



I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

Your Excellencies, Reverend Fathers, Rev. Deacons and my dear Brothers,



Let us also go, that we may die with Him (Jn 11:16). The Syriac word *Dukhrana* means Memory. On 3 July, we celebrate *dukhrana* of the martyrdom of our father in faith St Thomas the Apostle. As you know MST celebrates this year as the year of St Thomas while we celebrate the 1950th year of the Martyrdom of our patron. The year of St Thomas


invites us to remember (to a fond memory of) the great deeds done by our patron in order to bring good news to our land. It is a year to walk more closely with our patron to assimilate the missionary zeal and love for the Gospel he had. St Thomas walked closely with his Master Jesus that made him say that 'Let us also go that we may die with him.' It is the close collaboration with Jesus or the togetherness with his master, made him proclaim the Goodnews. In fact, he made a self-denying walk/pilgrimage with Jesus to be his missionary.

I have a story of pilgrimage I made in this Easter 2022. In the holy week I made, together with my conferrer Rev Fr Joby Kappiparampil who is pursuing his studies in Barcelona and nine families, a pilgrimage from Barcelona to Santiago de Compostella. It is known as the Camino de Santiago or Way of St James. It is a pilgrimage leading to the shrine of the Apostle St James the Great in Galicia in northwestern Spain where tradition holds that the remains of the Apostle James are buried. As St Thomas brought the Gospel to India St James brought the Gospel to Spain. It is one of the oldest pilgrimages in the world. Pope Alexander VI (14 AD) officially declared the Camino de Santiago to be one of the three great pilgrimages of Christendom along with Jerusalem and Rome. We took the route from France which is also known as the routes of Santiago de Compostella which is also inscribed on the UNESCO world heritage list because of its historical significances. The nine family groups, called Gloquillos, became friends through their children. The group comprised of different age groups from 6 to 74



years old. It was a parent group formed 10 years ago with their children. They are members of practicing Catholic families. By profession, some are the college principals, catechists, business people, police, pilot, etc. They started the pilgrimage 10 years ago from Barcelona. Every year they walked 100 kilometers of the pilgrimage and this year they were concluding the pilgrimage to which I was blessed enough to join the group by the help of Fr Joby. I was wondering their persistence of continuing this pilgrimage without break for the past 10 years. We joined the Camino from Saria to Santiago 100 kilometers and they were completing 1000 kilometers of walking to the tomb of St James. On our way we could see people walking more than a month to Santiago. I saw them walking without chappals, having a rosary in their hand, a shell on their bag

(sign of pilgrimage of Santiago) and a chain with cross on their chest. Walking together with the families I could experience the importance of sacrifice and self-denial for the expression of their faith. On the way we had Holy Qurbana, singing of devotional songs, praying the rosary etc. The elders shared their faith stories with their children, they played, danced, shared love, etc. There is no mobile used. Parents and children walk together and spend the whole time together. I think those children will never forget this experience in their life. They told me that this is the witness that they give to their children to



defend their faith. This Camino of faith in itself is a celebration with the Lord and the parents challenged their children to do the same. In the European context, it is really hard to continue a camino for 10 years without break.

In Kerala we could do such pilgrimages to Malayattoor or we could also make a pilgrimage to Mylapore like these families. Let it be the proclamation of our faith. For instance, people could walk from Malayattoor to Mylapore (614 km) by 10 days. Pilgrimages are necessary for our spiritual life. We know our Church is a pilgrim Church. We are walking together to our heavenly abode. When I shared my experience of camino to Santiago with the Associate Missionaries of the MST some of them already decided to make a walking pilgrimage from Deepti Mount to Malayattoor mount during the Great Lent of 2023.

It is the call of the time as we can see nowadays many walk out of the Church, Holy Father Pope Francis invites us to walk together. Pope Francis is leading a quiet revolution in the Church by means of Synodal approach. Francis has said "the path of Synodality is the path that God expects from the Church in the third millennium." At the heart of Synodality is that sense of journey – of being on the road together- but the Greek word 'Hodos' can also be understood symbolically as the 'WAY.' We are all on the WAY and the followers of the WAY. This image of the Church as a community travelling together along the same road is congruent with one of the most powerful images of the Church from the second Vatican council, which speaks of the Church as a pilgrim people, exiles journeying in a foreign land (Lumen Gentium 6), but aware that the Lord walks with us so that we are led by the Spirit (Gaudium et Spes II). I wish, at least once in life, all may have an opportunity to make a walking pilgrimage to sacred places dedicated to St Thomas our heavenly patron which will empower us to say, as he said, let us go that we may die with Him...

II. NEWS FROM THE GENERALATE

(From 20 March - 20 June 2022)

- 1. Extraordinary General Assembly
- a. Commencement of the Assembly: As announced, the



Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) commenced on Sunday, 1 May 2022 at Deepti Bhavan, Melampara. The inaugural Holy Qurbana was officiated by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel, concelebrated

by His Excellency Mar James Athikalam, Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor and other members of the assembly.

- **b. Orientation to the EGA:** Rev. Dr James Pampara CMI, an expert in Canon Law was invited to deliver an orientation talk for the members of the EGA, in the morning session of 2 May 2022. Based on the proposed draft of the 'Constitutions and Directives (C&D),' he highlighted his remarks and pointed out certain focal areas for the attention of the members.
- c. Sessions of the EGA: The formal sessions of the EGA started in the afternoon of 2 May 2022. The assembly formally opened with the inaugural address of the Director General at 2.30 p.m. on 2 May 2022. In his opening speech, the Director General declared that the EGA convoked for the purpose of finalizing the proposed draft of the C&D, is formally begun. Subsequently, the timetable and other procedures were fixed. Two scrutineers, two secretaries, five moderators, three members for drafting, and one member each for liturgy and time-keeping were selected to facilitate the EGA.

