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I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

Dear Reverend Fathers, Reverend Deacons and Brothers,



"Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Saviour, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk 2:10–11)

Yes, yet another time of Good News, the time of great joy, the time of Christmas. The birth of a child into the family is always a time of joy, love and

care. The joy is doubled when it is shared with others. Christmas is the time for each of us as Christians to share this joy with others in order to double the sweetness of joy. As missionaries our sole happiness and joy lies in sharing of this joy – sharing of Christ with others. I was taken up by seeing this joy in the missionaries of Africa during my recent visit there. I could spend three weeks with them. Our travel by road for almost 4000 kms was like a mission retreat. I could meet many missionaries of different religious congregations – both men and women from India working in Tanzania. Listening to their inspiring missionary experiences of sharing the good news of Jesus Christ and the joy of the Gospel to the people in Africa made me reflect the following passage from the Gospel of St Luke 2: "But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord."

Sharing the Joy of the Gospel with Peoples is the Mission of the MST

All members of the MST and our missionary collaborators are called and sent to share this joy to the people among whom we are living. I take this opportunity to appreciate and thank all of you for your active and zealous missionary involvements in bringing Jesus and the joy of His good news to the ends of the earth. The world of today witnesses a new mode of living. Everything has changed and is still on the path of change which no one could think of. In such a situation of despair, depression, unhappiness, joy is something everyone looks at. For sure as missionaries, we know that the only true joy one can experience is in the contact with Christ. As missionaries we have encountered many problems of the people and should be convincing the people that Jesus Christ is the only

solution for all their problems. To us Christmas should be not a yearly event but an everyday event because we are to share the joy of Christmas every day to the people who are morally, socially and spiritually confused today. For this, we should find trust and strength in the Eucharistic Lord to be the torch bearer of Jesus Christ to lighten the people who are seeking for true light, joy in their life.

Today to many, Christmas has come to be about Santa Claus, about toys, gifts and Christmas parties, Christmas trees, etc. This was reflected in the controversial statement of a European union official giving advice to subordinates to wish each other with "happy holidays" instead "merry Christmas" to bring about equality! But Christmas - It's all about Jesus. Jesus is born for us, for our people.

This was seen to me in our African missionaries. Their Godexperience as MSTs leads them to a deep immersion in the actual life situation of the people for a transformation of life in the power of the Word of God, for it is the way of the Lord. The parish of Rev. Fr Zacharias in the diocese of Bunda which is in the Northern part of Tanzania has a dictum they pray often: "Life with Jesus is success, Life without Jesus is chaos." Hence let us invite all to open their hearts to Babe Jesus to enjoy Peace and get rid of fear from life.

To give this invitation first and foremost we are to open our hearts and lives to Baby Jesus. Everyday celebration of the Holy Qurbana and the liturgy of hours, spending some time all alone with Christ, using the weapon of Rosary to pray along with our Mother contemplating on the Christ events will surely help us to have the joy of Christmas in our everyday life. Christmas is not celebrations alone; it is all about sharing. Let us share the joy of Christ with others. One of the happiest moments in my life as an MST missionary was during my recent visit to Africa – the joy of having the opportunity and performing the baptism of 68 adults and 13 children. On sharing the joy of Christ with others we fulfil the *mission ad gentes*. Let this Christmas be a season of sharing, doubling the joy of the birth of Christ who was born, lived, died but still lives for us.

Wish you all every joy of Christmas and a Happy New Year!

1. Priestly Ordinations -2021

Deacon Kodikulam will be conferred the holy order of priesthood by His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry at his parish - Bethlehem Church, Parampuzha in the Archdiocese of Changanacherry, at 9.15 a.m. on 27 December 2021. Rev. Deacon Vettikuzhichalil will be conferred the holy order of priesthood by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel at his parish - St Joseph Church, Santhigram in the Diocese of Idukki, at 9.15 a.m. on 29 December 2021. Let us ardently pray for the *ordinandi* and their families, as they are in the immediate preparation for the long-cherished priesthood. All of you are welcome to join the ordination ceremonies.

