I. MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL

Your Excellencies, Rev. Fathers, Rev. Deacons and Brothers in Christ! Let me express my profound joy to wish you all a blessed Christmas

and a bright new year 2023!



"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given" (Isiah 9:6).

Christmas is the *dukhrana* of God's ineffable gift of himself to our mankind. It repeatedly astonishes us that God makes himself a child so that we may love him, so that we may dare to love him, as a child trustingly lets himself be taken into our arms. It is as

if God were saying; "I know that my glory frightens you, and that you are trying to assert yourself in the face of my grandeur. So now I am coming to you as a child so that you can accept me and love me." (Pope emeritus Benedict XVI, Christmas Message 2012). Christ came to the world to live among us. "The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us" (John1:14). It gives us the assurance that God is always with us. He is always reachable to us as Emmanuel. The question here is do we prepare ourselves to receive the great gift of God, Emmanuel (God with us) in our life, ministry, heart etc.

To us a Son is given. The birth of a child is a matter of joy to all. It brings in an excitement that allows to forget the discomfort and sleepless nights for it fills us with a great, incompatible happiness. That is what Christmas is: the birth of Jesus is the "newness" that enables us to be reborn each year and to find, in him, the strength needed to face every trial. Why? It is not a palace which sees the birth of the redeemer, destined to establish the eternal and universal kingdom. "Non *eripit mortalia, qui regna dat caelesia*: He who came to give his heavenly kingdom,

does not take from us our earthly kingdoms (Hymn of epiphany). He is born in a stable and, coming among us. He came for us. He kindles in the world the fire of God's love (cf. Lk 12: 49). This fire will not be quenched ever again. Christmas brings to us the message of the fire/light of God in our midst: A light that shines in the darkness. It is an occasion for us to rekindle that light around us. Let this light/fire burn in our missions and in our hearts as a flame of charity in action, showing itself in openness to and support of our brothers and sisters sorely tried by want and suffering!

The star of Bethlehem that led the three Magi from the East helped them to adore the Child Jesus in the stable. In order to see the Child Jesus, they had to go beyond their cultures and homelands. As members of the missionary Society our vocation is also to go beyond our culture and home land. Like the Magi who after contemplation of the Child Jesus left the stable, let us also leave our comfort zones to proclaim to the people who have not yet known Christ and to be witnesses of His compassionate love. In order to share the Christ experience with others, first of all we should have a personal encounter and intimate relationship with the Son who is born for us at the stable in Bethlehem.

Let us be aware of our responsibility to proclaim Christ and go with Christ to the poor and the abandoned, to the hungry and the broken, to the peripheries of the society. Let us carry on the mission to spread the Christmas message of God's love and merciful compassion by becoming faithful to the teachings of Christ and His Church.

At this juncture I also express my appreciation to all of you for being faithful witness of Christ's love and zealous missionaries of His charity in the places where you are. Society is proud of you for what you are. Society is with you in this mission of Christ. Let us continue to be one in love and charity.

Once again, all the choicest blessings of Christmas and a prosperous new year. God bless us all.

4. Demise and Funeral of Rev. Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam (1937-2022)



Rev. Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam (85), one of the pioneer members of the MST assigned to St Paul Region, Ujjain and who had been living a retired life at *Aaraam* (Priest-home) in Deepti Mount, was called for his eternal abode at 5.45 a.m. on Wednesday 19 October 2022. The funeral service was held on 20 October 2022, and he was laid to rest at the cemetery of Deepti Mount on the same day.

Rev. Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam is one of the pioneer members of the MST who went straight to the Ujjain mission in 1969, and who took the perpetual promise of incorporation into the Society after almost one year of his life in the mission on 8 December 1970. Hailing from Mutholapuram parish of Pala, he was ordained a priest for the Eparchy of Pala in 1964 during the Eucharistic Congress held in Mumbai, and began his priestly ministry as an assistant parish priest at Marangattupilly. Later he served as the assistant parish priest at St Augustine's Forane Church Kadanad. From there, he



proceeded to the newly started Ujjain mission in 1969. He began his missionary life at Chandessary as the priest in charge of this new mission centre for three years. From there, he moved to the interior

