





Cover Photo- Painting of Thomas the Apostle: A Collection from Thomasine Research Centre (TRC), Chaama MST Bhavan, Thumbur

I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

Dear Reverend Fathers, Reverend Deacons and Brothers,



of Christ, was too attached to Christ that his stubbornness to see Christ rose from the great love he had for his master. Experiencing the wounds of Christ, seeing it St Thomas proclaimed "My Lord, My God." It is the 'wound' experience from the risen Lord that made St Thomas the Apostle of India (Cf. Acts 4:20). This gives us a greater insight in the pandemic era. The 'wounds' of the Lord are to be experienced by each one of us in the sufferings and difficulties of oneself and that of others. The 'wounds' represent the sufferings, pains and difficulties of each and every human. Forgoing this 'wound;' not taking care of it (Cf. Parable of Good Samaritan) is causing pain to Christ (Acts 9:4).

Look to oneself; look into the society. The second wave of Covid have largely affected and inflicted heavy blow on each one of us. Many of our fellow brethren were affected and infected - our dear and near ones, missionary collaborators, members of Santhome Fellowship and associate missionaries, etc. etc. It was heart-breaking to see that about 500 priests and nuns lost their lives. As shepherds we were forced to watch our sheep being led to eternity. With this sadness we faced the sudden demise of Rev. Fr Nattunilam, an active young missionary and Rev. Fr Mattam, a zealous missionary leaving our earthy companionship.

In spite of this dangerous situation, the spirit of St Thomas to see

the wounds of others was lightened up in our missionaries. Our missionary brethren came up with many programs to extend the help for Covid affected and inflected people, expressing the resurrection experience. In every region and delegation our missionaries are active with charitable works like distribution of food kits and other necessities (2 Cor 8: 3-5). The Word of God should encourage us "Each one must do as he has made up his mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work" (2 Cor 9: 7,8).

Many of the programs were severely affected by this pandemic-the summer programs of the major seminarians, the mission exposure programs, major seminarians gatherings etc. Due to this pandemic situation our seminarians are tied up at home without any exposure-a kind of suffering. Trusting God let me remind lovingly, though there is lack of psychological and spiritual environment, it should not have negative impact on your motivation. The life of our Patron should encourage each one of us. In spite of all negative situations, he looked forward towards the face of the Lord proclaiming to his brothers "Let us also go, that we may die with him" (John 11:16).

Celebration of 'Dukrana', the remembrance of not just the person of St Thomas but of the personality and character of him, should help us to be more zealous and enthusiastic in our missionary commitment. Let's continue praying for each other during these days of the pandemic and reaching out to the needy with the love that our patron had for the risen Lord.

II. NEWS FROM THE GENERALATE

(From 21 March - 25 June 2021)

1. Second Wave of Covid-19

Many of us, in different parts of the world, have been gravely affected by the second wave of the pandemic covid-19. Almost all our places of apostolate in India, including the Generalate were hit by the second wave. Our fathers in Philippines, Brazil, Germany were also infected. As informed, a few among the members were seriously infected and underwent critical situations, but miraculously survived. Some of the members still feel certain post-covid symptoms and are in the slow process of recovery. Our prayers for each other were sources of strength and confidence.

It has been disheartening that many of our dear ones from our families, neighbourhoods and mission areas were called for eternal reward, affected by Covid. Our sorrows are multiplied as we have been restricted in many ways to offer the deserving homage to the departed ones. Although the lock down measures are getting gradually released, let us be cautious and diligently follow the regulations from the government and the Church in resuming the normalcy of our life and ministry.

2. Demise of our Members

The MST still grieves at the unexpected departures of two of our members – Rev. Frs John Nattunilath and Emmanuel Mattathil. Let us continue our prayers for them. The obligation of 'offering one Holy Qurbana for members on their demise' (C&D16 vii) had been reminded by the Director General to all members of the MST.

a. Rev. Fr John Nattunilath (1973-2021)

Rev. Fr John (Gigi) Nattunilath (48), a member assigned to St Paul Region of the MST, who had been ministering as the assistant Priestin-Charge of Shanti Mission Station, Jamner (Shajpur Dt) in the Eparchy of Ujjain, met with an accident at 6.45 a.m. on Good Friday (02-04-2021). He was traveling from Jamner to Kalapipal to conduct the Liturgy of the Good Friday for the Disciple Sisters of Christ



(DSC) at Kalapipal. On the way, his Bolero Jeep hit a stationary truck on the road. He was killed on the spot. His body was taken to the Community Health Centre at Kalapipal (Shajapur Dt). The DSC sisters were the first to reach the sport, along with their school staff, and then they informed Rev. Fr Thomas Manichirickal, the Priest-in-Charge of Jamner. Rev. Fr Thomas Manichirickal (Jamner) along with Rev. Fr Paul

Parekkattil (Shujalpur) rushed to the place, took care of the post-mortem and other proceedings at Kalapipal.

After a short prayer held at Shanti Bhavan, Jamner, the body was taken to R.D. Gardi Medical College, Ujjain for embalming. Later from 6.00 to 7.00 p.m., the mortal remains were placed in the cemetery chapel in Ujjain. Special prayers were led by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel, the Bishop of Ujjain. Many of the priests and sisters in Ujjain visited and paid homage to the departed missionary.

