

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

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MESSAGE OF THE HOLY FATHER FRANCIS FOR LENT 2025





Dear brothers and sisters,

We begin our annual pilgrimage of Lent in faith and hope with the penitential rite of the imposition of ashes. The Church, our mother and teacher, invites us to open our hearts to God's grace, so that we can celebrate with great joy the paschal victory of

Christ the Lord over sin and death, which led Saint Paul to exclaim: "Death has been swallowed up in victory. Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" (I Cor15:54-55). Indeed, Jesus Christ, crucified and risen, is the heart of our faith and the pledge of our hope in the Father's great promise, already fulfilled in his beloved Son: life eternal (cf.Jn10:28; 17:3). This Lent, as we share in the grace of the Jubilee Year, I would like to propose a few reflections on what it means to *journey together in hope*, and on the summons to conversion that God in his mercy addresses to all of us, as individuals and as a community.

First of all, to journey. The Jubilee motto, "Pilgrims of Hope", evokes the lengthy journey of the people of Israel to the Promised Land, as recounted in the Book of Exodus. This arduous path from slavery to freedom was willed and guided by the Lord, who loves his people and remains ever faithful to them. It is hard to think of the biblical exodus without also thinking of those of our brothers and sisters who in our own day are fleeing situations of misery and violence in search of a better life for themselves and their loved ones. A first call to conversion thus comes from the realization that all of us are pilgrims in this life; each of us is invited to stop and ask how our lives reflect this fact. Am I really on a journey, or am I standing still, not moving, either immobilized by fear and hopelessness or reluctant to move out of my comfort zone? Am I seeking ways to leave behind the occasions of sin and situations that degrade my dignity? It would be a good Lenten exercise for us to compare our daily life with that of some migrant or foreigner, to learn how to sympathize with their experiences and in

this way discover what God is asking of us so that we can better advance on our journey to the house of the Father. This would be a good "examination of conscience" for all of us wayfarers.

Second, to journey *together*. The Church is called to walk together, to be synoda^[2]Christians are called to walk at the side of others, and never as lone travellers. The Holy Spirit impels us not to remain self-absorbed, but to leave ourselves behind and keep walking towards God and our brothers and sisters.^[3]Journeying together means consolidating the unity grounded in our common dignity as children of God (cf.*Gal*3:26-28). It means walking side-by-side, without shoving or stepping on others, without envy or hypocrisy, without letting anyone be left behind or excluded. Let us all walk in the same direction, tending towards the same goal, attentive to one another in love and patience.

This Lent, God is asking us to examine whether in our lives, in our families, in the places where we work and spend our time, we are capable of walking together with others, listening to them, resisting the temptation to become self-absorbed and to think only of our own needs. Let us ask ourselves in the presence of the Lord whether, as bishops, priests, consecrated persons and laity in the service of the Kingdom of God, we cooperate with others. Whether we show ourselves welcoming, with concrete gestures, to those both near and far. Whether we make others feel a part of the community or keep them at a distance.^[4]This, then, is a second call to conversion: a summons to synodality.

Third, let us journey together *in hope*, for we have been given a promise. May*the hope that does not disappoint*(cf.*Rom* 5:5), the central message of the Jubilee, ^[5] be the focus of our Lenten journey towards the victory of Easter. As Pope Benedict XVI taught us in the Encyclical *Spe Salvi*, "the human being needs unconditional love. He needs the certainty which makes him say: 'neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord' (*Rom* 8:38-39)". ^[6]Christ, my hope, has risen! ^[7]He lives and reigns in glory. Death has been transformed into triumph, and the faith and

great hope of Christians rests in this: the resurrection of Christ!

This, then, is the third call to conversion: a call to hope, to trust in God and his great promise of eternal life. Let us ask ourselves: Am I convinced that the Lord forgives my sins? Or do I act as if I can save myself? Do I long for salvation and call upon God's help to attain it? Do I concretely experience the hope that enables me to interpret the events of history and inspires in me a commitment to justice and fraternity, to care for our common home and in such a way that no one feels excluded?

Sisters and brothers, thanks to God's love in Jesus Christ, we are sustained in the hope that does not disappoint (cf. *Rom*5:5). Hope is the "sure and steadfast anchor of the soul". [8] It moves the Church to pray for "everyone to be saved" (*1 Tim*2:4) and to look forward to her being united with Christ, her bridegroom, in the glory of heaven. This was the prayer of Saint Teresa of Avila: "Hope, O my soul, hope. You know neither the day nor the hour. Watch carefully, for everything passes quickly, even though your impatience makes doubtful what is certain, and turns a very short time into a long one" (*The Exclamations of the Soul to God*, 15:3). [9]

May the Virgin Mary, Mother of Hope, intercede for us and accompany us on our Lenten journey.

