



#### I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL



Dear and Reverend Fathers, Deacons and Brothers,

The month of October is dedicated to the Mission. We shall remember and pray for all our missionaries who are engaged in various missionary activities in different parts of the world. Pope Francis summons each one of us to share the message of Christ to everyone. The theme of this year's World Mission

Sunday is, "we cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4: 20). "Go therefore to the highways and byways, and invite everyone you find" (Mt 22:9). No one is excluded; no one is removed from this compassionate love. #### II. NEWS FROM THE GENERALATE

(From 20 July – 15 October 2022)

#### 1. New Associate Missionaries

During the solemn Raza on 3 July 2022, the 1950<sup>th</sup> Year of Martyrdom (Dukhrana) of our Father in faith-St Thomas the Apostle,



11 candidates made their promise of association before the Director General, to be the formal associate missionaries of the MST. In accordance with Appendix I of the *Constitutions and Directives of the MST* and following the *Guidelines for the Associate Missionaries of the MST*, they have been selected by our coordinators and were given training for several months. They have been collaborating with the MST for many years as members of Santhome Fellowship. The final pages of this Bulletin give the personal details of every new associate missionary. Please get to know about our associate missionaries and dream about involving them in our missionary programmes in the future.

The MST is grateful to Fr Monse Karuvakunnel - former coordinator, Rev. Fr Joseph Pulavelil – the present coordinator and Rev. Fr Peter Kavumpuram - the Councillor-in-charge of Missionary Associates, for recruiting and training the new associate missionaries in accordance with the Guidelines for the same. Let us hope and pray that with the inclusion of new missionary associates, the MST may

take the lead in developing and displaying a participatory missionary approach in the Syro-Malabar Church, as enshrined in its Constitutions and Directives.

#### 2. Demise of Senior Priests

The MST still grieves at the unexpected departures of two of our members – Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel, Thomas Ayathamattam and Joseph Karikilamthadam. Let us continue our prayers for them. Please remember to fulfill the personal obligation of 'offering one Holy Qurbana for members on their demise' (C&D16 vii), if you have not yet celebrated.

#### a. Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel (1927-2022)



Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel, one of the pioneer members of the MST assigned to St Thomas Region and who had been living a retired life at Aaraam (Priest-home) at Deepti Mount, was called for his eternal abode at 9.15 p.m. on Saturday 20 August 2022.

Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel was enjoying a healthy retired life at *Aaraam*. He had no serious ailment and he was seldom bedridden for any reason. He was able to move around till the final day of his life on earth. As usual, he was present for the morning Holy Qurbana on Saturday 20 August at the *Aaraam* chapel. Sometime after supper, he fainted and instantly he was taken to Marygiri Hospital, Bharananganam. The doctor declared that he

had already breathed his last. He returned to the Lord almost at 9.15 p.m. Immediately, the Director General and many priests from Deepti Bhavan rushed to Marygiri. They



prayed the 'Office of the Dead,' and his mortal body was kept at the mortuary of the same hospital.



The funeral service of Rev. Fr Kadookunnel was held on 22 August 2022. His mortal remains were received from the mortuary of IHM (Marygiri) Hospital Bharananganam at 7.15 in the morning

and was brought first to *Aaraam* at 7. 30 a.m. His Excellency Mar Joseph Kallarangatt of Pala prayed the office of the dead at Aaram. From 8.00 a.m. the body was placed at the open hall of Deepti Bhavan for public homage. The first rites of the funeral service started at 1.30 p.m. led by his nephew Rev. Fr Sony Kadookunnel of the Archeparchy of Ernakulam-Angamaly. The second part of the funeral service was led by Rev. Fr Joseph Thekkekarott, the Regional Director of St Thomas Region, Mandya. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor – the Director General preached the eulogy. Their excellencies Mar Sebastian Vadakel, James Athikalam and Mar Joseph Kollamparampil were present for the Holy Qurbana and led the final rites. His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel preached the funeral homily. His mortal remains were laid to rest at the cemetery in Deepti Mount by 4.00 p.m.