village of Piploda and was there for three years. He was sent for studies in Agriculture in Allahabad and took a Bachelor of Science (BSc) in Agriculture. After his studies, he was in charge of the rural mission centre at Bajrangarh and from there he developed Baskhedi. In different durations, he spent a total of 22 years in Bajrangarh-Baskhedi-Bachukehda mission centres and was part of the Ashram movement in Ujjain mission living in one of the hermitages built in Bachukheda for three years. Moving away from Baskhedi in 1999, he served at Prarthana Niketan, Pachore as its assistant priest-incharge. He took a decennial break in 2002 and spent much of the time at Kurisumala Ashram in prayer and meditation. He returned to Ujjain in 2003 and helped at Kripa Training Centre, Chandessary as the House-in-charge for five years and later moved to Santhome





Regional House and stayed there until his retirement in 2012. During that period, he travelled to the US and Europe. He also made a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Since 2012, he has been residing at *Aaraam*, spending his time mostly in rest and prayer.

As one of the pioneer members of the MST, he was passionate about the mission *ad gentes* purpose of the Society and made every effort to work among the non-Christians in view of their evangelization. As a missionary, he was very unassuming and was trying to live his missionary life at the grassroots, being with the people. He was interested in giving classes on Agriculture in the seminaries. He was very committed to making person to person contact by visiting the families in the villages. To his last, he lived a very simple life, and was happy with minimum facilities, trying to



identify with the poor villagers he served. He practised inculturation and interreligious dialogue solidly in his missionary approach, and was daring to do experiments in mission embracing a people-centred approach than for institutionalization.

By the end of August 2022, he had been struggling with a series of ailments related to old age, and was infected with Covid as well. He was admitted to Carmel Hospital Palai and returned to Aaraam with improved health. Later he showed symptoms of severe seizures/fits



and had to be admitted at Mar Sleeva Medicity. He was supplied with ventilator assistance for almost a week. He was later shifted to the room and remained there for four days. He was cared for by his family, especially by his nephews. He had a very peaceful departure for heaven at 5.45 a.m. on Wednesday 19 October 2022.

His mortal remains were brought to *Aaram* by 8.00 a.m. on Thursday 20 October, and the residents there offered prayers and homage. His mortal body was then placed at the open hall of the Generalate from 8.30 a.m. The first part of the funeral services started at 1.30 p.m. led by his nephew Rev. Fr Jose Moorkkattil of the Eparchy of Kothamangalam. The second part of the funeral liturgy was presided by Very Rev. Fr Manoj Vareeckal—the Vicar General of the Eparchy of Ujjain. His Excellency Mar George Madathikandathil of the Eparchy of Kothamangalam officiated the Holy Qurbana and the third part of the funeral service in the chapel. The final rite of the


funeral was led by His Excellency Mar Joseph Kallarangatt of the Eparchy of Pala. By 4.00 p.m. he was laid to rest at the cemetery of Deepti Mount.

Many priests and members of the religious communities from the eparchy of Palai, local political leaders, members of the MST, associate missionaries, friends and neighbours came forward to offer homage to Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam. The funeral ceremony was live telecasted and was attended by many members of the MST around the globe. There was a special requiem Holy Qurbana celebrated on 26 October at Deepti Bhavan, attended by his siblings and close relatives. As customary, 'A Tribute' is presented towards the end of this Bulletin prepared by Rev. Fr Mudathottiyil, a friend and a neighbour from the hometown of Josephachan.

Please remember to fulfil the personal obligation of 'offering one Holy Qurbana for members on their demise" (C&D 16 vii), if you have not yet celebrated.

5. Demise of Associate Missionary – Mr Joseph Poovathunkal

Mr Joseph Thomas Poovathunkal (Joseph Chettan-72), one of our



Associate Missionaries was called to eternal life on 6 December 2022. The funeral service was held on 7 December at St Dominic Cathedral, Kanjirappally. Very Rev. Fr Director General paid him homage and prayer through his visit to the family before the funeral, and Rev. Fr Peter Kavumpuram, the General Councillor in-charge of the Missionary Associates and other fathers participated in the

funeral service.

