of disabled and their families. They were shown the activities conducted by Aastha project in their respective village through a power point presentation.
- z. Annual Gathering of the Aastha Project Disabled Children in Villages: Annual Gatherings arranged by the project in the month of March 2018, the intellectually, physically challenged children and children with speech & hearing impairment took part in the dance and skit programs. They once got a platform to showcase their talent which boosted their confidence.

Further team members proceeded to the next destination

#### f. Visit by USA team

On 08-02-2019 Ms. Robin and team from USA visited Gyansarovar Deepti Foundation project. The guests had reached the project office by 2.15 pm. Fr. Santhosh welcomed the chief guest thereafter he explained them on the day today activities of program running in the area. The guests expressed that they work on female health and hygiene. They further moved to the Rajeevnagar centre where in they have been introduced to the women and teenage girls gathered there. Further they had session on menstrual hygiene to female gathering there. Ms. Nayana and Dhanya facilitated the session through necessary translation. The guests distributed freely 100 reusable sanitary napkins, made in USA.

#### g. Women's Day

International Women's day was celebrated in Deepti foundation Gyansarovar on 08-03-2019. The program started at 11.15am in Deepti Foundation Office at Dilshad Garden. The chief guest of the program was Dr. Jyotika Taneja, Guest lecturer, Delhi school of social work and special invitee was Ms. Varsha Sahni,



Yoga Trainer, AIIMS. Fr. Santosh, Director of Deepti Foundation welcomed all to the programme. Further Ms. Nayana Cherian initiated all to the cultural program. The women from different Self-help groups performed dances, maims and musical dramas. Ms. Ruby from Bandhan Self Help Group thanked all for the valuable presence. There were 101 participants and were provided sumptuous lunch.

## 2. Rehabilitation of People with HIV/AIDS

## a. HRG Meeting

Four HRG meetings were conducted from January to March. Around 94 people attended these HRG meetings which were headed by Ms

Dhanya James, the counsellor and Mr Joy Jacob, the project



coordinators. These meetings took placed in different areas like Harsh Vihar, Loni, Neher and Maujpur. The people covered in these meetings were mainly female sex workers. They were told about HIV/AIDS, on how it spread and the causes for it. They

were even shown a video which described the myths related to it and also gave a detailed description of HIV.

#### b. Public Distribution of Brochures

The Caritas animators distributed brochures on HIV/AIDS in different areas like Shastri Park, Brajpur, Bhopra, Usmanpur, Loni, Gokulpuri and Mandoli. Around 2065 brochures were distributed among Rikshaw drivers, vendors, cobblers, bus drivers and conductors and to general public.

## c. Counselling

From January to March a total number of 40 infected people have been given home based counselling. They were given an open space for communication where they could share their burden.

#### d. Nutritional Support



In the month of January, nutritional support was given to around 24 families who were selected by the animators. The families that were given support were all from below poverty line

### e. Distribution of Warm Clothes

Warm clothes were distributed to many families who are below poverty line in the month of January.



The animators selected the families on the basis of the house visits that they made.

#### 3. Social Empowerment Programmes

#### a. SHG

Six new SHG groups were formed newly in the areas of Sundar Nagari, Maujpur, Welcome and Seelampur. Eighteen formation meetings have been made. The monthly savings of three groups namely Naiumang (Sundar Nagari), Deepti (Sundar Nagari) and Dhanya (Seelampur) have increased from 100 to 500 because of their economic stability. The leaders of these six groups have been selected and given loan from time to time. And all the monthly savings were deposited in their respective bank accounts.

#### b. Self-defence Class

Self-defence course was given to 114 girls from SundarNagari, Nand



Nagari and Maujpur area. It was a short course which started from 31. 12. 2018 to 14. 01. 2019. Self-defence class was inaugurated by Fr. Santhosh. The resource persons were from Delhi Police. After the course, certificates were distributed to 114 girls who completed the course

successfully.