Many priests and members of the religious communities from the eparchy of Palai, local political leaders, members of the MST, associate missionaries, friends and neighbours came forward to offer homage to Fr John Kadookunnel. The funeral ceremony was live telecasted and was attended by many members of the MST around the globe. On 26 August, a requiem Holy Qurbana was offered at the Deepti Chapel attended by his family members. The personal details including the biodata of late Fr John Kadookunnel were circulated to all the members through electronic media. The MST is grateful to Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel, for his missionary zeal, leadership and committed ministry in different capacities as the General Councillor, Treasurer General, Vice Director, Regional Director, etc. He undertook the construction of the present Jeevan Jytoi at Srirangapatna. His priestly ministry ranged the Eparchies of Pala, Mandya/Mananthawady and Muenster in Germany. As customary, 'A Tribute' is presented towards the end of this Bulletin prepared by Rev. Fr Joseph Kulathumkal, one of his co-workers in Mandya mission.

#### b. Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam (1929-2022)

Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam (94), one of the senior members of the MST assigned to St Paul Region and who had been living a retired life at Aaraam (Priest-home) at Deepti Mount, was called for his eternal abode at 1.50 p.m. on Wednesday, 24 August 2022.

From the year 1996, Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam was leading a very peaceful and

happy life at *Aaraam*. He suffered only minor issues of old age. For the past three years, he needed the support of a walker for moving around the house. Due to his inability to walk, he was dining in his own room for a couple of months, except for the common celebrations. However, he was regular for the Holy Qurbana in the morning, including the day of his death. As usual, he had lunch at the regular time on 24 August and expressed some discomfort, but was



reluctant to go to any hospital. But Rev. Fr Joseph Vadakechirayath – the Director of *Aaraam* arranged an ambulance and he was taken to Marygiri Hospital. Upon their arrival at the hospital, it was reported by the doctor there that he already had breathed his last in peace. His mortal body was kept at the mortuary there, after praying the 'office of the dead.'

The funeral service of Rev. Fr Ayathamattam was held on 26 August 2022. His mortal remains were received from the mortuary at 7.45 a.m. on 26 August 2022 and were placed at the main hall of Deepti Mount by 8.00 a.m. His Excellency Mar Joseph Kallarangatt of Pala and the Auxiliary Bishop elect of Shamshambad Msgr. Sebastian Kollampramapil prayed the office of the dead. The first rites of the funeral service started at 1.30 p.m. led by Rev. Fr Linson



Chenginiyadan CST and Rev. Fr Joby Ayathamattam of the Eparchy of Kalayan. The second part of the funeral service was led by Rev. Fr Vincent Kadalikkattilputhenpura, the Regional Director of St Paul Region, Ujjain. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor – the Director General preached the eulogy. Their excellencies Mar Sebastian Vadakel and Mar James Athikalam were present for the Holy Qurbana. The Holy Qurbana was officiated by Mar James Athikalam and Mar Sebastian Vadakel preached the funeral homily. The final rites were presided over by Mar Jacob Angadiath of Chicago. His mortal remains were laid to rest at the cemetery situated at Deepti Mount by 4.00 p.m. A memorial Holy Qurbana was celebrated on 1 September, and it was attended by many from his family.

The MST is grateful to Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam for all his committed initiatives for the work of evangelization in different places. As one of our senior members with a doctorate in Missiology, he was part of the formation programmes and held many leadership



roles, including the roles of the Vice Director and the General Councillor of the MST. He held several offices in the Eparchy of Ujjain, including that of the Vicar General and was an efficient

instrument in developing the MOC programme in Kotra. He served in Khirst Premalaya – the Regional Theologate (KPT) at Ashta, near Bhopal as its Vice Rector and the Dean of Studies. He was a Rector and formator at Deepti College, and at the MOC of the MST at Kamed, Ujjain. Beyond the eparchies of Pala and Ujjain, he worked in Italy and Jerusalem. A detailed biography and obituary were circulated electronically during the days of his departure. Rev.

Fr Jose Kondoor, one of his students in Deepti College and later a co-worker in Bishop's House, Ujjain has written 'in Memoriam' paying homage to Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamatttam.

**c.** Fr Joseph Karikilmthadam (1937-2022): A detailed coverage on the life, death and funeral of Fr Joseph Karikilmthadam will be given in the upcoming Christmas-2022 issue of the *MST World*.

It takes time to reset the unfillable vacuum set by the departures of 'Johnachan,' 'Thomachan,' and 'Josephachan' - three of our senior members who left us within a short span of two months, from the same house. It was heart-breaking and painful, especially for the senior residents at *Aaraam*. Let us keep united in prayer trusting in the unfailing designs of the Divine and keep the deceased members in our prayers.