Mr Joseph Thomas Poovathunkal was a member of Santhome Fellowship from 2011 and became our missionary associate through the promise of association made on 22 February 2019. He was

very active as an associate missionary and has visited our missions, and was very earnest in supporting the MST through various means. He was very helpful in the preparations of the recently held general gathering of Santhome Fellowship and Associate Missionaries at Deepti Mount. He had been very active in his parish (Kunnumbhagam, Kanjirappally) in different leadership roles. He owned some private businesses around Kanjirappally. He is survived by his wife, son and a daughter. Let us pray for the repose of his soul and shall keep his family in our prayers.

6. Conclusion of the Year of St Thomas



The conclusion of the celebrated 'Year of St Thomas in the MST' in connection with the 1950th year of the martyrdom of St Thomas the Apostle was held on Sunday, 27 November 2022 at the Generalate. The day was blessed with the presence of His Beatitude – the Major Archbishop. His Beatitude arrived at Deepti Mount on the evening of 26 November and addressed the seminarians and the priests during the dinner at Deepti College, and resided at Deepti Bhavan.

The conclusion of the **Year of St Thomas** was marked with a general gathering of the members of Santhome Fellowship and Associate Missionaries in the morning and an ecumenical colloquium by scholars representing different churches in the St Thomas Christian tradition organized by TRC in the afternoon. The day started with

Holy Qurbana celebrated by His Beatitude – Mar George Cardinal Alencherry concelebrated by the Director General and the Director of Santhome Fellowship, and others. The general gathering of the members of Santhome Fellowship and Associate Missionaries, and the ecumenical gathering in the afternoon were inaugurated by His Beatitude and presided over by the Director General. The reports from Santhome Fellowship and TRC would cover the details of the event in their pertinent parts towards the end of this bulletin.

7. Sacerdotal Golden and Silver Jubilee Celebrations



The sacerdotal silver and golden jubilee of the members of the present years were celebrated formally and solemnly at Deepti Bhavan from 4 to 6 November

2022. The jubilarians arrived by 4.00 pm on 4 December and an informal inauguration/introductory meeting was held at 7.00 p.m. Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal - the Vice Director welcomed the jubilarians and Very Rev. Fr Antony Perumanoor formally addressed the jubilarians. There was also some time given for personal sharing by each jubilarian.

Rev. Fr George Njarakunnel of the Eparchy of Pala was arranged to give spiritual refresher talks for the jubilarians. He guided them through two talks in the morning session on Saturday, 5 December. The afternoon was set aside for informal interactions. The solemn jubilee gathering started with a procession from the Generalate hall to the seminary auditorium accompanied by drums. The felicitatory gathering was coloured with cultural programmes by the seminarians. The Director General in his speech congratulated each jubilarian present, and presented them with mementos and gifts. There was a special dinner thereafter. The jubilarians offered solemn Holy

Qurbana at the chapel of the minor seminary on Sunday, 6 December. The celebrations concluded with breakfast at the minor seminary.



Rev. Fr Thomas Varakil, the golden jubilarian of the year had his ordination on 30 December 1972 and it was the first priestly ordination of a member of the Society, after its inception in 1968. The ordination was held at the present minor seminary. He was specially remembered and congratulated for his pioneering missionary apostolates in the Eparchy of Ujjain and for his present ministry at Moriah Retreat centre at Nelliyady in the Eparchy of Belthangady. Similarly, five of our priests who celebrate the silver jubilee of their priestly ordination this year (ordination batch of 1997-1998) were also individually appreciated. They are: Rev. Fr Kuliraniyil Mathew, Rev. Fr Mullappallil Joseph, Rev. Fr Nellikunnel Mathew, Rev. Fr Pazheveettil Joseph and Rev. Fr Thakadiyel James. Except Fr Kuliranyil all of them were present for the celebrations. Fr Kuliraniyl who was absent due to sickness, visited Deepti Bhavan later and he was felicitated by the Director General in the presence of the minor seminarians.