MESSAGE FROM THE DIRECTOR GENERAL



'Through dawn and stone, our hope arose'.

Your Excellencies, Dear Fathers and Brothers,

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Because of his great mercy, he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3).

Christ is truly risen! Alleluia!

The glorious celebration of Easter reminds us once again of the central truth of Christian faith: Jesus Christ, who was crucified, has risen from the dead. This is not just an event of the past, but a living reality that shapes our present and secures our future, for 'through dawn and stone, our hope arose'.

As members of the Missionary Society of St. Thomas the Apostle, we are called to be bearers of this hope, especially in a world so often weighed down by fear, confusion, and suffering. Every day, we encounter people searching for light in the midst of darkness, peace in the midst of turmoil. What greater message can we offer than the Good News that Christ is alive and walks with us?

In this holy season of Easter, I invite each of you to renew your personal encounter with the Risen Lord. Like Mary Magdalene, let us seek Him with love. Like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, let our hearts burn with joy as He speaks to us through the Scriptures. And like St. Thomas the Apostle, our patron, let us move from doubt to faith, proclaiming with conviction, "My Lord and my God!" Let this hope in the Resurrection not remain a theological concept, but become the very force that drives our vocation and ministry.

Whether you are a priest in the mission field or a seminarian in formation, remember that we are not alone in our work. The Risen Christ goes before us, remains with us, and strengthens us. His victory over death assures us that no challenge is insurmountable when we walk with Him.

The Missionary's Tomb and Triumph

Just as Jesus rose bearing the wounds of His passion, the missionary priest also carries the marks of the cross—fatigue, misunderstanding, spiritual battles. But these wounds, too, proclaim the resurrection. For in every struggle, we become more like the One who sent us.

The missionary field is often a place of silence and hiddenness. Yet it is in these very places that the glory of the Risen Christ breaks through. A single baptism, a reconciled marriage, a healed heart—these are signs of Easter in the soil of mission.

In our communities, let us become signs of this hope—through our compassion, our joyful service, and our unwavering witness. The Resurrection calls us to rise above fear and mediocrity and to live with courage, integrity, and love. Our people need not only priests who teach, but missionaries who radiate the light of Easter.

As we journey together in faith, let us draw strength from our shared mission and from the example of St. Thomas the Apostle, who brought the Gospel to our land. May his bold faith continue to inspire us to go wherever Christ calls, even to the ends of the earth. The Church's future is missionary. Pope Francis reminds us: "I dream of a 'missionary option,' a missionary impulse capable of transforming everything." But this transformation starts in hearts ablaze with the resurrection.

Wishing you all a blessed and hope-filled Easter season. May the joy of the Risen Lord fill your hearts and renew your spirit.

Thekkekarottu delivered the homily. The Associate Missionaries were also invited for the celebration. The celebration concluded with dinner in the Generalate refectory.


8) House Picnic (27/2/2025)

ON-GOING FORMATION PROGRAMMES

1) Ongoing Formation of Formators

The Formators' Meet 2025 was held on 2 April 2025, at Ruhalaya Major Seminary, Ujjain, bringing together the MST formators for a day of reflection and discussion. There were 23 participants including all formators of Ruhalaya, four from Deepti College, Melampara and one each from Jeevan Jyoti, Mandya and Vikas Maitri, Kotra. The programme commenced at 9.30 a.m. with a prayer song. The welcome address was delivered by Rev. Fr Joseph Thekkekarott, Vice Director General and the Formation Secretary, followed by the inaugural address by His Excellency Mar Sebastian Vadakel. The resource person was Very Rev. Fr Francis Athikalam, Rector of KPRT Ashta, who led two insightful sessions until noon focusing on the theme: "Formative Pathways of Spiritual Accompaniment amidst the Complexities of Cyber Space."

Afternoon sessions were presided over by the Director General and were devoted to structured discussions based on critical themes. Key concerns include strengthening faith formation through deeper spiritual practices, reviewing the Animator and evaluation systems for greater transparency and effectiveness, and addressing the gap


between traditional methods and the expectations of the new generation. Ensuring a balance between intellectual, spiritual and pastoral formation, the meeting emphasizes the need to evaluate programmes like the summer mission exposure and explore how to make them more transformative. Special attention is also drawn to forming late-vocation candidates with tailored approaches that respect their maturity and unique backgrounds.