#### 3. Second Phase and Conclusion of EGA

As it had been unanimously decided on the floor of the first phase of the Extraordinary General Assembly (EGA) held in the month of



May 2022, the second phase of the EGA for another twenty days started from Sunday, 25 September till Saturday, 14 October 2022. The delegates arrived by 4.00 p.m. on 25 September and there was a Holy Qurbana at 6.00 p.m. followed by a short spiritual orientation preached by Rev. Fr Joseph Vedikunnel.

**Sessions of the EGA:** The second phase of the EGA formally reopened with the address of the Director General at 9.00 a.m. on 26 September. It was decided to follow the same timetable and other procedures of the first phase of the assembly. With their special requests, the two nominated delegates and another elected delegate

were dispensed from participation and were absent in the second phase of the EGA. A few others left the EGA after some days of participation and yet another few were absent for some of the days/sessions of the assembly with the permission of the members of the EGA. Four members had to be absent for a few days as they fell ill.

As the agenda remained unfinished, additional evening sessions were held from 9.00 to 10.00 p.m. for three days. In order to facilitate the preparation of the final draft and the reports/minutes, there was a strategic break given on 13 October and a pilgrimage to the shrine of St Devasahayam, Kattadimala was arranged.

#### Conclusion of the EGA -2022

It took 38 working days spilt into two phases covering 121 sessions of almost 1.30 hours each. The delegates made earnest efforts to make contributions in deliberating over the second draft of the C&D, the sole agenda of the EGA. Several subcommittees within the EGA functioned efficiently in assisting the sessions. Before the conclusion of the EGA, sufficient time was set apart for the reading and acceptance of the complete text of the revised C&D of the MST with a final voting which unanimously passed and accepted the text. Having completed every formality of the EGA, at 6.00 p.m. on 14 October, the Director General formally declared that the EGA is concluded. A brief report of the assembly prepared by the secretaries of the EGA was circulated electronically and the same is appended to this news bulletin.

# 4. Maliparampil Memorial Seminar -2022



Late Rev. Fr Maliparampil memorial seminar was organized 20 September from 10.00 to 12.30 p.m. Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor – the Director General delivered the memorial talk on Fr

Maliparampil and inaugurated the Seminar. Rev. Fr James Kurukilamkatt led two sessions on Thomasine Missionary Spirituality. All the minor seminarians of Deepti College were present and other participants included religious sisters from the



neighbouring communities and some lay faithful totalling more than sixty participants. The seminar was organized by Thomasine Research Centre (TRC) under the leadership of Rev. Frs Francis Kureeckal and James Kurukilamkatt. A detailed report of the same is presented by TRC towards the end of this bulletin under the section of TRC.

#### 5. Meeting of the Senior Priests

As part of the ongoing formation, a meeting of the senior priests of



the MST (ordination batches ranging from December 1972 to April1982 was held from 20 to 22 September 2022 at Deepti Bhavan, Melampara. The meeting formally started with the inauguration by the

Director General at 7.00 p.m. on 20 September. Immediately after the Holy Qurbana on 21 September, the Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal – the Vice Director spoke in appreciation for the senior priests of the MST and the Director General individually honoured all those who were present.

The meeting of the senior priests was titled, "Called to preach till the

end." Different sessions were led by Rev. Fr Xavier Kudiamssery from the Diocese of Aleppey and Rev. Fr Jose Kuriedath CMI – the Director of Rajagiri Institutions, Kalamassery. The afternoon sessions were dedicated for personal sharing by the participants.



The meeting was attended by 33 senior priests from different parts of the world. They made a pilgrimage to the shrine of Blessed Kunjachan at Ramapuram and celebrated Holy Qurbana at the shrine of St Alphonsa at Bharananganam. Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal – the secretary for Ongoing Formation and Rev. Fr Viju Muringassery – coordinator of the expert committee of Ongoing Formation facilitated the programme.

#### 6. Sacerdotal Golden and Silver Jubilee

Rev. Fr Thomas Varakil is celebrating the sacerdotal golden jubilee this year. His is the first priestly ordination in the MST taking place as a member of the Society after its inception. Similarly, five of our priests are celebrating the silver jubilee of their priestly ordination this year (ordination batch of 1997-1998). They are:

The MST recognizes the contributions of all the jubilarians for their 50/25 years of priestly-missionary ministry in and through the MST. #### 16. Talk on Marian Consecration





# 3. Inauguration of Village Ministry



As numbers permitted at Mass were still to be restricted, due to social distancing and safety measures, we introduced an online booking system for Sundays which proved to be a success and allowed us to ensure that we could try to keep all those attending as safe as possible. This was aided by a few parishioners who acted as Stewards, calmly ensuring that the safety measures we were required to have in place were adhered to. We had used the time during the second lockdown to do some renovation works in church so the returning parishioners were greeted by a beautiful newly carpeted Sanctuary.