The MST recognizes the contributions of all the jubilarians for their 50/25 years of priestly-missionary ministry in and through the MST. Let us thank all of them for their sacrifices and committed services in their places of apostolates, and pray for a joyful and healthy life ahead.

8. Gathering of the Junior Priests

As part of the ongoing formation, a meeting of the junior priests of



the MST (ordination batches ranging from 2013 to 2021) was held at Deepti Bhavan, Melampara from 20 to 22 October 2022. The meeting formally started with the inauguration by the Director General at 7.00 p.m. on 20 October and all the members of the General Council were present for the opening session.

There were input classes, as part of the ongoing formation, in the morning sessions of 21 and 22 October led by Dr Beena Manoj from Ernakulam and Rev. Fr Binoy John Vadakkedathuparampil of the diocese of Bhagalpur. The afternoon sessions were dedicated for personal sharing by the participants, based on practical questions

given in advance. The meeting was attended by around 65 junior priests from different parts of the country. They made a pilgrimage to the shrine of Blessed Kunjachan at Ramapuram and



celebrated Holy Qurbana at the shrine of St Alphonsa at Bharananganam. Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal – the secretary for Ongoing Formation and Rev. Fr Viju Muringassery – coordinator of the expert committee of Ongoing Formation facilitated the

programme.

9. Memorial of the Deceased Members



A Memorial Day for all the deceased members of the MST was held on 12 November 2022. The family members of the deceased MST priests and brothers were invited to Deepti Bhavan for a



memorial Holy Qurbana at 10.00 a.m. After the Holy Qurbana, some of the family members shared reminiscences about the deceased priest of their family. The office for the dead was prayed at the cemetery and the gathering concluded with lunch. There were almost 100 participants for Memorial Day.

10. Death Anniversary of the Founder

On 21 November 2022, the death anniversary of our Founder –



Mar Sebastian Vayalil was commemorated. The Director General joined with the Holy Qurbana and special prayers held at St Thomas Cathedral – Pala, led by two Bishops of the Eparchy of Pala. Members from the

General Council, Deepti seminary staff and the students also participated in the memorial service at the Cathedral, Pala.

11. Parents' Meet of the Deacons



A meeting of the parents of the deacons who are in immediate preparation for the priestly ordinations was held on 4 December 2022. The meeting started with an opening address by the Director General and followed by interaction by all the General Councillors and the Treasurer General. The meeting was intended to help the parents of the *ordinandi* to be prepared for the ordinations and to support them spiritually. Rev. Joy Panjikkaran was the resource person to guide the parents. Rev. Fr Francis Kureeckal offered Holy Qurbana for them. The meeting concluded with lunch. All the parents were present for the gathering.

12. Gathering of the Deacons

The *ordinadi* of the present year were gathered at Deepti Bhavan to help them with immediate preparation for their ordination from 14 to 15 December 2022. There was a formal and friendly interaction with the deacons and the General Council on the evening of 14 December. Msgr. George Alumkal from the Eparchy of Kanjiarapply guided the deacons to help them prepare for their ordinations on 15 December. The gathering came to a close with the lunch.

12. Oriental Canon Law Conference at Deepti Bhavan

It was a privilege for the MST to host the annual Oriental Canon Law Conference from 25 to 27 October 2022 at Deepti Bhavan.



Around 70 canon lawyers from both the Syro-Malabar and the Syro-Malankara Catholic Churches participated in it. It was also an occasion for us to make the participants aware of the missionary activities of the MST in different parts of the world by means of a documentary.

13. Mission Rally at Deepti Mount

More than twenty-five thousand members of the *Cherupushpa Mission League* (CML) from different dioceses in Kerala were gathered together at the Alphonsa Nagar Bharananganam on 04 December 2022 in connection with the conclusion of the Platinum Jubilee Celebration of the CML. The organizers chose Deepti Mount as one of the starting venues of the Mission Rally. It was an occasion for the MST to inspire and





encourage the vibrant and zealous children from different dioceses in Kerala.

13. Overseas Ministry

Archdiocese of Songea, Tanzania: Rev. Fr George (Akhil) Thottappallil joined the Archdiocese of Songea and received appointment as the Assistant parish priest of Chengena parish.