Equally important are discussions on how formators themselves can be more effective through ongoing renewal, specialization, and collaboration. The meeting addressed the urgency of enhancing missionary orientation, particularly in direct preaching and community building. The complexities of running a seminary in the evolving Indian context of growing animosity were thoroughly explored. The members also deliberated on the need for training for formators in formative pedagogy, and academic specializations required for future formators, especially for the philosophy section. The meeting fostered a spirit of mutual listening and shared responsibility in the formative mission of the MST.

2) Mission Meet (21/01/2025)

The Department of Mission Expansion and Preaching Ministry, in collaboration with the on-going programs of the MST, organized a four-day mission meet from January 21 to 24, 2025, at St. Vincent Retreat Centre, Gopalpur, Odisha. This event brought together 33 missionaries from across the country, including the Director General, General Councillors, Regional Directors, and representatives from various apostolates.

The meet commenced with prayer and dynamic interactions, setting a reflective tone for the participants. The highlight of the day was the solemn celebration of the Holy Eucharist, presided over by His Excellency, Right Rev. Dr. Sarat Chandra Nayak, Bishop of Berhampur. Following the Eucharist, the inaugural session was presided over by the Director General, Very Rev. Fr. Vincent Kadalikattilputhenpura. Bishop Sarat inaugurated the gathering with an inspiring address, emphasizing the urgent need for evangelization



and community formation. His enlightening session, titled "Living the Missionary Call in the Present Context of India", challenged participants to respond to contemporary missionary demands with faith and zeal.

The second day featured an invigorating input session by Rev. Fr. Francis Kanampuzha CM. He urged the missionaries to move beyond pre-evangelization activities, such as social and educational programs, and focus on forming vibrant faith communities through these ministries. The subsequent sessions were dedicated to sharing, discussions, and strategic planning. Key topics covered included:

- * Apostolates for the Formation of Faith Communities
- * Revisiting *Mission Ad Gentes* in the *Constitution and Directives* of MST
- * Scope and Strategies for Community Formation in MST Regions
- * Proposals for Future Actions in Community Formation and Preaching Ministries

Participants actively engaged in the sessions, presenting insights and formulating actionable strategies.

The concluding session was presided over by Fr. J. Ayyankanal, Mission Expansion in-Charge. The Director General delivered the

final address, summarizing the discussions and offering an exhortation on the topics covered. Fr. Ivan Muthanattu, Councillor-in-Charge of On-going Formation, expressed gratitude and appreciation for the meeting's fruitful outcomes. Fr. J. Ayyankanal extended thanks to all participants and well-wishers.

The meet reignited the missionary spirit among the participants, who expressed satisfaction with the outcomes. Resolutions included:

- * Organizing similar meetings with the same theme in all MST regions.
- * Strengthening formation programs to equip aspirants with missionary zeal and skills for community formation.
- * Expanding efforts in evangelization and faith community building.
- * Include sessions with same theme in other ongoing formation meetings.

Set against the vibrant backdrop of St. Joseph's Mission Coordination in Odisha and embraced by the serene breeze of Gopalpur Beach, the gathering inspired participants to renew their passion for Christ's mission and reaffirm their commitment to the MST's apostolic mission.

6. Uniform materials to Children

MST Mission in Chengena is one of the interior missions of MST in Tanzania where the people completely depend on agriculture. It is



difficult for them to afford a decent school uniform every year.

Many use uniforms purchased in the previous years. We are grateful to Fr Sajimon Vanderkunnel MST and Fr Jose Valiamangalam MST for their support through their benefactors as well as other benefactors from Tanzania, US, UK and Kuwait. With their contributions we could channelize the amount needed for giving school uniform

materials to the Children in the Mission.

7. ASSISSI Chekechea

The religious sisters have started their ministry in the parish as missionary collaborators on 3 February. The OSF sisters started a

nursery school in the mission as ASSISSI Chekechea. It was a long awaiting need of the villagers in Chengena. We look forward to a more effective development with the presence of OSF Sisters. There



are 70 children in the school in the first year itself.