In due course daily Mass was reintroduced. Whilst we have not yet returned to having all day Adoration on Fridays, as we were prepandemic, we have introduced a short period of Adoration following the Wednesday evening and Friday morning Masses. At the instigation of one of the parishioners, the recitation of the Holy rosary was started before the Wednesday evening Mass.

We have been pleased, as the months passed and restrictions lifted, to have once again celebratory Masses for Our Blessed Lady with the procession round the grounds with Our Lady's statue. We have had the Corpus Christi procession around our grounds led by our First Holy Communicants and we are planning in the next few weeks to have a parish pilgrimage to Aylesford Priory to venerate the visiting relics of St. Bernadette. Aylesford Priory is the second important place of pilgrimage after Walsingham in England where Blessed Mary appeared to St. Simon Stock and gave him the Scapular.

We are not yet back to pre-pandemic numbers in our church, and as the virus has once again started to rise in the wider community and we may have to voluntarily introduce some safety measures once again, it has nevertheless been a joy for us to welcome back those who have been part of our parish community for years, and to also welcome the many new families and couples who have moved to the parish in recently. We look forward to our parish community growing in love and in the Holy Spirit.

Confirmation of the children at quasi parish Mbopo was celebrated on 3 July 2022. The main celebrant was His Excellency Stephano Musomba who is one of the auxiliary bishops of Dar Es Salaam. There were seventy-eight children received the sacraments of confirmation. Since they were having it in the quasi parish for the first time, the people of Mbopo were very happy. All the past years they had to come to the Madale parish to receive the sacraments.

#### b. Retreat for Parishioners

Recently, I visited a 97 years old man after 12 years. While I was doing my missionary work in Chengena parish in Songea Archdiocese I used to visit him. Now he is bedridden because of a fall. He is with his wife. They have completed 60 years in marriage. The life



is difficult but their face is glittering. Their life invites us to be happier in most difficult moments in our life. May God bless them.

Mission animation and communication activities are going on well. We share our mission concepts, purpose, nature and activities of MST to hundreds of people in our own parish here and in many other parishes when we are



invited for Masses, confessions, sermons and classes.

# C. THOMASINE RESEARCH CENTRE (TRC)

The Thomasine Research continues to organize various programs

for promoting Thomasine spirituality in the Church, especially in this year of St Thomas. Here are a few of the activities of TRC in the last few months.

### 1. Celebration of the Year of St Thomas

The year 2022 was declared as the Year of St Thomas by the MST and TRC was asked to spearhead the celebrations. TRC collaborated with Santhome Media in bringing out a documentary on St Thomas, both in English and Malayalam. Efforts were taken to promote the *Rambanpatt*, the traditional ballad of St Thomas Christians by giving a popular tune to it. 'Thomamargam vanchipatt'

was composed to make the story of St Thomas and the early growth of the Church in Kerala come alive for the common people. Classes and workshops were held in various parishes and



diocesan centers of the Syro-Malabar Church. We rendered our help to Santhome Media in conducting a quiz program on St Thomas. Plans are being made to conduct *Santhome Mission Fest* in selected parishes of the Syro-Malabar Church. Santhome Media is taking the lead for this program. The program will be telecasted by Shalom TV.

# 2. Fr Maliparampil Memorial Mission Seminar

After an interval of two years due to covid, Late Rev. Fr Maliparampil Memorial Mission Seminar was conducted on 20 September 2022. The last two editions of the seminar were held online. The topic selected for this edition of the seminar was the missionary life and spirituality of St Thomas. The seminar was inaugurated by Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General of MST. In his speech he paid rich tributes to Fr Joseph Maliparampil, the great missionary whom he knew very personally during his years of formation. Fr James Kurukilamkatt gave two lectures on the Missionary Life of St Thomas and the Thomasine Spirituality. Around a hundred people participated in the seminar. The whole program was organized under the guidance of Rev. Fr Francis Kureekal.

# 3. Distribution of Diplomas



The students of the second batch of the online course completed their course in September 2022. Out of the 27 students enrolled for the course, 22 became eligible for the diploma of the P a u r a s t h y a

Vidyapitam, Vadavathoor. They were awarded with the Diploma on 20 September 2022 by Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General of MST. Congratulations to the successful students.