Diocese of Corpus Christi, TX, USA: Rev. Fr Kurian (Joshy) Areeplackal joined the Diocese of Corpus, Texas, USA in the month of November 2022.

14. Completion of Studies

Rev. Fr Kuriakose (Roby) Adapoor completed Doctoral

Studies in Clinical Psychology with Magna Cum Laude at the University of Santo Tomas, Manila, Philippines. The title of his doctoral dissertation was "Development and Implementation of the Wellness Enhancement Therapy on Expressed Emotion and Subjective Burden among the Family Caregivers of Patients with Schizophrenia." Congratulations to Rev. Fr Roby Adapoor.

12. Demise of the Mother of Bro. Puthenpurackal MST




d. Pastoral Activities of the Parish Pleß

have greater respect and preferences to pray for their ancestors. It's part of their tribal cult and tradition as well. Fr Shaiju organised blessings of cemetery in the parish church as

the first rains in the region in the beginning of December. Thereby, the parishioners formed different groups by themselves based on pious groups, parish jumias and other groups to start the cultivation from December

onwards. This is one of the means of sustainability of the parish.


b. Congratulations to Fr Roby Adapoor

He is also in the Core team of the RVA program department which supervises the 21 language services in various Asian countries and a member of the Management Council of RVA.

10. Hindi Qurbana Started at Erumapetty Parish





TRIBUTE:

The Aura of Venerable Fr J. Karikilamthadam

Father Joseph was born on 1 March 1937 at Palakkattumala in the Eparchy of Pala. His parents Mr Chacko and Mrs Anna fondly



called him 'Kunjootty'. His siblings were Varkey, Annakutty, Mariakutty and Pathrose. For his primary education he was sent to St Paul's Convent School Mutholapuram. In the native school he is registered as K.C. Joseph. He continued his upper primary studies in Holy Cross school Monippally from 1951. Joseph pursued his high school studies at St. Peter's High School Elanji, where

many of the MST priests studied. After SSLC Joseph joined St Thomas Higher Secondary School, Pala for the intermediate studies.

After Intermediate, young Joseph recognized the call of the Lord within him and joined Good Shepherd minor seminary, Pala in 1956 where he received preparatory formation to priesthood. For further

clerical studies Joseph was sent to St Joseph's Pontifical seminary, Aluva, where he finished his philosophy and theology. He was ordained a priest by Mar Sebastian Vayalil, the first Bishop of Pala, at the Eucharistic Congress in Bombay which was blessed with the auspicious presence of Pope Paul VI. Fr Joseph started his priestly ministry as assistant parish priest at St Francis Assisi Church, Marangattupally. His next





appointment, as assistant vicar, was at St Augustine's forane Church, Kadanad. The Lord of the harvest had greater plan for Father Joseph. To contain the numerous vocations to priesthood from the eparchy of Pala, Bishop Vayalil had given shape to the Missionary Society of St Thomas, the Apostle (MST) in which, along with some other zealous missionaries, Fr Joseph joined as a pioneer member

and took perpetual promise on 8 December 1970.

Rev. Fr Joseph was one of the pioneers who stepped into the Apostolic Exarchate of Ujjain, the new mission territory entrusted to the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle as an extension of the Syro-Malabar Church in Madhya Pradesh. In 1970, Fr. Joseph took his Diploma in Sociology from the prestigious Indian Social Institute, Mumbai. In 1972, Fr Karikilamthadam was appointed as priest-in-charge at Chandessary farm which was newly purchased. It was to Piploda, the remote village mission station that he was





transferred in 1972. From there he was sent to Agricultural Institute of Allahabad for graduate studies in BSc agriculture. Since he was excellent in studies, Bishop Perumattam had considered to send him to St John's Medical College,

Bangalore for medical studies.