In consultation with the family members of Fr John Nattunilath, the funeral service was decided to be held at Deepti Bhavan on Wednesday, 6 April 2021 following the formalities of Covid-protocol. The body arrived in Kerala at 2.30 p.m. on Saturday (03-04-2021), accompanied by Rev. Frs Vincent Kadalikkattilputhenpura and Thomas Manichirickal, and was preserved at the mortuary of Devamatha Hospital, Koothattukulam. On Wednesday (06-04-2021) morning, by 7.00 a.m., he was taken to his home parish and then to his family at Kuninji (near Ramapuram/Koothattukulam). Bishop Mar George Madathikandathil of Kothamangalam paid homage to him at the parish church. By 11.30 a.m., the body was brought to Deepti Bhavan. The funeral rites integrated with the Holy Qurbana followed immediately. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General preached the eulogy. Bishop Mar Sebastian Vadakel presided over the final liturgy. Bishop Mar Joseph





Kallarangatt of Pala was also present by the end of the funeral. He was buried at the cemetery in Deepti Mount by 2.00 p.m.

Many priests, members of the religious communities from the vicinity, local political leaders, members of the MST, associate missionaries, friends, and neighbours came forward to offer homage to Fr John Nattunilath. The funeral ceremony was live telecasted and was attended by many members of the MST around the globe. On 14 April 2021, a *requiem* Holy Qurbana was offered at the Deepti Chapel attended by his family members. The personal details including the biodata of late Fr John Nattunilath were circulated to all the members through electronic media. The MST is grateful to Rev. Fr John Nattunilath, for all his initiatives for evangelization in different places of his priestly ministry that include the Eparchies of Palakkad, Thuckalay, Songea (Tanzania), and Ujjain. As customary, 'A Tribute' is presented towards the end of this Bulletin prepared by Rev. Fr George Pottananickal, one of the batchmates of Fr Nattunilath.

b. Rev. Fr Emmanuel Mattathil (1946 -2021)

Rev. Fr Emmanuel (Appachan) Mattathil (75), a member of the

MST assigned to St Paul Region, who had been ministering as a Formator and Spiritual Director at Santhome Minor Seminary, Thamarassery was called for his eternal abode at 8.45 p.m. on Wednesday, 14 April 2021. The funeral service took place at 10.30 a.m. on 16 April 2021.

The departure of Fr Emmanuel Mattathil was unexpected, as he was seemingly a

healthy person moving around easily. It was only on 24 March 2021 that he consulted a doctor at Mother Mary Hospital, Thamarassery due to the appearance of yellowish colour for his skin/eyes. After some blood tests and an ultrasound scan, he was directed to approach a gastroenterologist. On the next day, he went to Nirmala Hospital, Marykunnu (near Kozhikode) for further diagnosis by the gastroenterologist. After a few days of investigation with CT scan and other blood tests, he was diagnosed with some growth in the alimentary canal between the liver and gall bladder that had obstructed the free flow of fluids causing infection. From there, he was referred to a gastro-surgeon in Baby Memorial Hospital, Kozhikode. The gastro-surgeon recommended the removal of this growth by surgery. For further confirmation and surgery, Fr Mattathil preferred to be admitted at Mar Sleeva Medicity, Cherpunkal which is proximate to his family and Deepti. He got admitted there on Easter Sunday (4 April 2021). The gastro-surgeon of Medicity recommended some treatment to reduce the infection and to control the level of Bilirubin to prepare him for safe surgery. He stayed in the hospital for four days and was discharged on 8 April and came to Aaram, Deepti Mount. As prescribed, he went back to meet his doctor on 12 April who examined the developments and returned to Aaram on the same day. By evening, he felt some discomfort and was taken to the hospital. The level of his Blood Pressure displayed very low and within a few hours, he turned unconscious. On 13th night, he had heart failure and his internal organs turned dysfunctional. The immediate medical interventions did not yield any result and the normal homeostasis stopped, and he was shifted to a ventilator. As his body was incapable of metabolizing any medication and was not responding to the clinical procedures, his blood pressure lowered to the minimum and he silently embraced eternity by 8.45 p.m. on 14 April 2021.

His mortal remains were preserved at the mortuary of Mar Sleeva Medicity itself and were received in the morning of 16 April. The body was directly taken to his home at Kozhuvanal, and then was brought to Deepti Bhavan by 7.30 a.m. It was kept at the open hall

of Deepti Bhavan for public viewing. Many priests from the eparchy of Pala, religious sisters from the vicinity, local political leaders, members of the MST, associate missionaries, collaborators, and neighbours came forward to offer homage to Fr Mattathil. The final rites of the funeral service started by 10.00 a.m. Their Excellencies Mar Sebastian Vadakel of Ujjain and Mar James Athikalam of





Sagar presided over the final rites. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General preached the funeral homily. On 15 May, a memorial Holy Qurbana was celebrated and it was attended by a few members of his family.

The MST is grateful to Rev. Fr Emmanuel Mattathil for all his committed initiatives for the work of evangelization in different places. As one of our senior members, he joined the MST as a seminarian. He worked in several centres of the Eparchy of Ujjain and was an efficient instrument in developing the mission centre at Narasingarh. He also worked in the Etawah mission of the Archeparchy of Changanachery in Uttar Pradesh. He was part of the team of central administration of the MST as its Second Councillor for one year (1992-1993). Fr Mattathil worked for 20 years in Germany. He was a formator for several years in Vikas Maitri-Kotra, Jeevan Jyoti-Kamed, Deepti College-Melampara, Ruhalaya-Ujjain and finally at Santhome-Thamarassery. His loving, loveable and compassionate nature enlarged the range of his friends to all strata of people of his involvement. Rev. Fr Kurian Ammanathukunnel, a contemporary of Fr Mattathil has written 'in Memoriam' paying homage to our departed member.