#### 4. New Batch of the Online Course

Classes for the third batch commenced in September 2022. There are 24 students from various parts of the world enrolled for the course. This year we have two students from the USA. They show great enthusiasm to learn about the life and spirituality of St Thomas the Apostle.

## B. In Memoriam: Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel MST(1927-2022)

It is a privilege for me to pen down a few lines in honour of Rev. Fr John Kadookunnel, one of the pioneer members of the MST and a genuine priest of the Catholic Church. He was popularly known as Johnachan among his friends and associates. Johnachan lived his life in its fullness (Jn 10/10) for 96 long years on earth. He lived a healthy, happy and meaningful life. Praise and thanks to the Lord

I had the opportunity to work with Fr Kadookunnel when he was the Treasurer General of the MST from 1978-1983. I was then the

manager of Deepti Rubber Estate at Korenchira (Vadakkenchery), Palakkad. In those days Johnachan used to visit the estate and stay with me. He was interested in every minute matter of the plantation and gave me guidance with a fraternal



love and concern. Later, when Johnachan was the Regional Director of St Thomas Region, Mandya from 1988-93, I was the Director of Social Work of the Region. We lived together at Santhome Regional House of Mandya Mission. We had a very cordial relationship. He was a zealous and enthusiastic missionary, easily approachable and available. He esteemed his priesthood very much and lived a life of great simplicity.

Johnachan was born on 5 January 1927 in a noble family of



Kadookunnel, at Mutholy in the Eparchy of Pala. His parents were Ouseph and Mariam. He had three siblings, one brother and two sisters. Johnachan's official name was K. J. John and he was called Kunjilo. He completed his schooling at St Thomas High School, Pala in 1946. Then he joined the minor seminary at Changanassery in 1946. He continued his priestly studies at St Joseph's Pontifical Seminary Alwaye from 1948. On 8 December he received diaconate at Alwaye from His Eminence Eugene Cardinal Tisserant. Mar Sebastian Vayalil the first Bishop of Pala and founder of MST ordained him on 15 March 1955 at Alwaye. The first Holy Qurabana was celebrated at Cherpunkal along with Rev. Frs Sebastian Thuruthel and James Chavelil, his colleagues from the same parish. It was on 16 July 1968 that he made his perpetual promise of incorporation



into the MST, along with other first members of the Society. As a member of the MST Johnachan was ascribed to St Thomas Region Mandya. He

served MST and its missions earnestly.


From 1955 to 1974 he served the diocese of Pala in many parishes. Being one of the pioneer members of the MST, he served the Society



in different capacities. From1968 to 1974 Johnachan was part of Central Administration as its Third Councillor of the first General Council. From1974 to1978 he served at St Klara Kalden-hausen, Germany. From 1978 to 1983 he was the Treasurer General of MST and the Professor at Deepti College, the Minor Seminary of the Society. Once again, he went

to Germany as a hospital chaplain at Telgte in Muenster Germany. In 1986, Johnachan joined Mandya mission. In Mandya he was instrumental in the construction of Jeevan Jyothi - the, MST's Mission Orientation Centre at Srirangapatna. Johnachan served as Regional Director from 1988 to 1993. As a team leader, he organized missionaries of Mandya and fruitfully engaged in the evangelization activities. As a missionary, he was spirit filled and enthusiastic. His openness to the experiments of evangelization methods were exemplary and highly appreciated. He imbibed the approach of the non-institutional and nonformal experiments of missionary work at Mandya mission. The participatory education and evangelization method of mission was highly appreciated by

everyone in Mandya Region.





Johnachan was a man of compassion and love. He had great concern for the weak and marginalized in the community. In Mandya mission he was part and parcel of every activity of the Region. He knew each and every member of the community animators and encouraged them from the bottom of his heart. He had great esteem and respect for the women religious

missionaries who collaborated with the MSTs. He always welcomed and encouraged them. He loved their presence and service.

Johnachan lived a tension free life. He loved missions and contributed

generously for the development of the mission, by sharing his resources. He fostered and encouraged missionaries with utmost love and care. He was very curious to know about the growth of every cetnre and programmes. He used to visit Mandya and other missions of the MST. His option for the poor and the marginalized was according to the Gospel



values. He believed in empowering the weaker sections by educating them.

His preaching and conversations were attractive, appealing and humorous. He was genuinely humane. He loved celebrations of all kinds. He celebrated his life and finally his death. He left an indelible imprint on the map of MST and its missions. He peacefully and silently passed away on 20 August 2022.