8. Youth Groups in the Villages

We could organize different youth groups in the villages under the



Mission in Chengena. The youth groups are being organised in every village in the Mission in 2025 as a special ministry of the year. We also organize the Christian youth in Namanguli village under

the mission where there was active participation during the lenten season in Sunday Masses and the weekly prayer services. There are more than 50 youths from this village iself.

9. Blessing and Inauguration of Convent & Formation House

The OSF sisters opened a new convent in Chengena. Although the sisters were working on it since 1980, it was relised only now. The Archbishop of Songea, Most Rev. Damien Dallu, blessed and



inaugurated the formation house and the convent of OSF sisters on 8 March. The MST fathers helped the OSF sisters to realise this dream in Chengena. It is a huge project of 440 million Tanzanian shilling

and MST priests could channelize more than 14% of the total cost through various means. Fr Shaiju Jose worked hard to complete the construction in the



absence of contractors and supervisors. It was highly appreciated by the Archbishop.

10. Pilgrimage to Msalaba Mkuu

The youth group of MST Mission in Chengena organized a pilgrimage to one of the hill stations in Songea ArchDiocese called Msalaba Mkuu on 11th February, on the fortieth Friday. The youth group



from all the 6 communities in the M i s s i o n participated in this pilgrimage as part of the Lent this year. The youth groups from Kilangalanga,

Namaguli, Suluti, Ruegu, Ukiwayuyu and Chengena villages reached Namabengo parish, and from there they started the pilgrimage. The

IN MEMORIAM

1. Rev.Fr Binoy Philippose Thazhathuveettil (1977-2024)



Rev. Fr Binoy Philippose Thazhathuveettil, MST belonging to St Paul Mission Region, Ujjain, passed away peacefully for his eternal reward at 3.00 am on December 25, 2024 at IHM hospital, Bharananganam.

Fr Binoy (Devassia) was born on 07 January 1977 to Mr Philippose and Annamma

Thazhathuveettil and he is survived by the siblings: Philipose, Joseph, Roy & Bincy. He had his primary and secondary education respectively at St. Xavier's LP School, Nellippara (1982-1986) and Calvary UP & HS at Calvary Mount. He joined Deepti minor seminary in 1994 and philosophical and theological studies at Ruhalaya Major Seminary. He was ordained priest on April 12, 2005.

After priestly ordination he served as assistant priest at Deepti Estate Vadakkenchery (2005-2006), St Mary's Church, Agar, Ujjain (2006 June-Nov); St. Peter's Catholic Church, Shujalpur, Ujjain (2006 Nov-2007 May); St. Joseph's Catholic Church, Shajapur, Ujjain (2007-2008). He served as priest in charge at St Mother Theresa Church, Khilchipur, Ujjain (2008-2010) and St Alphonsa Church, Akodia, Ujjain (2012-2017). He served as Finance Officer at Ruhalaya Major Seminary, Ujjain (2017-2020); as Manager of St. Thomas Convent School, Bhatinda. Punjab (2020 - 2021) and as Director of Angel Home, Kadanad. Kerala (2022-2023). After successfully passing the B2 level German language, he was sent for pastoral ministry in the Diocese of Rottenburg-Stuttgart. He landed in Germany on 20th March 2023. After the period of probation he was appointed assistant parish priest at Bad Boll in the diocese of Rottenburg-Stuttgart on January 20, 2024.

Illness and Treatment of Fr Binoy

The Lord's ways are mysterious! On April 12, 2024, Fr Binoy was admitted to RHG Hospital, Ulm, Germany, and was diagnosed cancerous tumour with severe complications. On April 18 he was shifted to Gunzburg due to continued difficulties with his brain and overall health. To the shock of all, the CT and MRI scans revealed a fast-growing tumor, *glioblastoma*, on the left side of his brain. Doctors recommended immediate surgery to remove the tumor. The skull-opening surgery lasted approximately eighteen hours. After the surgery Fr. Binoy suffered a brain stroke and went into a coma for almost a week. On April 29, he showed signs of improvement and was transferred back to Ulm for chemotherapy and physiotherapy. On 16th August, Fr. Binoy was shifted to Station E in RKU to prepare for an operation to replace the removed part of his skull with a Titan Plate. On 19th August, an MRT test was conducted where result showed that the growth of the tumor was aggressive. On 26th August, the operation to replace the removed part of the skull was successfully performed. On September 6, he was shifted to Uniklinik in Ulm for rehabilitation and other therapies. Fr. Binoy was permitted by the doctors to travel to India from the

Fr. Binoy was permitted by the doctors to travel to India from the hospital in Ulm. On September 16, at 1:30 pm on his journey to Kerala, Fr Binoy was accompanied by Frs. Biju Mathew Nellikunnel and Jiji Ettaniyil. Upon his arrival in Kochi on 17th he was admitted in Caritas Hospital where he received specialized medical care in the department of oncology and neurology. Fr. Binoy was discharged on September 24 with the advice to continue VEGFXTA injections to stabilize the growth of the tumour. During the period of convalescence, he stayed at *Araam* and received VEGFXTA injections every fifteen days. He visited his parents and relatives at home twice in October 2024. On November 2, after returning from home, his health began to deteriorate.