4. Demise and Funeral of Rev. Fr Nelloor (1973-2021)



Rev. Fr Cyriac (Siby) Nelloor (48), a member of the MST assigned to St Paul Region, who had been ministering as a pioneering missionary at Khristjyoti Catholic Mission, Rohru (Himachal Pradesh), within St Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation was called for his eternal abode at 2.45 a.m. on Friday 22 October 2021. The funeral

service was held on 24 October 2021 at Deepti Mount.

Rev. Fr Siby Nelloor belonged to the 1999-2000 ordination batch of the MST. As a missionary priest, he began his ministry in the Eparchy of Ujjain (Agar and Rajagarh) and was there for three years. He was part of the formation team of Deepti College for one year (2003-2004). He secured doctorate in Media and Communication from Gregorian University, Rome in 2015. During these years (2004-2015) he ministered in the Dioceses of Spoleto-Norcia and Latina-Teraacina-Sezze-Priverno, Italy. After his return

to India, he chose to work in St Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation. He situated his ministry in Himachal Pradesh and explored responsive areas around Shimla and finally got located at Rohru, a





small township in the district of Shimla. Now there is a vibrant and growing community in Rohru. Another new centre recently begun at Chirgaon (H.P.), with more than a dozen of families, is an offshoot of his missionary efforts in this area.

It was at the time of the rampant spread of Covi-19, that he came to Kerala from Himachal Pradesh in June 2020 for treatment. Having confirmed the intense presence of Acute Myeloid Leukemia (AML-M4) at Rajagiri Hospital, Aluva, he was taken to the Regional Cancer Centre (RCC), Trivandrum to ensure him the best available treatment for cancer in Kerala. But he was not able to complete the standardized



chemotherapy regimen due to the frenetic fluctuations in his blood counts and it signalled the impossibility of bone marrow transplant. However, he felt seemingly good and was given a break

from the treatment. During this time, he loved to return to his mission in Himachal Pradesh and he did it after Easter 2021. He could not continue in the mission as the symptoms of cancer recurred rapidly. He returned to Kerala by the end of May 2021 and attempted another turn of chemo at RCC, as recommended by the doctors.

But he could not even proceed with the preparatory doses of chemo, the doctors had to suggest only palliative care for the rest of his life. By the end of June 2021, he had been struggling with a series of symptoms and fatigues and was in and out of the hospitals in Pala like—Carmel Hospital and Mar Sleeva Medicity. During this time, he had been assisted by his friends in the seminary, the MSTs of his batch and his family members. On 14 October, he got admitted in Medicity and by 20 October his internal organs turned dysfunctional

and incapable of metabolizing any medication. His siblings were by his side, at the time of his earthly departure for heaven on 22 October.

His mortal remains were brought to Deepti Bhavan by 7.30 a.m. on Sunday, 24 October. The first part of the funeral services started at 10.00 a.m., led by his home-parish priest (of Kabanigiri, Mananthavady) and the priests who came from the Diocese of Mananthavady. The second part of the funeral liturgy was presided by the Director General who also preached eulogy. Their Excellencies Mar Sebastian Vadakel of Ujjain and Mar James Athikalam of Sagar officiated the Holy Qurbana and the final rites of the funeral. By 12.45 p.m. he was laid to rest at the cemetery of Deepti Mount.

There was a special requiem Holy Quraban celebrated on 4 December at Deepti Bhavan, attended by his parents and close relatives. As customary, 'A Tribute' is presented towards the end of this Bulletin prepared by Rev. Fr Jacob Najrolickal, one of the batchmates of Fr Nelloor.