We Miss you Johnachan.

## B. A Tribute to His Memory: Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam (1929-2022)

When I met Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam last during the days of our Extra-ordinary General Assembly at Deepti Bhavan, I knew he had not been too well of late, but not that unwell, so that when the news of his death came it was almost unbelievable. Faced with his sudden death on 22 August 2022, in



Christian faith we bow to God's holy will and in Christian hope we pray for God's mercy on his soul.

Fr Thomas Ayathamattam was born in 1929 in the traditional and noble Ayathamattam family at St. Michael's parish, Edamattam in the Eparchy of Palai. Mr Thomas (+1955) and Ann (+1986) were his parents and Mr A.T. Mathew (+2018), Mrs. Aleykutty Mathew Elavumkal (+2012 and Sr Ignas (Prabhudasi Sisters, Ajmer, +28 March 2022) were his siblings. After passing High School at St. Mary's High School Bharananganam in 1946, he joined the minor seminary of the Eparchy of Changanacherry and studied philosophy and theology at St. Joseph's Seminary, Alwaye. He was ordained a priest on 15 March 1955 by Mar Sebastian Vayalil at Aluva. He started his priestly life as the Assistant Vicar at Arakulam parish



followed by Lalam—Palai, Cherpunkal and Kaduthuruty. Then he was the Vicar of Chettuthode and Mallikassery for five and four years respectively. He did his further studies in Rome (1966-1972)

and obtained a doctorate in Missiology from Pontifical Urban University, Rome in 1972. When the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle was formally founded in 1968 Fr Thomas was in Rome doing his studies and so he took the perpetual promise of incorporation into the MST only in 1972, on his return from Rome. Later he was elected as its 2<sup>nd</sup> General Councilor (1973-1978) and in 1983 as the Vice Director General and the First Councilor. He



was also a member of the Tantur Institute of Biblical Study and Research in Jerusalem and spent there a few months in 1994. As he belonged to the St. Paul Region of MST, the major

part of his life as priest was spent as a pioneer missionary in the Eparchy of Ujjain, the first mission area entrusted to the MST. Fr Thomas was one of the founding fathers and senior members of the MST assigned to St. Paul's Region, Ujjain. He served the Ujjain mission in various capacities mainly as the formator of the missionaries and future missionaries (seminarians, director of various formation centres including one of the MP Bishops Conference (Khrist Premalaya, Ashta) as well as of the MST. Besides he was the Vicar General of the Eparchy of Ujjain for two long terms till he retired and shifted to *Aaram* in Kerala.

I have always so many sweet reminiscences of Fr Thomas Ayathamattam whom we used to lovingly address him 'Thomachan.' I always felt that he was a very successful priest, before God and humanity. He lived his priesthood intensely. My first chance to meet him was when I was a minor seminary student at Deepti College, as and when he joined Deepti College staff soon after his return from Rome. I still have the warmest possible memories of curiously looking at him with great admiration as he was so handsome, ever-smiling

and gentle young priest. He lived like a sportsman (in fact he was good badminton player too), simple, unassuming, frank, tolerant, sympathetic and above all very understanding, helpful and courteous. He was our professor to prepare us for our pre-degree course done

privately. Later I got the opportunity to be associated with him very closely in the early 1980s during my first years of priestly-missionary life in Ujjain when I joined the



Bishop's House as the Chancellor and Secretary. Then Fr Thomas was serving as the Vicar General of the Eparchy. Such an association made my experience as a wonderful human being with a golden heart. Besides, from the beginning I was impressed with his deep spiritual outlook - well-disciplined life and great concern for the mission. His prayerfulness was the foundation of his fervent and exemplary life. The memory of Thomachan is of a man outstanding by the integrity of his exemplary character. When I remember Fr



Thomas, I can't but recall to mind his long missionary apostolate, I am reminded of passage 1 Timothy 6: 11-12 "But you, man of God, avoid all this. Instead, pursue righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience and gentleness. Complete well for the faith. Lay hold of eternal life, to which you were called when you made the noble confession in the presence of many witnesses." In fact, Fr Thomas focused on these values and upheld them always with great determination, perseverance and patience throughout his



missionary journey. I can say with conviction that it was his exemplary life and high ideals about priestly and missionary life influenced me most for my priestly life in Ujjain. His gentle and soft nature was always a matter of great edification for me. He never ever showed any superiority of experience and education when I approached him for guidance when I was in office. On the other hand, his comments and corrections

were coated with great concern. He was loving and kind tenderhearted to understand the youngsters and considerate, supportive and encouraging. I used to get very valuable tips for life from him as a companion in a very gentle way. He often corrected with a smiling pointed look. Even when we were found mischievous and rebellious, he was there to point out the right perspectives and guide us with great understanding. Personal interactions and talks with him were really enriching. He was able to give sound solutions or consolations in the light of the Gospel to anyone who approached him.