Last Days of Fr Binoy

Following his third VEGFXTA injection, he experienced severe adverse reactions, and the injections were discontinued. On

November 6 due to worsening health condition Fr Binoy was transferred to Marygiri Hospital, where he was given palliative care treatment. On November 8, Rev. Fr. Director General administered the Anointing of the Sick to Fr. Binoy. On December 19 when his health declined further, Fr. Lonappan Arangassery administered the Anointing of the Sick in the presence of many Fathers from Deepti Bhavan. On the evening of December 24, Fr. Binoy's condition deteriorated significantly and at 3:00 am on Christmas Day, Fr. Binoy Thazhathuveettil peacefully passed away in the Hospital, surrounded by his brothers, MST Fathers and hospital staff.

Funeral and Last Rites



The body of Fr Binoy was taken to home in Nellippara, Idukki for the first part of the funeral rites on 25 December, 2024. The first part of the funeral liturgy was officiated by bishop Mar John

Nellikunnel, the bishop of Idukki at 7.30 p.m. On December 26, 2024 the body was brought to *Aaraam* on Deepti Mount at 8.30

am and then the body was kept at MST Generalate auditorium for public viewing. The second part of the funeral liturgy was officiated by Mar Raphael Thattil, the Major Archbishop, at 1.30 pm followed by Holy Qurbana.



Mar Joseph Kallarangattu prayed the Office for the dead. The final part of the funeral rites was presided over by the Director General, Fr Vinson Joseph.

The untimely and unexpected illness and consequent demise of Fr



Binoy Thazhathuveettil was literally a shock for all the members of the Society. Fr Binoy, however, accepted his sickness as God's will wholeheartedly. He completely entrusted himself to the providence of God with joy. He was a

calm and silent hard worker and carried out his responsibilities meticulously well. He mastered German language very fast and secured his driving license in the first instance. He was very good at playing Thabala and was sound engineer. He also served the communities with his expertise in electrical work.

The MST is thankful to the Lord for the gift of Fr Binoy and bows before His will and entrust Fr Binoy back into the Hands of the Lord whom he served faithfully as a priest for the past two decades. We recommend him to the mercy of the Lord.

The Seventh Day of Fr Binoy was commemorated at Deepti Generalate on December 31, 2024. Fr Vinson Joseph K, the DG, Fr Lonappan Arangassery, Fr Kochettonnil and Fr Joseph Kannathukuzhy concelebrated at the Qurbana on the day, followed by the Office for the dead in the cemetery and special prayers at the Generalate.

2. Rev. Fr Zacharias Thudippara (1940-2025)

Rev. Fr Zacharias (Scaria) Thudippara (85), MST belonging to St Paul Region, Ujjain, was called for his eternal reward at around 8.00 a.m. on Saturday, March 8, 2025 at IHM hospital, Marygiri, Bharananganam.

Rev. Fr Zacharias Thudippara was born to Chacko Pazhethudippara and Mariam Azhakath on February 13, 1940 at Bharananganam as

the 5th child and was baptised on 19/02/1940. The siblings are: Joseph, Mathew (Mani), Chacko, Sr Teresia and Mary. He had



his school education in Bharananganam and passed SSLC in 1957. He joined the Good Shepherd Minor Seminary in 1957 and passed PUC in 1958. He had his Major seminary formation (Philosophy at St Joseph's Seminary, Carmelgiri and theology at Mangalapuzha) from 1959 to 1966.

Sacred Orders and Early Appointments

FrThudippara received the orders of Karoyusa in 1963 and Heupadyaknusa in 1964 at Alwaye from Mar Sebastian Vayalil. He was conferred the Order of *M'samsanusa* by Archbishop Joseph Parekattil in 1966 and was ordained priest for the eparchy of Palai on 12 March, 1966 by Mar Sebastian Vayalil. After priestly ordination he was appointed Assistant vicar at Vakakad in 1966, at Kozhuvanal in 1968 and at Aruvithura in 1969. In 1970, he was appointed Joint Director of Vocation Bureau and Catechism. He was appointed Catechism Director of the diocese of Palai in 1972.