5. New Schedule for Extraordinary General Assembly

As we are initiating a new process for the election of the delegates, the Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) cannot commence on 15 March 2022 as scheduled previously. Instead, it will be held from 16.00 hours on Sunday, 1 May 2022 at Deepti Bhavan, Melampara, and will continue until it finishes its agenda. The information on the revocation of the process of the election of delegates for the EGA and the reasons for the same were shared with all through a circular letter (Circular No. X-27/2018-23) dated

29 October 2021. The newly appointed election committee has already started process for the election of delegates.

6. Death Anniversary of Founder

On 21 November 2020, the death anniversary of our Founder – Mar Sebastian Vayalil was commemorated. The Vice Director General joined with the Holy Qurbana and special prayers offered at St Thomas Cathedral – Pala, led by three Bishops of the Eparchy of Pala. Members from the General Council and representatives from Deepti seminary staff also participated in the service at the Cathedral.

7. Birth Centenary of Mar Perumattam

The birth centenary of Mar John Perumattam of happy memory (1921-2021) was celebrated through an online gathering in zoomplatform from 6.00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m, on 3 November 2021. Mar John Perumattam, the first Director General of the MST and the first bishop of the eparchy of Ujjain was a saintly missionary who loved the mission, the fellow missionaries and the faithful. The meeting opened with the introductory words by the Director General. Their Excellencies Mar Joseph Pallikkaparampil, Mar Sebastian Vadakel and Mar James Athikalam spoke on the occasion. There were nine speakers including the brother of Mar Perumattam, and selected representatives from the close associates of Mar John Perumattam including religious sisters, friends and priests who were contemporary to him in Ujjain. More than 100 participants joined Zoom. The programme included an audio-visual documentary prepared by Santhome-Media, IMPACT and a memorial group song presented by Rev. Fr Ashok Kollamkudy and the Ruhalaya choir. The meeting was organized by the Vice Director of the MST.

8. Visit of the Director General to Tanzania

The Director General visited the MST missionaries in Tanzania from 5 to 21 November 2021. He visited their parishes situated in three different dioceses of Tanzania namely Dar es Salem, Songea and Bunda. He participated in the consecration of a new church in Bunda

built by Rev. Fr Zacharias Azhikannickal. He had formal meetings with the Ordinaries of the dioceses we work. Rev. Fr Varghese Pullappallil, the MST Coordinator at Dar es Salem, along with Rev. Frs Shaiju Kizhakkekureethadathil and Robin Manianchira organized the visit of the Director General in different places.

9. Silver Jubilee of Ruhalaya (Theology)

The Theology section of Ruhalaya Major Seminary celebrated the conclusion of its silver jubilee year (1997-2022) on 25 November 2021. As the delegate of the Major Archbishop, His Excellency Mar Raphael Thattil was the chief guest for the celebration. Bishops of Ujjain, Indore, Sagar and Satna were also present for the solemn Holy Qurbana and the public meeting. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumaoor, the Director General, along with Rev. Frs Francis Kureeckal and Peter Kavumpuram from the General Council also participated in the celebration. The invited participants included representatives from various seminaries in Madhya Pradesh, missionaries from the Eparchy of Ujjain, etc. The programme was live telecasted and was attended online by many. Due to the situation of the pandemic Covid-19, the jubilee celebrations were very minimal and simple, but beautiful. Sincere appreciation to the staff and students of Ruhalaya for the fabulous conduct of the jubilee celebrations.

10. Sacerdotal Golden and Silver Jubilee

As presented and announced in the previous News Bulletin, the Golden Jubilarian (1972-2022) and Silver Jubilarians (Ordination batch of 1996-1997) have been invited to Deepti Bhavan for the Generalate level celebrations, from 18 to 20 January 2022. We have non-formal education programs, training programs for ladies and youth to help them find their livelihood, medical camps, awareness programs, etc. So, as a part of it we have recently started few education programs and training programs in our mission centres.

3. New Missionary Collaborators for the Mission



Odisha **MST** Mission is happy to share the joy of the arrival of new missionary collaborators to associate with us in Odisha. We

have four sisters from Abhishekagni Sisters of Jesus and Mary from Attapadi, Palakkad to collaborate with the new mission in Daringabadi, Kandhamal. We have another two sisters from S.H. Congregation, Ujjain Province who have joined us to collaborate with Little Flower Mission, Kundra, Koraput. They reached the mission in the month of November and were given a warm welcome during the monthly recollection on 14 November 2021 at MST House in Rayagada.