Rev. Fr Thomas Ayathamattam has played a landmark role in the growth of the Eparchy of Ujjain with his collaboration as V.G. The initial years of this mission were really a challenging phase of the mission. The pioneers had to take up the challenges and answer the



cry from the people at large for help - be it in spirituality, education, healthcare, urban or rural welfare. The personality of Fr Thomas as a wise and prayerful missionary, helped and contributed a lot to overcome many a hurdle in the new mission under the leadership of Mar John Perumattam who had only a handful of missionary personnel in the beginning. Fr Thomas as his VG encouraged and supported every initiative among his colleagues if found good for the mission and of the

Church. Fr Thomas had always a mindset of a visionary with farsightedness for the growth of the mission. In this connection, it is worth recalling the opening of the first missionary orientation centre - Vikas Maitri (MOC) for the sisters who were fresh in the mission. In 1970s when Fr Thomas took charge as the first Director of Vikas Maitri, the local people, who have never seen Rev. Sisters before were having a lot of misunderstanding and suspicion about a new community in their village staying with a young man in the 'royal palace' at Kotra. However, when the people slowly and gradually came into contact with the said man namely Fr Thomas, they realized that he was none other than a very spiritual personality, a man of God and a man of prayer. All their misconception vanished and accepted the new Christian community at Kotra with great love and appreciation. That transformation of the local people after their interaction with the newly arrived missionary team under the leadership of Fr Thomas founded the future great missionary and formation venture at Kotra.



Over and above Fr Thomas was a man who gloried his loyalty to the Church and to his Superiors. He seems to have strongly believed and advocated that the strength and grace

for the priestly ministry came from perfect obedience to the just orders and directions of the superiors. I could observe that Mar John Perumattam had great confidence in his VG a he was able to find proper solutions for any issue and concern of the diocese. His solutions to the problem would be in an intelligent and well-disposed manner. For he was endowed with a keen intellect that was sharpened by wide reading. In short in everything Fr Thomas said and did, it was characterized by order, clarity and precision However in a world of pompous externalities Fr Thomas was always cool and down to earth and lived his priestly and missionary values in the given situation. It was also a good example for the youngsters like me in our younger age in the mission.

Fr Thomas was a great formator of the missionaries in a new mission and in MST. It is true that he had all the good qualities required of a perfect formator. He was always amiable and affable in behavior towards all who approached him. He was always calm, poised, earnest and reserved. He was self-possessed and undertook things



in an orderly fashion and was infinitely more concerned about doing well than about doing much. He had the special charism of availability and patient listening with a smiling face. He never showed any partiality but had great consideration for all though he never appeared to be very vocal and showy in public. Everyone felt at home and comfortable with him. Many a time I could see, those who approached him with grieved hearts or painful complaints returning with consoled heart. Above all, he was indeed a man of God and prayer. He was found carrying the unction and recollection of prayer into his active work. By his special devotion to Holy Eucharist, his long hours before the tabernacle he showed the source of his zeal and inspiration in the mission. His unreserved and



unassuming behavior endeared him to all. He was always punctual and orderly even in small things.

There is no doubt, as a priest, as a missionary and as a formator Thomachan was an embodiment of holiness, gentleness and meekness. He had no accusations, no complaints or no sense of loss, but was contented and appreciative of what was happening in the mission. Definitely, his specialization in missiology and his long first-hand experience of the mission in the field were real assets to the gradual historical development of the missionary path of the MST. Thomachan lived a simple, silent and prayerful life throughout his priestly and missionary life contributing enormously for the growth of the missions. When I met Thomachan last I found him very relaxed and totally surrendered to the designs of God, a type of holy indifference and always immersed in prayer and daily trifles. I am sure that he will intervene and intercede for us to complete our race in this life to receive the crown of glory with him.