Higher Studies

He secured a diploma in Psychology from East Asian Pastoral Institute, Manila, Philippines in 1969 and attended a Counselling course at Christian Counselling Centre, Vellore in 1972. He was sent for higher studies in Rome in September 1978. He did Licentiate and doctorate in theology and defended his doctoral thesis in theology on: *Evangelisation among the low Caste people in Madhya Pradesh* on March 5, 1983 from the University of St Thomas Aquinas (*Angelicum*), Rome. He returned to India in 1983.

Pioneer Member of the MST and Apostolate

Rev. Fr Zacharias Thudippara is one of the pioneer members of the MST and made his first promise of Incorporation into the MST with others in 1968. Fr Zacharias started his life as an active missionary in 1973 in the exarchate of Ujjain, the first mission Region entrusted to the MST. In Ujjain, he was first appointed the priest-

in-charge of the Mission Station at Rajgarh in 1973. In 1977, he was appointed acting Vicar General and Director of Catechism in the eparchy of Ujjain. It was during this period the first phase of the ground floor of the Catechetical Centre (CC) of the eparchy of Ujjain was constructed.

After returning from Rome in 1983, he was appointed the Regional Director of St Paul Region, Ujjain (1983-1988). While he was the Regional Director, he was also appointed teacher and formator at Khrist Premalaya Theologate at Ashta, Sehore, M.P during the academic year 1983-1984. He was appointed the Director of the Missionary Orientation Centre (MOC), Jeevan Jyothi Bhavan at Kamed, Ujjain on July 15, 1984. When he was relieved from the MOC in 1986, he was appointed the Director of the Catholic Dialogue and Information Centre, Ujjain as well as Director of Catechetical works in the diocese of Ujjain with effect from May 20, 1986.

On December 31, 1987 he was given additional charge of the Navada Mission Station till September 10, 1988. Fr Zacharias was relieved of the office of the Regional Director on June 10, 1988. On April 20, 1989, the then Director General appointed him to make a study of the missionary methods and prospective mission areas in Assam-Manipur area in the North East for Mission work and he was relieved by the Bishop of Ujjain on June 1, 1989 for one year for this study at the request of the Director General.

Pastoral Ministry in Germany

Fr Zacharias was sent to Germany for pastoral ministry in January 1991 at the request of the Diocese of Regensburg. In the beginning, he served as Pfarr Administrator at Leonberg (Kath.Pfarramt 8596 Leonberg) and at Batzenhoffen in Augusburg. He served in Germany as pastor in the dioceses of Regensburg, Augsburg, Wuerzburg and Hamburg. Fr Zacharias Thudippara was appointed the first Director of St Thomas Institute and the MST house at Batzenhoffen in the diocese of Augsburg on October 22, 1992. He was parish priest in the diocese of Augsburg in the parish of the Twelve Apostles from

1993 to 1996. On March 12, 1996, Fr Zacharias was granted permission by the Society to do pastoral ministry in the diocese of Wuerzburg for three years till November 1999. After returning from Germany his service was made available to Divine Retreat Centre at Muringoor from Feb.1, 2000 at the request of Fr Justin Panackal. On November 21, 2000, Fr Zacharias was appointed Director of Prayer Apostolate, at Prarthana Bhavan, Pachore and he was formally relieved from Prarthana Bhavan, Pachore on November 8, 2004.

Fr Zacharias had been actively engaged in the preaching ministry in various parts of the world based in Germany with the permission of the Society. According to Fr Zacharias, he has travelled to 27 countries to preach the gospel and retreats. At the age of 75, he was called back in 2015 and took residence at Aaram priest home. However, at the request of the Centre for "Evangelisation 2000 Haus St Theresia von Lisieux e.V" again he was granted permission on December 26, 2015 to go to Germany to take up preaching ministry from January 1, 2016 for a period of three years. While in Germany he had to undergo treatment for Cardiac problems and other health issues and therefore he had to stay back. He returned to *Aaram* definitively in 2020 during the time of Covid-19 epidemic.