4. Odia Language Course



One-month intensive Odia language course is arranged for the missionary new collaborators. As we have six new sisters joined our mission,

two weeks class room session for learning basics of the Odia language and two weeks live in village programs for practical experience to learn the language and culture of the place are arranged in Nirmal Jyoty, Baliguda. We have two teachers guiding the classes for the sisters. They will help the sisters to learn the language and culture of the place. Together with the language course, special sessions are arranged to learn the prayers and the Holy Qurbana in Odia.

5. Home Mission

Six sisters from SD congregation were in our mission for one month



to help us in our programs through Home Mission and retreat. In the first few days, they spend time together with the missionaries in prayer and fasting to prepare

themselves for the great mission. In the second phase, they spend time in the village visiting the houses, leading prayer services, adoration, Holy Qurbana and retreat. It was a great experience for our faithful and they were all renewed and rejuvenated in their faith life. We would like to express our gratitude and love for SD Congregation for their willingness to spend their time with us in helping our faith formation programs.

6. Preparation for Christmas Celebration

As we have new communities, the programs and celebrations are

new experiences for them. So, we do take extra care and effort to have a good God experience for new flock of God. We have arranged long preparations for Christmas celebrations such as prayer services, fasting and prayer, house



visit, retreat, crib making programs, star making programs etc. Happy to say that our young missionaries of MST in Odisha are working hard to make it a great event in every village.


3. Fr Prakash Njallany and Catholic Community in Senua – Miao

St Michael's Catholic Church in Senua Village of the Diocese of

Miao, Arunachal Pradesh is in its Silver Jubilee Year (1996-2021). It was in 1996 that the villagers were formally made into a parish community and the first church building for their use was constructed. When the members of the community in Senua celebrate 25 years of their journey in faith, they cannot but forget their first missionary - Rev. Deacon Prakash Njallany MST, who brought them faith in the year



1995. During this silver jubilee of Senua Church, there is a lot of talk about Deacon Prakash Njallany MST and his midnight mission of 18 July 1995 that result in the baptism of six young men of Senua village who became in turn the apostles for the rest of the villagers. Rev. Fr Prakash Njallany had his theology studies in Sacred Heart Collge, Shillong (1993-1996). As part of formation, he was sent to Arunachal for mission since he was assigned to the diocese of Dibrugarh which was making some inroads for the Arunachal Mission. In the year 1995, he became a deacon. It was Fr George Palliparampil SDB (Most Rev. P.K. George - the present Bishop of Miao, Arunachal Pradesh) who sent out Deacon Njallany along with



a catechist of his Longding parish to different villages of the place. The catechist Mr Dominic W. Khangham and Deacon Prakash reached Senua village by evening of 17 July 1995. They gathered some village youth and the chief of the village, and preached the gospel and taught catholic faith till midnight (1.00 am). The chief in the village was reluctant to receive faith immediately who wanted some more time. But some six young-men of the group wanted to receive baptism right

in the morning. Deacon Prakash baptized six of them on 18 July 1995 and they became the pillars of the church in Senua which has more than 1000 faithful as members.

Except one among the six, all five young-men are alive to this day. And they vibrantly speak about the way they were touched and transformed by Jesus and his Gospel during the midnight mission of Deacon Prakash Najllany and Mr Dominic Khangham. Although Fr Praksah is now living almost on the other side of this planet, they gratefully remember him for the difference he made in their lives and of hundreds of people who followed, with the midnight-mission of Gospel on 17 July 1995.