3. Plenary Council - 2021

The announcement of the list of the members elected for the plenary council was announced on 31 March 2021 through Circular No. X/ 20. Although it was scheduled to be held from 9 May 2021, the rapid spread of Covid compelled to conduct it online and to postpone it to a future date convenient for the members, as some among the members in the Plenary Council are only recovering from Covid.

4. Reopening of the Seminaries

The covid situations have delayed the reopening of our seminaries. Both our minor seminaries are now in the process of welcoming the first-year students. The second and third years re-joined the seminary by the second week of June. On 24 of June, the seminarians of Jeevan Jyoti arrived and the seminary is grossing momentum. Ruhalaya Major Seminary, Ujjain officially reopens on 20 July only.

5. Major Seminarians' Gathering, Vestition and Promise

The annual major seminarians gathering usually schedule in the month of May at the Generalate was cancelled, due to the lockdown measures of Covid-19. The vestition and the promises of incorporation of the seminarian are planned to hold on the day of Dukhrana (3 July) at Deepti Bhavan.

Kuzhuppallil Abraham (Roshan): He is sent for studies in Masters


in Educational Administration (M.Ed.) from Xavier University, Cincinnati, Ohio, USA.

Vanmelil John (Vibin): He is given permission to pursue part-time B.Ed Studies in the University of Srinagar.


9. Publications/Achievements

Rev. Fr Jose Kondoor: A book titled, "Voice of a Shepherd: The Pastoral Letters of Mar John Perumattam" was edited by Rev. Fr Jose Kondoor. It was released by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel of Ujjain on 18 June 2021, in the context of the tenth death anniversary of His Excellency Mar John Perumattam of happy memory. Fr Kondoor collected 122 pastoral letters by the Bishop issued during three decades (1968-1998) of his shepherdship in Ujjain. The pastoral letters herald the missionary vision and conviction of Mar John Perumattam and reflect his untiring efforts in inspiring the missionaries and faithful for the work of evangelization during his tenure as the exarch in the beginning and later the eparch of the eparchy of Ujjain. This inspirational book will be distributed to all the MSTs in India in the upcoming months.

It starts moving normally after the arrival of the brothers at the beginning of the month of June. All brothers who returned to Santhome Seminary after their long vacation were asked to bring RTPCR report of Covid-19 test and all of them came with the report!

Brothers were asked to reach the seminary on 30 April for the summer classes on English and Hindi, but could not make it up as the 'mini' lock-down started and then the complete lock-down. Then the date of returning to the seminary was revised to 2 June. 

All people associated with our mission centres were given special attention and care. Medical kits were distributed to 700 families in our mission centres. Each medical kit consisted of a steam inhaler, seven N 95 masks, sanitizer and soaps. Through all our interventions in the lives of the people in their moments of struggle and sufferings, we could manifest the compassionate and caring face of Jesus Christ. We could be at the service of the people with what they needed because of the generous support of some of our Fathers and different agencies. We are immensely grateful to them all. Above all, we thank God Almighty for their generosity.

E. St Joseph Mission, Odisha

The second wave of the pandemic was badly affected Odisha. We could see the Positive cases even interior villages where we work. In spite of the restrictions we could make the villages visits and could stay with the people in their needs. MST Mission house in Rayagada also started their village ministry with the help of an appointed Catechist. Due to the lock down we could make the follow up and other planned programs like meetings of the villagers, programs for the children, medical camp, etc. As the restrictions are lifted we will be resuming our programs.

1. Nirmal Jyoty Mission, Balliguda



The restrictions caused by the second wave of covid 19 affected all the missionary activities of Nirmal Jyoty centre at Balliguda. All our planned programmes had to be postponed for the time beiing.

Even though there were covid-19 restrictions we could manage to do the construction work of two Village Church cum Community Care Centres, which are still under construction. We could also construct a small building in our newly purchased land in Balliguda. We also tried to keep our constant relation with our villages through village visits and so on.

2. Little Flower Mission, Kundra

Little Flower Mission Centre Kundra is flourishing in its mission by



God's grace. Second wave of the pandemic really struck our villages. Many are infected and unfortunately five people died of corona. Due to the pandemic and triple lock down, our village programmes, especially our frequent village visits, weekly prayer meetings, daily tuition and CCC construction were stopped for one month and we have just resumed the construction of CCC. As the precaution for covid-19, we supplied homeo immunity medicine for the villagers.

3. Sacred Heart Mission, Laxmipur

The second phase of Covid-19 pandemic affected badly the people of Laxmipur. Many of our villagers also were affected in this second wave. Fr Binish Kuzhiyadiyil, the Asst. Director of the centre also was affected by Covid and by the grace of God he is back to the



centre with sound health. Many of our activities were standstill. After the different phases of lock down due to pandemic we are slowly resuming our activities. These days of lock down we had special prayers and

adoration in our mission centre. Though we could stop our regular village visits due to lockdown we used to visits our villages in between to show our solidarity with them and also we provided them face masks. Sacred Heart Mission Centre celebrated the feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on 11 June. Fr Sebastian Pezhumthottiyil



celebrated Holy Mass in Odia language and delivered a beautiful message.