The members of the Missionary Society of St Thomas are very much saddened at the sudden demise of Fr Zacharias Thudippara although he was on the sick bed for a few years. He was an ardent missionary and good retreat preacher especially in Germany for a long period. With his pleasant and welcoming nature he endeared himself to all who came in contact with him. Wherever he served – eparchies of Palai, Ujjain and Germany- he worked hard and was successful and effective. As a pioneer member of the MST and missionary in Ujjain he was fully committed to the *ad gentes* mission of the Society.

While he was in the Vocation Bureau and in charge of the Catechism department of the eparchy of Palai he was instrumental in guiding numerous vocations to priesthood and religious life. The fact, that he was always on demand from German Charismatic groups and

the people who benefitted from his ministry of preaching, counselling and healing, speaks volumes how effective instrument he was in the hands of the Lord. He always, even when he was on bed, made others happy and joyful with his spontaneous jokes and comments.

Funeral Rites

The mortal remains of Rev. Fr Zacharias Thudippara were kept at IHM hospital and the body was brought to *Aaram* on Monday



(10/03/2025) at 8.00 am and thereafter the body was kept for public viewing at 8.30 am in the open auditorium of the MST Generalate. Cardinal Mar George Alanchery prayed the Office for the dead



in the forenoon. The second part of the funeral rites was presided over by the Director General concelebrated by

Regional Directors, the priests and religious family people and MST community. The Holy Qurbana that followed was presided over by Mar Sebastian Vadakel, the Bishop of



Ujjain. The third part of the funeral service was presided over by



Mar Joseph Kallarangattu and the body was interred in the cemetery on Deepti Mount.

Let us thank the Lord and bow before His will and entrust Fr Zacharias Thudipara into the

hands of the Lord whom he served faithfully as a priest for the past 59 years.

3. Rev. Fr Jose Kochuparackal MST (1952-2025)

Rev. Fr Joy (Joseph) Kochuparackal 1952-2025) MST belonging to St Thomas Mission Region, Mandya, is called for his eternal reward at around 5.20 a.m. on Saturday, March 15, 2025 at Nirmala Hospital, Marykunnu, Kozhikode.



Fr Joy was born to Kurian Kochuparackal and Annakutty Kuzhumbil on May 15, 1952 at Kurinji in the eparchy of Palai as the second child with the siblings Augustine, Mathew and Alice. After SSLC, he joined Good Shepherd Minor Seminary, Palai (1968-1970) for the MST. He did his philosophical studies at St Joseph's Pontifical Seminary, Carmelgiri

(1970-1973), Regency at Vikas Maîtri, Kotra, Eparchy of Ujjain, MP (1973-1974) and theology at St Joseph's Pontifical Seminary, Mangalapuzha (1974-1978). He was ordained deacon by Mar Joseph Powathil on March 17, 1977 and ordained priest on 12 March 1978 by Mar John Perumattam at Puthuppady. Fr Joy made perpetual promise of Incorporation into the Society on February 24, 1979.

Higher Studies and Missionary Apostolate

Fr Joy passed Intermediate from *Vikram* University in 1974, BA from Kerala University in 1983, LLB from Mysore University (1990) and MA in English from Osmania University, Hyderabad in 1992. He has several National and International certificates to his credit.

After priestly Ordination in 1978, Fr Joy served the People of God all over the world in various capacities such as Assistant Priest at Little Flower Church, N.R. Pura (1978-1979), St Sebastian's Church, Kottiyoor (1979-1980), and priest in charge at Puthurvayal-Gudallur (1981-1984). In 1984 he went to his Mission Region in Mandya and was appointed priest in Charge and director of Vimalalaya, Guthalu, Mandya (1984-1986). From 1986-1991 he was Director of Social Work of St Thomas Region, Mandya. From

1991-1994 he served as the Director of Community Health Department of Catholic Hospital Association of India (CHAI), Secundarabad. In 1994 he was appointed the HOD of the Medicolegal Cell and Action, CHAI, Secundarabad.

A Missionary beyond Boundaries

From 1994 October to 2000, with the concurrence of Vatican Secretariat of State, he was appointed the International Chaplain to FIMARC: International Federation of Rural Adult Catholic Movements, which has its headquarters in Belgium. After his term of office in FIMARC, he took a decennial break from 28/11/2000-30/11/2001. During break he served at Infant Jesus Church, Port Jefferson, Long Island USA till February 2002.