G. Overseas Missions

1. United States

Confirmation at Spalding, Marquette (Michigan): The annual



confirmation service of Splalding vicariate (deanery) was held last month, at my parish - St John Neumann Church, presided over by His Excellency Most Rev. John Francis Doerfler, Bishop of Marquette. There were 18 candidates from four parishes of the deanery for the

a. Nicholas Day for Advent

As in many parts of Europe, people in Switzerland enjoy the tradition of counting the days until Christmas Eve. St Nicholas Day is a festive occasion, especially for children in Switzerland and throughout



Europe. Children receive gifts or put their shoes in front of the door or fireplace, waiting for St Nicholas' arrival and the gifts he brings. Every vear Santha Claus arrives on 6 December, for "Samichlaus Abend"—Santa Night. "Samichlaus," as he is known in

Switzerland, wears a hooded red cape and long robe so he looks like an elderly version of Little Red Riding Hood. His arrival marks the beginning of the Christmas season. Different groups of our parish, young and old, have celebrated advent.

b. Advent Candles



The advent season is a time of preparation for our hearts and minds for the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. The candles also have their own special significance. The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent, and one candle is lit each Sunday.

Three of the candles are purple because the colour violet is a liturgical colour that signifies a time of prayer, penance, and sacrifice. The white candle is placed in the middle of the wreath and lit on Christmas Eve. This candle is called the "Christ Candle" and represents the life of Christ. The colour white is for purity—because Christ is our sinless, pure Saviour.

c. Christmas Eve and Christmas Day

December 24 is "Heiliger Abend," Christmas Eve or Holy Night, and is celebrated according to the unique traditions of each town or



village. Most family events are held on Christmas Eve. We celebrate in our parish Schlieren Christmas for the families and children on the Eve and for the whole community on Christmas night. Christmas Day, a holiday throughout Switzerland, is often a day to enjoy the outdoors. With mountain snowfall in abundance, Christmas day launches the winter sports season. Many head for ski resorts to try their hand at the immense variety of winter sports available: tobogganing, skiing, ice skating, snowboarding, Nordic skiing, snowshoeing, dog-sledding, winter walking, and sledding.

d. Coronavirus Situation

It has worsened in the past few weeks. New measures have been announced. Switzerland has also tightened entry restrictions to check the spread of the Omicron variant of Covid-19. Around 66% of the total



population are fully vaccinated against Covid. Swiss health officials have recommended an extension of booster jabs. More than 11,300 people have died in connection with Covid-19 in Switzerland, which has a population of only 8.6 million.

The chairman of the Parish appreciated the missionary work done by MST in the Chengena Parish. They appreciated the contribution



We have three candidates who were pastors in the Protestant church

They have regular gatherings and classes in the seminary. Last week His Eminence Cardinal Anders Arborelius OCD had a visit and meeting with them.

d. Syro-Malabar Mission in Scandinavia:

Holy Masses in Malayalam are being celebrated in all the stations regularly and a Christmas mass in Malayalam will be celebrated on

Christmas day first time in Stockholm. As the Covid pandemic continues and we have restrictions to travel in and outside Sweden, there are limited public masses celebrated in Malayalam in different countries. But at



present we have masses in Stockholm, Gutenberg, Jönköping and Uppsala in Sweden and Helsinki in Finland.

During the Advent season we have distributed the advent calendar in the children's group. It's nice to hear that they are making use of it. This year we have more than 50 children for the Sunday school. These children are from three different countries so we make use of the digital platform for the teachings and it works well.

Fear of contaminable disease covid slowly disappears from the mind of the people and faithful old young and children express great



enthusiasms in the participation of parish activities.

Itarumã Parish is spread over 365 sq kms between two rivers. Most of its revenue area is covered with cattle farms or auricular farms. These farms are rural areas connected with mud roads. We have once in a month mass in these farms. Employees of these farms gather for the Holy Mass.

ii. First communion in Itarumã parish



We had online catechism classes for the children. From the month of August, we started classes. This year we have 27 children who received first communion on 5 December 2021.

iii. Blessing of Chapel and Confirmation

On 11 December Bishop Dom Nelio Domigos Zorteia of Jathai blessed the Capela (chapel) of Jesus bom pastor in the street nova Esperanca after its renovation. During the solemn Holy Mass, the bishop conferred sacrament of confirmation for 14 youths and adults.