## IX. APPENDICES

# A. Report of the Extraordinary General Assembly 2022

The Extraordinary General Assembly 2022 (EGA 2022), convoked to revise the Constitutions and Directives of the MST, commenced at Deepti Bhavan on 1 May 2022. There were 52 members in the EGA 2022 including 39 elected delegates, 11 ex-officio members and two nominated members. The consecration of the newly constructed Chapel at the Central House was a graceful event marking the beginning of the EGA 2022. His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel consecrated the Chapel in the presence of His Excellency Mar James Athikalam, Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the Director General of the MST, the members of the Extraordinary General Assembly and the invited guests.

Rev. Dr James Pampara CMI, a Canon Law expert, gave orientation talks for the fathers of the Assembly. He pointed out the essential aspects to be considered in the revision of any Constitution such as its spiritual orientation, clarity and obligatory nature. He suggested that the Constitution should be the same Gospel message for members in the language of the charism and spirituality of the founder. The discussion on the Agenda of the EGA 2022 started with a welcome address by Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor, the President of the EGA 2022. The Assembly elected office bearers such as Secretaries, Liturgical Celebrations In-charge, Moderators, Drafting Committee, Scrutineers, Technical Assistants and a Time Keeper for its smooth functioning. A timetable was chalked out with four sessions of one and half hours each daily.

The deliberations and discussions of EGA 2022 spanned over a period of 38 days. There were 121 sessions in two phases presided over by Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor. The EGA 2022 passed two resolutions with two thirds majority to approve the Constitutions and Directives by digital voting using the Google Forms and to audio

record its proceedings for the purpose of writing the minutes. The first phase of EGA 2022 was comprised of 58 sessions that discussed the newly formulated Preamble, the first chapter and part of the fifth chapter in the draft. The discussions and deliberations in the first phase concentred on the nature and ad gentes purpose as well as the structure and government of the MST. The new missionary challenges in the context of the all-India jurisdiction given to the Syro-Malabar Church and the need for a renewed missionary commitment from the part of the MST were reflected in the discussions and the subsequent revisions and formulations of the Constitutions and Directives. Taking into confidence the suggestions of the members of the MST, serious deliberations and discussions took place on the structure and government of the MST, and major changes were introduced in the mode of the election of the Director General. There were 134 votings in the first phase of the EGA 2022 passing unanimously or with two thirds majority the Constitutions and Directives discussed in its various sessions. The first phase of the EGA 2022 concluded on 18 May 2022.

The visit of His Beatitude Major Archbishop Mar George Cardinal Alencherry on 18 May 2022 was a highlight of the first phase of the EGA 2022. He addressed the members of the EGA 2022 and exhorted them to be docile to the promptings of the Holy Spirit while fulfilling the mandate of revising the Constitutions and Directives of the MST. The members of the EGA 2022 took time off to go on pilgrimages to the tombs of St. Alphonsa and Blessed Kunjachan, and celebrated Holy Qurbana there.

The second phase of the EGA 2022 commenced on 25 September 2022. It started with a Spiritual Talk given by Rev. Fr Joseph Vedikunnel. This phase had 63 sessions. The remaining chapters in the draft were discussed and revised. Major decisions were taken to form Regional Assemblies to elect the Regional Directors and their Councils. The administrative units like the Delegations and Coordinations were given greater importance and clarity. New decisions were taken to start Priest's Welfare and Pension Fund,

and Health Insurance Funds at the Central and Regional levels. Greater clarity was brought in on different stages of the Seminary formation, highlighting the importance of mission exposure programmes and practical training. Apart from revising the existing Constitutions and Directives (C&D), a provision for General Secretariat, and a new chapter on the Missionary Associates were added to the newly revised text. A new section on the Evolution of the Constitutions and Directives of the MST was formulated and added to the text of the C&D. Towards the end of the second phase of EGA 2022, the members of the Assembly visited the tomb of St Devasahayam and celebrated Holy Qurbana there.

With regard to keeping the minutes and writing down the approved final draft of the Constitutions and Directives, a resolution was passed to keep the print outs of the same signed, laminated and bound as books in two separate volumes in the archives of the MST. There were 308 votings in the second phase of the EGA 2022 to pass the resolution as well as the Constitutions and Directives. There were altogether 442 votings in the EGA 2022 to pass the four resolutions, and 221 Constitutions and Directives in nine chapters in the new text of the revised C&D and the vast majority of them were passed unanimously and the rest with two thirds majority which reflected the convergence of ideas and concepts of the Assembly members and their commitment to the noble cause of the revision of the Constitutions and Directives entrusted to them. The EGA 2022 was declared successfully concluded on Friday, 14 October 2022.