When he returned from agricultural studies Fr Joseph was appointed as priest in-charge of Bhajarangarh, a very remote village with no proper travel facilities. If Bishop John Perumattam was the Shepherd and Architect of the Eparchy of Ujjain, the pioneer missionaries of MST showed the mettle in planting and nurturing the mission shedding their sweat and toil. While staying there he contacted and familiarized with another village called Baskhedi where he worked from 1982 to 1986 and again another long period from 1990 to 1999. When Bishop John introduced various humanitarian works to help the





downtrodden Fr Joseph extended his full support by making roads and digging wells to provide drinking water for the poor in the far-flung villages. He always enjoyed the company of seminarians and welcomed them for village exposure programme.

I have very fond memories of paying not so infrequent visits to Fr K.C. Joseph. He remained close to my heart as a memorable host and admired friend. Without any inhibition he used to share his mission experiences and entertain the guests with snacks and drinks. He left the trails of his works wherever he worked. He was simple in living





style, loving, joyful and social at heart. Once I went to visit Fr Joseph on an Easter eve. I stayed with him overnight and we have had our morning prayers and Holy Mass together in the tiny chapel and rushed to the kitchen with an empty stomach for the Easter breakfast which Fr Joseph had prepared before Mass and kept. To our mounting fury and surprise a famished canine had

consumed everything and left the casserole empty. It was not at all

difficult for the dog to enter the kitchen of the dilapidated hut. Though this incident broke my heart, Fr Joseph took it amusing.

Through thick and thin he continued to live amidst the people in the remote



villages. He drew inspi-ration from the word of God and his constant prayer in front of the Eucharistic Lord. When I visited him in the tiny

village of Baskhedi, often he was immersed in Bible reading in front of the tabernacle in the clumsy chapel. He set up house in remote villages with no facilities for a decent life. Daily he made it a routine to visit the neighbours house to house.





Then for a short period (1986-1988) he was priest-in-charge at Mendya Regional house. It was at this time (1988-90) four zealous missionary collaborators made an experiment with ashram life at Bachukheda under the leadership of two-time Director General Rev. Dr Kurian Valiyamangalam. In this new venture Fr Francis Kandathil, Fr Augustine Puthenpura and Fr Joseph volunteered



to join. It did not last long. Then for



a short period (1999-2001) he served at prayer centre, Pachore. From 2003 to 2008 he lived as house-in-charge at Kripa Training centre, Chandessary and later from 2008 to 2011, till he parted with the mission lived at Santhome Regional house, Mendya. After retirement

when he was no more able to carry out the tasks of the missionary



life he left for Kerala and took refuge in *Aaram* priest's house, Deepti mount.

In Aaraam he lived a life of prayer and rest for about 10 years. In final years most of the time he spent on bed. Falling in the toilet room made his health all the more critical. He was taken to Medicity where it was diagnosed that he had developed cerebral stroke and hemorrhage. There he received the

sacrament of Anointing and was admitted to intensive care unit with ventilator support for three days. Then shifted to room on 15 October and given only oxygen supply. His nephew - sister's son, Mr Baby was at his bedside at the time of his heavenly journey. In the early hour of 15 October 2022 Fr Joseph was called for eternal reward. MST and the Eparchy will remember him as an enthusiastic and venturing missionary.



A million thanks to Rev. Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam for the inspiration of a missionary lifestyle and legacy. He leaves behind lessons for generations to follow. As he continues to live in eternity, I am sure that he would still live in the hearts and heads of many of us, including the poor and the unknown villagers in rural Madhya Pradesh.

Tribute: Memoirs on Mr Joseph Poovathunkal-An Associate Missioanry of the MST

"For this God is our God for ever and ever: He will be our guide



even unto the death" (Pslam48:14). I do remember a man who followed and had the guidance of the lord up the threshold of his death, that is Mr Joseph Thomas. Mr Joseph Thomas Poovathunkal (Joseph Chettan-72), one of the pioneer Associate Missionaries, was called to eternal bliss on 6 December. He had been a devoted member of Santhome Fellowship ever since 2011 and turn out to be our Missionary Associate of the

first batch through the promise of association made on 22 February 2019. He was very committed and dynamic as an associate missionary and has visited our missions.

He was a very close collaborator and well-wisher of the MST. He played a pivotal role in the formation and progress of the Santhome Fellowship group in Kanjirapally. He was indeed aware of his missionary call and so he was very earnest in promoting vocations to the MST. Here do I acknowledge two main peculiarities about him firstly his availability and readiness to help. Secondly, he was invariably present for all the meetings of Santhome Fellowship and Missionary Associates.