We are 11 in number for Global communication, Management and Corporate Diplomacy from eight countries like Switzerland, America, Brazil, Mexica, Portugal, Cuba, etc. Every



Wednesday we have Mass in the university. The bishop of Lleida, Mons. Salvador Giménez is the delegate bishop of the bishops based in Catalonia for the inter diocesan Secretariat for social-media. Our Christmas holidays begin on 20 December.

at Angel Home on 10 December 2021. He was undergoing treatment for COVID 19. Now he is keeping fine and his health is improving. Angel Home is





B. A Tribute to: Fr Siby Nelloor

Rev. Fr Jacob (Sabu) Njarolickal MST

I remember the day he went for his higher studies to Rome, in the year 2004. During his studies, he was also involved in the pastoral ministry in the dioceses of Spoleto-Norcia and Latina-Teraacina-Sezze-Priverno, Italy with much enthusiasm. After four years I

went to Brazil for pastoral ministry and we had regular contact through phone. Though he struggled a lot to complete his studies, he

enjoyed pastoral ministry and life in Italy.

I always noticed that he was a man who enjoyed life. He travelled a lot. Made use of all the opportunities to visit other countries and missions.



He had many good friends, and when

he died, most of them could not accept it. It was his wish that our batch gathering could be conducted in his mission in the month of



August 2020. Even most of our tickets were booked by Fr Siby to make it easier for us. But due to the treatment he had to undergo, that did not take place. Those days of struggle he asked his batch mates to assist him. Some of us could make it.

He loved his family. He was very much concerned about his mother and indirectly prepared his mother to accept his death that was approaching. His mother told me that once he told his mother that if he died, do not be worried because she still has two more children. His sister thankfully shared how he took care of her in her difficult moments. She had the opportunity to serve him in his last days. One



of those days Fr Siby also prepared her to accept his death while taking care of him. All his nephews used to call him Vellachan. He used to tell them, "Where ever you go, dress properly and give a good impression." Fr Siby always dressed well and impressed all. Jeevan, a nephew of Fr Siby said, "Vellachan always wanted his dear ones to be presented perfectly in the society. He bought clothes for me too...

From my childhood onwards he gave me many joyful moments."

What is there to be appreciated more in his life? I say the missionary method that he used and the matured missionary in him. When he returned from Italy with a doctorate in Communication and Media from Gregorian University in 2015, preferred to be a missionary



than a professor. Thus, he worked in St Mary Queen of the Missions Delegation, Delhi. During that period his mission at Shimla and Rohru in Himachal Pradesh was a well-planned and organized

one. Sometimes even superiors and his close friends thought that he was just boasting and nothing was happening. But he was forming the community with patience. He took time to form them. He gave a systematic formation to them. His catechism was more practical

and experience oriented. Two consecutive years he came to Kerala with people from Rohru and introduced to them the life and tradition of the Syro Malabar Church. He made it possible to visit the Major Archbishop Mar George Cardinal Alencherry and the main pilgrim centers, feasts and the celebrations of sacraments of the Syro-Malabar church.



In the year 2020 he planned to visit Mylapore and the tomb of St Thomas Mount at Chennai with the people of Rohru. He asked me to contact the priests of the Hosur diocese in Chennai to make arrangements since I knew the place and the priests there. And



everything was arranged for their arrival and visit at Mylapur. Then only we got the shocking news that he was seriously affected with Blood cancer and approaching death. But still then, Fr Siby as an enthusiastic missionary did not lose the hope to recover. He fought his best to come back. He was encouraged by Dr Joy Francis of Carmel Hospital, Palai to visit

his beloved mission once again when he got a little better. While he back to Rohru, he was again attacked by unending clutches of Leukaemia.

All those terrible treatment procedures were repeated once again and finally the RCC medical team discharged him with the observation 'nothing more is to be done.' Still Fr Siby was positive in his talk and always expressed his desire to go back to the mission. I noticed that whenever he was a little better, he used to talk about the Rohru mission with the visitors more than his physical conditions.