The assembly ran through four sessions daily, starting from 9.00 am in the morning till 7.15 p.m. in the evening. All 52 members of the EGA actively participated in the discussions. Each clause of the

Constitutions and Directives was discretely discussed and was adopted as part of the C&D, after voting. As the task remained unfinished, it was decided to conclude the present assembly at 4.00 p.m. on 19 May. During the days of the EGA, pilgrimages were arranged to the tombs of St Alphonsa and Bl. Kunjachan and the Holy Qurbana was celebrated at these places.

d.Conclusion of the EGAI-2022: In the final days of the assembly, the hitherto accepted alterations to the Constitutions and Directives



were adopted with voting and the minutes of the discussions so far were presented and approved. By 12.00 p.m. on 19 May, the Director General formally declared that the first leg of the EGA was concluded and that the EGA sessions would be resumed on 25 September 2022. The afternoon of 19 May was set aside for the visit of His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry who addressed the members of the EGA in the assembly hall, had a photo session in common and spent time at Deepti mount interacting with everyone.

Second Leg of the EGA: It was unanimously decided on the floor of the assembly to hold the second leg of the EGA for another twenty days from Sunday, 25 September till 15 October 2022. The members will arrive by 4.00 p.m. on 25 September, and there will be a Holy Qurbana at 6.00 p.m. followed by a short recollection in the evening. The EGA sessions will be resumed from the next day morning until 15 October 2022.

2. Visit of the Major Archbishop

His Beatitude Mar George Cardinal Alencherry, the Major



Archbishop visited the Central House and addressed the members of the EGA at 2.30 p.m. on 19 May 2022. He was accorded a respectful welcome by the Director General and

Mar James Athikalam. The foundation stone for the proposed prayer centre—'Kripasadan' at Kuttikkanam was blessed by His Beatitude.

The Major Archbishop was formally welcomed by the Director General at the assembly hall. On behalf of the MST, Rev. Fr Lonappan Arangassery delivered an address of felicitation to honour His Beatitude on the occasion of his sacerdotal golden jubilee and the episcopal silver jubilee. He admired the Major Archbishop for his outstanding courage in guaranteeing the identity of the Church. The books written by Rev. Frs Sebastian Kizhakkel and Jose Cheriampanatt were released during the occasion. Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal – the Vice Director anchored the programmes and proposed the vote of thanks.

3. Blessing of the Generalate Building and Consecration of the Chapel

The blessing of the newly built facilities at the Generalate took place on Holy Saturday -16 April 2022. The newly structured chapel of the central house was consecrated by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel at 6.00 pm. on 1 May 2022, assisted by His



Excellency Mar James Athikalam and Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, in the presence of the members of the extraordinary assembly and other invited guests from the neighbourhood. A sumptuous dinner was served for all after the ceremony.

4. Convocation of XI Ordinary General Assembly 2023

In accordance with the Constitutions and Directives (C68), the Director General convoked the Eleventh Ordinary General Assembly of the MST, to be held at the MST Generalate (Deepti Bhavan), Deepti Mount, Melampara-686578, Kerala, India from 4 p.m. on Monday, 15 May 2023. It was communicated to all the permanent members through a circular (Circular No. X-31/2018-2023) dated 12 May 2022. The same is appended to this bulletin.

A committee consisting of Rev. Fathers Lonappan Arangassey (Convener), Antony Cheeramvelil, Joseph Unnieppillil and Thomas Pathalil is constituted to prepare the agenda for the General Assembly (C69). All the permanent members of the MST are hereby invited to present their suggestions for the preparation of the agenda of the General Assembly (C68). The committee has to submit the agenda to the Director General before 25 October 2022 (C& D69). This information was shared with all the members of the MST through a circular (Circular No. X-321/2018-2023) dated 11 June 2022 and it is given as one of the appendices of this bulletin.

5. Intercontinental MISAL Meeting 2022 in Paris



All Superior Generals of the Missionary Institutes of Societies of Apostolic Life (MISAL) came together from 25-29 April 2022 at the MEP House in Paris. There was a sharing session by the MEP General about their pastoral missionary project for priests and lay

seminary-wise sharing by the formators. The programme was led by Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal – the Vice Director and Formation Secretary.


7. First Death Anniversary of Fr Mattam

10. Sleehusa-2022

The ceremonious sending of the new priests to the mission was conducted on 25 May 2022 at Deepti Mount. The new priests of 2022, Rev. Frs Gervasis Kodikulam and Michael Vettikuzhichalil were solemnly sent to the mission during the Holy Eucharist as representatives of the Syro-Malabar Church through the MST. His Excellency Mar Jacob Muricken, the Auxiliary Bishop of Pala presided over the Holy Eucharist and Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor and Francis Kureeckal were concelebrants. After the Holy Eucharist, Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor prayed for the candidates for their successful mission and handed over to them the



Recently, one of the parishioners bought a church bell and some others installed it. It was a project which got completed in a year. Almost all the expenses towards it will be \$15,000/. Four people have contributed to it. I see that the whole congregation was excited to have a Church bell. I remember my days in Susner, when we constructed a small church and bought a church bell. How excited all of us missionaries at Susner were in the year 1983! It might have cost us about \$50/. That bell was far better than the present bell we installed at the cost of \$15,000/. I could see the same excitement here in the members of the Christ the King parish. People are basically the same everywhere in the world!

2. New Vocation Promoter