We could finish the work of one the Village Church cum Community Care Centres at Khodomchola village with the help of the villagers in the month



of May. We have also started the construction of another CCC at Kayipadar village in the month of June. One of the villagers of Kayipadar village contributed the land for the CCC and the villagers

cooperate with the construction through their labour.

c. Celebration of the Feast of Sacred Heart: The feast of Sacred Heart of Jesus is solemnized in the parish, mainly because we have




the presence and collaboration of the SH sisters there. In the context of the celebrations we also conducted the annual First Holy Communion of the parish whom the SH sisters

c. St Thomas Church, Passa: Another substation Mass Centres under St Mary's Catholic Church, Pakke Kessang is going to have its own parish church. The church is named after St Thomas the Apostle, our Patron and the construction is underway. The community

1. United States

As we thank Rev. Fr. Joseph Vandannoor for his committed service to the Diocese and his special contribution to MST in USA for the last sixteen years in the capacity of the finance in charge and member of the board of directors MST corporation, we wish him all the best for his future assignment in India. He is looking forward to an assignment in the diocese of Thamarassry. We all wish him a safe journey back to India.
- b. Rev. Fr Sherit Kappiarumalyil: After completing his study at Xavier University, Cincinnati, Rev. Fr. Sherit Kappiarumalayil will be going back to India in the middle of July. Currently he stays at Santhome, Chicago and is helping us with the mission appeals. We wish Fr Sherit all the best for his future ministries in India.
- c. Welcome to Rev. Fr Roshan Kuzhippilly: Rev. Fr. Roshan Kuzhippally reached USA in the middle of April and has started his summer semester in May. It was a providence of God that Rev. Fr. Roshan reached USA for his studies just few days before the lock down in India. We wish him all the best in his studies and ministries in Cincinnati.
- d. Reopening of US after Coronavirus: All across the country restrictions are lifted as many states have inoculated more than seventy percentage of the population. The entire country hopes to reopen with a few restrictions for those who are not vaccinated, by July 4th of 2021. However, the CDC is very cautious about the possibility of another surge due to the Delta variant, CDC is thinking of another

booster shot in case there is a third wave.

2. Austria

- **c. Maiandacht:** The month of May is fully dedicated for Marian devotions in our place. We conducted devotions in all parishes, at Marian Grottos, in Marian shines and in Rosary park with Solemn Holy Mass, Rosary and Marian prayers and Adorations. Lots of people participated in the devotions.

After the Holy Mass we had solemn Eucharistic procession through the streets and special prayers and blessings in 4 different Altars arranged in the streets.



- f. Pilgrimage of Catholic Women's Movement (KFB): On 12 June, the members of the Catholic women's movement (Katholische Frauen Bewegung) of Dakanats of Poysdorf conducted their regional pilgrimage. It concluded with solemn Eucharistic celebration and refreshment in Bernhardsthal parish.
- g. International Father's Day: The members of the catholic men's movement (KMB) celebrated the Father's day on 20 June in the Bernhardsthal Parish.

3. Canada

a. Nelson, British Columbia: The parish churches in British Columbia are allowed to open our services in the Church for a limited



number people according to the size of the Churches. That is very good news for us who were not allowed to congregate in the Church for the past year, due to the spread of Covid 19.

Out of eight priests serving

in Canada, we are three priests: Fr Tom Kakkaniyil, Fr Jose Kizhakkethottathil and Fr Jojo Chettiakunnel, working at different parishes of the Diocese of Nelson. All of us have more than one parish to manage. For example, I have three parishes to manage: the second one is for the indigenous people and congregation and the third one is for a few members of the church, in a rented Anglican Church. They were closed for more than a year. But now we are excited to open those churches from 20 June 2021. It is certain to have services in all the three churches after a closure. So we are excited.

While preparing to open our churches, almost half of the volunteers are willing to help our communities. There were more than 100 volunteers to help me before Covid closure in all these three parishes. Now I may have to be satisfied with 50 people, but with the same past services. Every priest has to work hard to give services to all members of the parishes. We are happy to see the magnanimity of the participants to share their efforts and money for the maintenance of these churches. We depend on our Sunday collection.

As few apostles could spread the Good news to all corners of the world, we as MST missionaries will be able to do the maximum to preach the Word of God either by our presence or by our preaching. We have received both doses of Vaccines to overcome Covid 19 and resume our work as missionaries.

b. Parish Church Being Burnt: Sad to inform you that some people who are against organised religions might have arsoned our





beautiful church - 'St Gregory's' for the service of first nation people.

It was one of my outstation parishes where I used to give weekly service for the first nation (native) community. Providentially I had taken pictures of this church after the last Holy Mass with the happy participants. That was the end of everything as we parted away from the Church at 3 p.m. on Sunday, 20 June 2021. But at 3 a.m. on Monday, 21 June (the following day), some unhappy people arsoned this church. They might have come from outside of the community with a malicious plan to arson the Church.