After a long period of struggle to recover from the blood cancer he was called to eternal reward in the early morning on 22 October 2021 with the presence of his sister Mrs Seena and his brother - Mr Saiju and his brother-in-law - Mr Baby. I must thank the superiors of MST for the best treatment available was given to him till the last moment of his life. Though the Covid-19 restrictions were there, a large number of priests,



sisters and faithful participated in his burial ceremony on 24 October 2021 at Deepti Mount. All of them had one thing to say - we lost a great missionary. Yes, really, we lost an enthusiastic missionary who walked differently.

Circular No. X-27/2018-23 29 October 2021

Your Excellencies, Reverend Fathers, Deacons and Brothers,

Warm and prayerful greetings from Deepti Bhavan!

This is to bring to your kind attention towards some significant information that concerns all members of the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle.

1. Revocation of the Process of Election of Delegates for the Extraordinary General Assembly

After prolonged reflections and series of discussions at different levels including the Plenary Council of the MST held from 4 to 8 October 2021, the LXX meeting of the General Council held on 26 October 2021 unanimously resolved to revoke the process of the election of delegates for the Extraordinary General Assembly-EGA (announced on 25 June 2021, Circular No. X-23/2018-23) and to initiate a new process for the election of delegates with immediate effect.

The committee that conducted the election of the delegates was constituted as per the norms given in the *Constitutions and Directives* (C&D) of the MST and it was given the mandate to conduct the elections following the procedures stipulated in D63 of the C&D (Circular No. X-19/2018-23, dated 25 February 2021). There is no evidence of any instance of malpractice which influenced the process of the election or its results. Yet, it has to be admitted that there occurred certain procedural errors against the norms given in D63. They are:

a. The seal of the Society was not used, but a different seal used (with the permission of the Director General and knowledge of the Secretary General) for stamping the ballot papers was against what is specified in D 63.

b. That the ballot papers were sent in bundles to certain places (with the consent of the concerned Regional Directors, Rectors, Coordinators, etc) was a procedural error against D 63, which specifies that the ballot papers shall be sent to every priest member.

c. The voted ballot papers were not sent back to the Convenor of the committee at Central House, rather they were received by the Convenor at his residence, against D 63.

The General Council takes the election committee in good faith and trusts that every step taken by the committee for the conduct of the election of the delegates was practical and with the right intention to facilitate the election in the context of Covid-19. However, the General Council also observes that a strict adherence to the norms of D63 was not followed in the election process, as specified above. In order to defend any future contentions against the veracity and the sacredness of our Constitutions and Directives, and to uphold our constitutional systems unquestionable, the General Council unanimously decided to revoke the process of election of the delegates for the EGA.

2. A New Election-Committee

In the above context, the General Council has decided to initiate a new election process with a fresh election committee. Anew election committee, consisting of Rev. Frs George Kuppayil (Convener), Jose Ottalamkal (Member) and Kuriakose Madathiparampil (Member), is appointed to conduct the election of the delegates to the Extraordinary General Assembly following the *Constitutions and Directives* of the MST (C& D 63). The committee is requested to give "the list of the number of votes each member received, to the Director General" (D 63), on or before **31 January 2022.**

3. The Agenda of the EGA

The same agenda of the EGA codified by the agenda committee and already circulated electronically among all the members (print versions were given to the elected delegates and ex-officio-members of the EGA) will form the agenda for the assembly. The newly elected delegates will be given the print versions of the agenda, once the election results are announced.

4. The New Schedule for the EGA

As we are initiating a new process for the election of the delegates, the EGA cannot commence on 15 March 2022 as scheduled previously. Instead, it will be held from 16.00 hours on Sunday, 1 May 2022 at Deepti Bhavan, Melampara, and will continue until it finishes its agenda.

Regret the inconvenience caused to all of you by repeating the election process and by rescheduling the EGA. May I solicit your kind understanding and collaboration in this regard. Let us fervently pray that these new decisions and our humble efforts help the MST uphold the fairness of its constitutional processes, and strengthen our future.