He got retired from Karela civil supplies corporation. Tresiamma – his life-partenr is a pious house wife. They have two children Vins and Vincy and both are married and settled. Through Josephchettan, all of them knew about the MST and were very enthusiastic about

our missions. He had been very active in his parish in various leadership capacities too. For the last few years, he served as a president of Vincent de Paul. And he was the kaikaran (trustee) of the parish for several terms. His missionary enthusiasm was really an inspiration for many people in his parish and surrounding places.



His love for the MST priests and its missions was very unique. He held a fatherly/brotherly affection to the priests he knew in MST and was very curious to know about their missionary apostolates. After his visit to Mandya mission in 2019, he used to ask me about certain apostolic activities and the status of some mission centres that he had registered in his mind. He was very passionate about the new Christian communities being developed in our new missions. Although he was not able to travel much, he knew the places by name and used to tell me that the Lord will reward our hard work in the missions through the fruit of vibrant Christians in the future.

More than a missionary associate, he was very loving and caring to me and to my predecessor-directors of Santhome Fellowship. My association with him was only for four years, but that was very personal and cordial, and he considered me as one in his own family. When I left Deepti for Rome, he was very meticulous to confirm that he can continue contacting me. And he did that every now and then, and was very curious to know what I would be doing in the mission after my studies. He had called me a couple of days before



his death asking me to take good care of my health in the impending winter. He was a lover of mission and missionaries, and with his departure for heaven we miss another zealous associate missionary after Mr Baby Padalody (Baby-sir) who passed away in 2020. Often, I am humbled at their missionary spirit and commitment. I am sure that both Baby-sir and Joseph-chettan would continue their mission in heaven through their powerful intercession for the MST, its missions and the missionary associates.

Let us pray with 2 Thessalonians 3:16 "now may the Lord of peace himself give you peace at all times and in every way." Let us pray for the repose of his soul and shall keep his family in our prayers.

Subject: Mode of sending ballot papers to the members outside India

Your Excellencies and Reverend Fathers,

Prayerful greetings from Deepti Bhavan!

Since some of our members living outside India could not exercise their voting for the previously conducted election of the delegates to the Extraordinary General Assembly due to failure in the postal system, a resolution was unanimously passed in the VXXXV meeting of the General Council held on 3 November 2022 to authorize the election committee – to send the envelopes containing the ballots in bulk to the appointed coordinators in different countries (USA, Canada, Germany, Italy, Austria, United Kingdom, Tanzania and Australia) through the international courier service - DHL. Once the ballots are dispatched, the Convener of the Election Committee will inform the coordinators and will share the waybill for tracking the package. The coordinators shall distribute the envelopes to the addressees and at the receipt of the ballots, the coordinators and the addressees shall inform the Convener in writing (by email). The members can return their ballots to the Convener separately or in bulk by registered post/courier, or in person at their own choice, and can inform about it to the Convener of the Election Committee as necessary. In other countries where the members live in small groups or alone, they will be personally contacted by the Convener to decide on the mode of sending the ballots either by courier or by post. Kindly note the email and phone number of Rev. Fr Joseph Muthuplakkal for any communication in this regard (Email:

josephmuthuplakkal@gmail.com; Phone/WhatsApp: +91 96504 82969). To all the members in India, the ballots will be sent individually by registered post as usual. In all cases, the ballots should be returned to the Convener of the Election Committee at Deepti Bhavan on or before the date specified in the letter sent along with the ballots.

May I remind you to strictly follow the norms in exercising your voting right. The voted ballot paper should be enclosed in a smaller envelope and pasted, with no names or indications on it (cf. D63). A vote is null unless it is free; therefore, a vote is invalid if an elector has been coerced directly or indirectly by grave fear or by fraud to vote for a certain person or many persons disjunctively (Cf. C70; CCEO 954).

May I request all of you to cooperate with the election process, and pray for the success of the upcoming XI Ordinary General Assembly 2023.