Another Church at Penticton, our neighbouring parish, was closed due to Covid restriction for more than an year and it was arsoned on Monday 21st at 1.30 am. Police people are investigating the culprit. Many priests, bishops and Nuncio from Nunciature, and several national and international papers' reporters called me by phone and confirmed their solidarity.

c. Regina, Saskatchewan: It's awesome now here in



Saskatchewan. Saskatchewan summers are usually warm and dry. Summer spans from early June to mid-September. This is considered the most pleasant weather during the year. Churches were opened for the faithful, with 30% of its capacity only, and hence the priests had to celebrate a few extra Holy Masses on the Easter Sunday. It was a very good experience and the Archbishop was sharing more on the missionary nature and missionary work of the Church. And again, the month of May was very much blessed for the Archdiocese; we had the ordination of Deacon Christian Lindenbach on 14 May. After the Easter many of the parishes celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation. Different parishes held simple celebrations of the Mother's day and Father's Day, honouring both mothers and fathers. The Archdiocese has planned to commemorate the National Indigenous People's Day on 21 June via online. Also the parishes conducted thanks giving Holy Masses congratulating and honouring the students graduated in X and XII grades.

We three MST priests serving the Archdiocese are fully vaccinated. All are keeping fine and enjoying the summer days fulfilling their responsibilities whole- heartedly. At present there is no lockdown in the Province other than a few strict regulations. The whole Province shall start opening and functioning normally, without any covid-19 regulations, from mid-July. It's awesome and exciting, everybody is thrilled and waiting for that day to move out to enjoy the summer days.

- d. Departure of Fr Emmanuel Mattam: It was a shock for all of us to hear the sad news of the Demise of Fr Emmanuel Mattam, who served here in Germany for 20 Years.



He came to Germany in 1997. His first appointment was with the Brothers of Mercy in Montabaur as a pastor in the Hospital (1997-2003). Then he spent three months in

Hildesheim. From 2003 to 2016 he worked in the Diocese of Regensburg. In December 2016 he returned to India. Mattathilachan had been a good friend to all of us. He always cherished our Koinonia and the togetherness. He was very modest, very sociable, always happy and liked to crack jokes. We all know, that he was a good pastor and missionary. It is really a huge loss for us and also for the MST family. We conducted a special Zoom meeting to pay homage to Fr Emmanuel and prayed the Office for the dead.

e. July Gathering: At present in Germany the number of Covid-19 cases are very low. So after a long time of waiting, we are very happy and very excited to come together for our July gathering, which will be conducted in Pax Gästehaus in Unkel from 5 to 9 July 2021.

5. Switzerland



Parish of Schlieren: Switzerland is relaxing its Covid-19 restrictions as infection rates stabilise and the vaccination rollout accelerates across the country. Now we have days of Sunshine. The Swiss people are very happy to have this long awaited summer season. Summer holidays start in Switzerland from the midle of July till the middle of August. This is a tourist season.

Good Friday in villages. The whole parish will go to the selected mission for the celebration. We do so to invite pagans to faith and faithful to deepen their faith. Usually the hosting mission provide food

for all - Agape.

ii. Good Friday - Way of the Cross:

The Way of the Cross on Good Friday was conducted from the main Parish to Mission that crossed more than five kilometres. Hundreds of people joined the devotion by praying the stations of the cross, which took several hours to complete.



iii. Catechumens for Baptism: Out of the eight missions I serve, there are tens of youth who are attending two years of training in



preparation for baptism from Kung'ombe mission. The new faithful of Kung'ombe are very excited that they offer costly gifts for the priests, which sometimes will include goats and hens.

b. Priestly Ordinations and New Vocations: On Saturday, 8 May



2021, Cardinal Anders Arborelius ordained Jan Byström at St. Erik's Cathedral in Stockholm. He was a Lutheran priest converted and Catholicism years before. Dn. Joseph Rizk could have been ordained in

Goteborg on 1 May but because of the pandemic we have

postpended the ordination to 23 July, the feast of St. Brigitte at Vadstena. Pierre Hannoun, a young man of 21 years old selected to the seminary from 5 applicants. He will start his studies from September. Three Lutheran priests, who were converted to catholic church 5 years before, got approval from pope to start their studies, which



lasts for 3 to 4 years. They start their studies from September at Uppsala seminary.

c. Syro-Malabar Mission in Scandinavia: As the Covid pandemic continues and Sweden is still red zone, so we have no way to travel



outside Sweden as usual. Therefore no public Masses celebrated in Malayalam in different countries. Now we have the summer here and usually other language masses are not celebrated during summer in the diocese. But thanks to God that we have Malayalam Masses every Sunday through Zoom platform which is having a very good participation from Scandinavian countries. I am also happy to share with you all that we had the holy communion for 6 children this year and among them 3 were from the same parish. The youth in Scandinavia pray the rosary every Sunday through zoom platform which makes unity among youth and families.

Fr Joseph Elamparayil OCD, who has served Collegio Damasceno since the inauguration of the academic year 2020-2021 in November 2020 as its Vice Rector, is a man of friendly and active nature. He did his doctoral studies on John Henry Newman in the USA and served OCD's St Joseph's Province, Thiruvananthapuram, as its Provincial. He taught theology students in Bangalore for two years and worked as provincial councillor and master of students.