## c. Income Generating Programmes

On 2<sup>nd</sup> January around 19 SHG leaders from an organisation called Nirmal Jyoti Foundation, Vasant Kunj had come to visit Deepti Foundation. They were taken to Sundar Nagari centre where they were welcomed. They were even shown three group businesses



namely sewing of undergarments, battery charging business and packaging of socks. They were brought back to the Deepti Foundation office where they were provided with lunch.

## d. Vocational Training

Exams were held in all six centres for sewing, beauty parlour and mehandi. It was conducted from 18-25th February in which total of 190 students got certificates.

### e. Adolescent Girls Training

On 14th January, a meeting was held in Sundarnagari, Nandnagari for a group of 100 adolescent girls on elopement as it was seen that many girls were eloping from home. Another meeting happened on 26th February, in Sundarnagari, Nandnagari for a group of 39 adolescent girls. A discussion was held on how dropping out from school affects their life. They were told about the importance of education.

Seminary closes for summer holidays 31st May and re-opens in the first week of August. In the weekends I am also traveling to Finland and Norway to celebrate the Holy Mass for the Indian community in those countries. Of course we have Masses in Stockholm too. So please remember me in your prayers.

# VII. NEWS FROM OTHER MINISTRIES/ CENTRES

# A. Programmes of Ongoing Formation

#### 1. **SLEEHUSA-2019**

An orientation and commissioning programme for the newly ordained priests was conducted at Deepti Mount from  $4^{th}$  to  $7^{th}$  February 2019. The programme was named "SLEEHUSA-2019" (the ceremonious sending forth of the new priests to the missions). Fr Viju



Muringassery the coordinator of the expert team for ongoing formation welcomed all. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General of the MST inaugurated *Sleehusa* officially with the presence of General Councilors and he delivered an

In the current and the upcoming year, I am expecting almost 100% increase of students to Kalasadhana, which would diversify our courses, enrolling more students.

# 3. Affiliated to Trinity College London

Kalasadhana is now affiliated to Trinity College, London. Besides,

Kalasadhana academy is also recognized as the official examination centre of the Trinity College in Mumbai. 100 students are now preparing for June-July season examination in various subjects-Piano,



Guitar, Violin Drums. Kalasadhana had already been affiliated to Akhil Bharatiya Gandharva Mahavidhya Mandal Mumbai for Indian Music and Dance. With its formal ties with Trinity College, London, the courses of Kalasadhana would be recognized both nationally and internationally.

#### 4. Outreach Activities

The teaching faculty of Kalasadhana reaches out to the neighbouring schools and junior colleges, offering extension classes of music both vocal and instruments. Our academy is blessed is qualified staff to pursue in this regard, which in turn helps us get more regular students for Kalasadhana.

# 1. Vocation Camps at Santhome

Puthunjayar (the Sunday after Easter) is usually celebrated as Santhome Day at Pariyaram. This year it falls on 28th April and we are conducting a Santhome Day programme in the evening of Puthunjayar. All the priests and sisters of the nearby parishes and religious houses will be invited to the same. All the MST priests working in Malabar are also usually made part of the Santhome Day celebration. MST missionaries coming home for vacation are welcome to Pariyaram to participate in our celebrations. There is a standing invitation to all MST priests to visit Santhome Bible Centre at Pariyaram, especially to those who have not yet visited this place.

# 3. Santhome Bible Commentary

In the past few years we organized the releasing of new volumes of Santhome Bible Commentary together with Santhome Day celebrations. It is now decided to organize the releasing of new volumes of SBC at the Generalate of MST on 3rd July. Hence the **new volume on the Acts of the Apostles** will be released at Deepti on the feast of Dukrana.

This is to bring to your kind attention towards some important information that concerns all the members of the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle.

#### 1. Celebration of 51st Foundation Day of the MST

We are fast approaching the 51<sup>st</sup> Foundation Day of the MST and may I remind all of you regarding the Directive, "the day of foundation of the MST (February 22) shall be duly solemnised by the members in every house, Region and Delegation of the Society with special remembrance of the founder and the benefactors," (*MST Constitutions and Directives* - D 1b).