Very Rev. Fr Joseph Elamparayil replaces Very Rev. Fr Varghese Kurisuthara OCD who sincerely and efficiently served Collegio San Giovanni Damasceno for over 25 long years from 1993 when it was shifted from Gianicolo to Manzoni as its Finance Officer, Vice Rector and Rector. Very Rev. Fr Varghese Kurisuthara, very active in teaching different languages like Italian, Latin, German and Spanish and dynamic in guiding priests in academic and extracurricular activities at Damasceno, was in office as the Rector from 2007 to 2021. 10. United Kingdom

St Margaret Clitherow Parish – Feast of the Sacred Heart:

On the Feast Day also the same pattern was followed with an addition of the Divine Mercy Chaplet – Mass, Exposition, reflection on the Sacred Heart, Litany and Benediction. The focus of my reflection was on God's burning love for us as typically pictured in the very image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus as a flaming, pierced and bleeding heart symbolising His burning undying love. It was this love that flowed from the Heart of Jesus into the heart of Saul and transformed him into Paul, who with his burning love in his heart faithfully bore witness to Jesus ever since his conversion. It is this same love that flows into our hearts to transform us into his faithful disciples burning with his love in our hearts, from where it flows into the hearts of those whom we serve and live with. In short, this love as we sing:

Love is flowing like a river,

Flowing out through you and me, Spreading out into the desert, Setting all the captives free.

In spite, or even because, of Coronavirus and lockdown, this year the feast was meaningfully and fruitfully celebrated by the parish community, a few present physically and the others virtually on livestream. The Brazilian Community, who celebrate the first Mass in Portuguese every Sunday in the morning, helped the parish in preparing for the feast—cleaning and decorating the church, especially

the statue of the Sacred Heart, which, in fact, proved to be the central attraction, I mean in the spiritual sense, inspiring people to have devotion to the Sacred Heart.

11. Brazil - St Sebastián's Parish, Itaruma

a. Conquest of Covid-19: Here I express my sincere thanks to all



my friends, wellwishers, and my loving and caring perishers for their ardent and constant prayers for my speedy recovery from the covid-19 From 8 May I had severe body pain. From 10 May started throat ich, lack of appetite and taste. I consulted a doctor he referred for Covid test. and to my surprise tested covid positive. I

got some medicaments advised to remain in isolation but monitored by the hospital staff. First few days passed with no severe symptoms third day of isolation my temperature rose up and saturation fell down below 85 my lungs 25% affected. I was admitted to municipal hospital at Itarumã. I was getting all the attention, care and medications. As my oxygen level falling down they gave me oxygen mask. My body temperature was going up, therefore another tomography of lungs were done. It showed 50 % of my lungs affected. I was referred to a better hospital some 200 kms away from my town. Bishop of Jatai Dom Nelio arrived at hospital before leaving the hospital gave me anointing of the sick and holy communion. Meanwhile some of my parish members gathered around the hospital

to give me support and encouragement, and accompanied my ambulance in their own vehicles. Some came to the hospital at Mineiros 200 kms away from my parish. I spent15 days spent at the ICU of the hospital at Mineiros. After which, I had to spend some days in observation in the hospital and finally I was discharged in a better condition. With great happiness, they sent me out of the hospital.

Here I express my gratitude to the members of the society, my family members. Fathers, sisters all around the world for their prayers. On 1 June, I am back to my parish. My parishioners expressed their happiness through a beautiful message and song. Keeping all the covid protocol, they came in procession in their cars to welcome me back. They are still taking care of me well. Special thanks to Rev. Fr. Joseph Thekkel for his whole heart help and company in my difficult situation.

b. Feast of Corpus Christi: The feast of Corpus Christi is a very solemn feast in Brazil. It is a public holiday, as Brazil as it is a Catholic

country. Though we have covid protocol and restrictions, we celebrated it with great devotion. Solemn Holy Mass was celebrated at 9.00 a.m. by Fr Joseph Thekkel, followed by Blessing with Santissima Eucharist. Every street of the Municipality of Itarumã was blessed with Santissima Eucharist. Large number of vehicles accompanied the procession of the sacrament



through the streets. Afternoon Fr. Thekkel had the same ceremony in his parish. Sincere thanks to Fr Thekkel for all the help extended during this period.

Candidates of 2021- Northern Zone: It is with immense gratitude towards God that we, the vocation promotors of MST submit this report on vocation promotion 2021. As it was crystal clear from the beginning of this year that the vocation promotion and bringing the



candidates to the seminary was the most hectic job. No schools were open, churches were shut down, Sunday schools were not functioning, travelling was restricted, no common vocation camps were conducted in the Diocese etc. More than all these the children were all fully involved with the modern gadgets especially smart phones as it was the most unavoidable element for their online classes. In spite of all these challenges in front of us we trusted in the providence of God. We believed that God will find out his servants to serve in the vineyard of the Lord. And finally after the interview and the final scrutiny, we have selected 22 new candidates from the Northern zone (Malabar area).

This year during the time of admission due to the massive spread of covid 19, the interview and final admission were given online. In the presence of Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal, the in charge of vocation promotion, and Fr Rony Alencherry, the vocation Promotor of Northern zone, Fr Joseph Pulavelil, the Rector, gave admission to the candidates in the name of the Director General of MST. 21 new

candidates have already reached in the Santhome Seminary, Thamarassery. One candidate is from Bangalore and he will reach by the middle of July. Based on the dioceses, we have 11 candidates from Thalassery, 5 from Mananthavady, 4 from Thamarassery, 1 from Kottayam and 1 from Mandya.

We can't but thank you sincerely dear fathers who were always with me to support, encourage, help at certain times as a consolation during this year of vocation promotion. First of all we thank all the fathers in the General Council, especially Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor and Rev. 

Joy Kochupara took him to Maharashtra during the lockdown in various states, keeping all protocol regulations of Covid 19. Fr. Kochupara came back here after a week. He has taken RTPCR test several times by now. Fr. Siju is appointed at Alte mission station and he is given additional responsibilities of Childline and AIDS ministries.
- 5. New Arrival: Fr Manu Pottanany will arrive here by the middle of July as he continues his ayurvedic treatment. He will assist in vocation promotion and will render his service here as house procurator.
- **6. Garden of Fruit Trees**: One and a half years ago we planted various fruit trees in an acre of land. Now some of the fruit trees have started yielding. In the coming years we expect more fruit trees to produce fruits.
- 7. **Agriculture**: Last year we cultivated 50 kg of ginger and 30 kg of turmeric. Both cultivations yielded satisfactorily. But as expenses exceeded income, we are not planting ginger any longer. Instead, we are planting 75 kg of turmeric among the fruit trees. It has a double effect: yield from turmeric plus manure and care for the fruit trees.
- 8. **Covid 19 Situation**: As there are two Medical College Hospitals in our vicinity, we have witnessed numerous Covid cases. Some people in our neighbouring houses also were affected by Covid 19.

At the direction of Fr. Joy Kochupara all the fathers have taken various herbal medicines and herbal drinks from time to time as immunity boost and Covid preventive.

- 9. **Online Classes**: On 14 June Fr. Sebastian Kizhakkeyil started giving online classes on the Prophets to the second and third year theology students of Ruhalaya. The classes will last around a month.
- 10. Classes by Fr Thomas Manjalamkal: Last two weeks Fr Manjalamkal was here and he gave one week online classes to the deacons of Ruhalaya from 14 June. He takes the new students of Jeevan Jyoti by a special bus to Srirangapatna on 23 June.


made her first profession on $3^{\rm rd}$ January 2000. In the year 2006 she made her solemn profession.

A Tribute to Rev. Fr John Nattunilath MST (1973-2021)

We are all slowly recovering from the sudden and untimely demise of our fellow priest and coworker Fr John (Gigi) Nattunilath. It was on 2 April 2021, on Good Friday that Fr John left all of us and went for his heavenly reward. He was on the way for commemorating the final journey of our Lord to Calvary, to recall

His Passion and Death with the faithful at Kalapipal in the Eparchy of Ujjain. That journey was his final earthly journey, which led him to embrace eternity on the same day that brought redemption for humanity. It was really a shocking news for all of us and really a great loss to miss a young and energetic missionary for the Society and for the Church.

Life sketch: He was born in May 1973 in Kuninji in the district of Idduki and he had his schooling in the same place. After completing his High school education he joined in Deepthi Minor seminary in the year 1989. Completing three years of minor seminary he was promoted to Missionary Orientation Course at Srierangapattana and following that he had his philosophical studies in Ruhalaya Ujjain. After successfully completing his philosophical studies he was sent for his Regency in two places, in the first half at Deepti Rubber



estate Korenchira and the second half at Chaithannya kicker in the eparchy of Mandya. Before completing his theological studies, he took Master's in Hindi



literature as a regular student from Mahatma Gandhi University, Kerala studying at St Thomas College, Pala. He completed his theological studies in the year 2004. Since he was in Deepti Minor Seminary for four years, he became part of many batches. In the last two years of theological studies, we were together in Ruhalaya

Major Seminary. And on 26 April 2004 he was ordained priest.

Priestly Ministry: Soon after the ordination, he was sent to the Eparchy of Palakkad and from there to different places like Eparchy of Thuckalay, then to the Diocese of Tanzania. From there he was sent to work in the Diocese of Ujjain. Here in Ujjain, he was appointed in different places - first in Mana as the Assistant priest in Charge, then later the Director of Priest





Home at Chandessary. At Mehidpur Road (Gogapur) he was appointed the priest in charge of St Mary's Church and Manager of the school and from there he was transferred to Susner as the Priest in charge and Manager. Finally



serving as the assistant priest in charge of Shanti Bhavan, Jamner the Lord called you to be with Him in Heaven.

As far as I understand, he was a person of strong faith and determination, and was very zealous as a missionary. I have heard that he built a beautiful Church at Anamukham (Loretto Matha Church) in a small village of the diocese of Thuckalay. Although there were only less than 40 families, he raised fund around half crore, built a church, which made that small community proud in the locality. In the diocese of Mpanda in Tanzania, he was very active and befriended politicians of even national level.

He was very close to his parents and siblings, and was committed to the family. He was very sad when his mother passed away in July 2020. In spite of the lockdowns of covid-19, he was there to see her off for good. In all his difficult situations, all his three siblings stood with him. He was very intimate to his only sister who is a





religious nun in the SABS Congregation. He spent almost two months with at the beginning of this year. I am sure that all of them are badly missing Fr Gigi from their family. Dear Fr John, as a priest you worked hard for the glory of God and in

spreading the Gospel to the people around you. You were visiting villages, meeting people and sharing the joy of the Gospel. The initiatives you took and the hard work you did for Christ and his Gospel will be remembered for ever. The work you did as Manager



and Priest in charge at Mehidpur Road will be remembered forever. Though you had some special way of behavior, somehow we failed to understand you. It might be our mistake that we did not understand and love you as you wanted. Your sudden and untimely departure has saddened us. It is a great loss for the Society and especially for the mission. We believe that in your untimely departure, the Almighty has a greater plan for you and it is always His will that prevails. May you enjoy Heavenly bliss with the Almighty.

In Memoriam: Rev. Fr Emmanuel Mattathil (1946-2021)

I take it as a privilege to pen a few lines in honour of a holy priest and a friend of mine in the MST, who lived almost 75 years in this planet with a lovely smile, by sharing love, joy and compassion whomever he lived with. He was very easily approachable and loveable. He held simplicity in lifestyle but also made a lot of fun, enjoyed entertainments and lived his life to the full. He

cherished the values of companionship and was available to help everyone, filled with the zeal of a missionary.

My association with Fr Mattam begins from the minor seminary days in 1965 in Good Shepherd Seminary at Karoor, Pala. He was senior to me for two years, thus he went ahead of me to Vadavathoor Seminary for the study of philosophy and theology. Both of us made the temporary promise of incorporation into the MST on 21 May 1971, along with others- Frs Varikatt and Parayadyil. Being a junior, I was not part of his close circle of friends in the seminary days. Obviously, we had our differences in temperament and personality as well. But as a senior MST fellow, he always shared special love and care for me and other MST juniors in the seminary. As I followed





him to Ujjain after the ordination, we become closer. He reached Ujjain in 1974 and me in 1975. When he was in Kotra and Narasingarh, I was in Biaora. Both of us were together in

Jeevan Jyoti, Kamed for some months. This physical proximity in the initial years of Ujjain mission and of our own priestly life helped us to understand each other better. Again we were together in Ruhalaya Major Seminary for three years (1993-1996) where he served as the Spiritual Director and me as the Rector. I visited him several times and a few times have stayed with him when he was in Regensburg, Germany. I have always loved his company and have enjoyed the moments that we shared together. He used to call me 'Kuriacha....' When I write these lines (17 June 2021), it is just more than two months that

he departed from us (14 April 2021). It is hard to believe that he is no more. Like so many of you, I couldn't join the final rites of his earthly departure due to the lockdowns of Covid. But I gravely miss him and trust that he makes his grace-filled smile upon each of us from his Eternal Abode.



Born on 6 November 1946 to a popular and traditional family of Mattathil at Kozhuvanal near Palai, Fr Emmanuel (Appachan) was the fourth among eight children. Mattathil family has been blessed



with many vocations to priesthood and religious life. His own elder brother, Fr George belongs to the MCBS. As far as I understand, he was very close to his parents (Mani +1990 and Anna +2004) and to all his siblings. Some of them were also collaborating with him in his mission, that facilitated the purchase of our property at Nedumkandam. Their mutual love and support were strengths in his life as a missionary.

Belonging to St Paul Region of the MST, he worked in several centers of the Eparchy of Ujjain (Shajapur, Kotra and Kamed) and was an efficient instrument in developing the mission center in Narasingarh from its very beginning. He was passionate about Narasingarh, in setting the entire structure of the mission station including the school, convent, hostel and the church. The DST Sisters

who were collaborators with him at Narasingarh have fond memories of his fraternal support for them. He also worked in the Etawah mission of the Archeparchy of Changanacherry in Uttar Pradesh. He was part of the the central team of administration of the MST as its Second Councilor for one

year (1992-1993).

Rev. Fr Mattam worked for 20 years in Germany and has been very zealous in supporting the MST missions. He was like an elder brother for almost two dozens of our members who have been serving in the German parishes. His holiness, friendship and wits made the MST community vibrant. He was acceptable to all, irrespective of



different age groups of our members. He was also loved by the communities he served. I heard that the local newspaper published a beautiful obituary note at his demise. A notable collaborator and mentor of Fr Mattam in Germany was Ms Katharina, a handicapped lady with extraordinary spirit, skills and nobility.

She had been his long term companion for almost 13 years who visited India several times. In the final years of her life, Katharina was affected by cancer. It is very heartening to note that at the completion of his formal ministry in Regensburg, he applied for special permission and spent almost five months in Germany to care for Katharina. Because there was nobody to take care of her. His sentiments of solidarity and friendship had no boundaries. After her demise in November 2016, he left Germany for good.

He was a formator for several years starting from 1975 at Kotra where he was a Professor and Procurator, and later in Jeevan Jyoti, Kamed as the Vice Director and Procurator (1977-1978). Years after, he became the Rector of Deepti College, Melampara (1991-

1993) and from there he moved to Ruhalaya, Ujjain as one of the Spiritual Directors (1993-1996). After his return from Germany, he was appointed Spiritual Director at Santhome Minor Seminary, Thamarassery in 2017.



Thus many of the MSTs in varied ages are his students and they do cherish the sweet memories of his guidance and friendship. I think that Fr Mattam relished the company of the youth, because he was young in mind and spirit, and was ever curious to read and learn new things. I also feel that he had been enjoying his final mission as a formator at Santhome, Thamarassery and trust that the staff of the seminary gave him good company.

He displayed great passion to discuss about the MST missions, its



spirituality, formation, schools, boardings, new communities, etc. and was very curious to see the kind of growth it makes in history. There was a felt genuineness and simplicity in all his expressions, and surpassing love for the Society and its missions.

Involving in varieties of ministries and missions, he has traversed the crossroads of the MST in his life time, and has shown as a way to do the Lord's mission through prayer, fraternity and solidarity. He extended his support beyond the MST by financially helping many Congregations of the religious sisters, orphanages, poor families, etc. Thus he touched the hearts of many with the enduring love of the Lord.

Life has to end for sure, but the love doesn't. Thank you Fr Mattam, for what you had been to the Church and to the MST. The song is ended, but the melody lingers on...