When he was appointed the priest in charge of St Joseph's Church, Varakkad (May 10, 2003-May 10, 2008) he constructed a new church at Varakkad. While he was in Varakkad, he became aware of the need of the farmers and their struggles. The rich experiences he gained from FIMARC enabled him to organise the farmers in the parish and northern Kerala. In 2004, he succeeded in organising the farmers under the banner of nationally acclaimed *Fair Trade Alliance Kerala* (FTAK). He continued to serve as its Promoter till his death.

Fr Joy was transferred to St Thomas Church, Vijayapuram, (Asankavala), Kannur as parish priest from May 10, 2008 to May 14, 2011. Later he was appointed resident priest at Santhome Bible Centre, Pariyaram on May 14, 2011. On September 12, 2016, he was appointed the Chairman of the committee formed to coordinate the Ayurveda hospital Project of the MST: Ayurvedic and Naturopathic Health Care Centre, Bamberde, Mulas, MS. He was appointed Director, Santhome Ayurvedic Arogya Kendra, Bedshi, MS on October 1, 2017 and he continued in this office till his death on March 15, 2025.

Illness and Treatments to Fr Joy

Fr. Joy Kochuparackal suffered a fall at Santhome MST House, Pariyaram, on the night of September 9, 2024. On the 10th he was

taken to Fr Muller's Hospital, Mangalore, for treatment by Fr James Marottikudy and Fr Tony Ramachanattu with the help of family members. After initial examinations, doctors diagnosed a minor brain haemorrhage along with complications in his liver, lungs, and prostate. He was admitted under the care of psychiatric specialist, with close monitoring by a neurosurgeon. Following the initial treatment, he was transferred to the Neuro-Surgical Department for further management of his brain injury and other health concerns.

After two weeks of treatment, Fr. Joy was discharged on September 24, 2024, and taken back to Santhome, Pariyaram for rest and recovery. However, as he resisted medical advice and rehabilitation efforts, he was moved to Deepti Bhavan on September 26, 2024. He exhibited unstable blood sugar levels, balance issues, speech difficulties, and withdrawal symptoms. Consequently on October 3, 2024, he was taken to Mar Sleeva Medicity Hospital, Pala, where treatment began under the psychiatric department alongside continued neuro-surgical care. A physician also attended to his multiple health concerns, revealed through a whole-body MRI scan. Further investigations showed brain shrinkage and unresolved bleeding, necessitating on-going treatment. Meanwhile, consultations were held with Dr Pradeep Kottam of Rajagiri Hospital and Dr Joseph Sebastian of Caritas Hospital for a second opinion on further treatment options. After reviewing his reports and the condition, they recommended continuance of treatment at Medicity and suggested palliative care. On October 19, 2024, he was administered the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick by the Director General. After exhausting all available treatment options, he was discharged on October 26, 2024, and transferred to Marygiri Hospital, Bharananganam for palliative care. At Marygiri Hospital, Fr. Joy received palliative care and physiotherapy for several weeks to aid his recovery. He was transferred to Aaram on November 14. 2024, where fathers and staff assisted in his rehabilitation.

Last Days of Fr Joy

After consulting the doctors, he was shifted to Mar Vayalil Medical

Centre, Moolamattam on December 7, 2024, for continued therapy and treatment. Since there was no significant improvement in his health at Moolamattam, at the suggestion of a neurosurgeon at Nirmala Hospital, Marykunnu, Kozhikode, and respecting the interest of Fr Sebastian Kizhakeyil and the family members, Fr. Joy was shifted to Nirmala Hospital, Marykunnu on February 26, 2025. Fr Joy experienced respiratory distress on March 14, night and he was moved to the ICU for intensive care. Early morning on March 15, 2025, at 4.30 there was sudden bradicardia and CPR was initiated. In spite of all the efforts, Fr Joy Kochuparackal was declared dead due to cardiac arrest at 5:20 am.

Funeral and Last Rites

The mortal remains of Rev. Fr Joy Kochuparackal were kept at IHM hospital and the body was brought to *Aaram* on Monday, March 17, 2025, at 8.00 am. The body was placed for public viewing



at 8.30 am in the open auditorium at the MST Generalate. The funeral service started at 1.30 pm followed by Holy Qurbana and burial at the cemetery on Deepti Mount. The Society

remembers with gratitude Cardinal Mar George Alencherry and Mar Joseph Kallarangattu (Palai) who came to Deepti and prayed the

office for the dead and Mar James Athikalam who presided over Holy Qurbana. The MST place on record its gratitude to delegates from CHAI and *Fair Trade Alliance Kerala* and people from various walks of life who came to Deepti to bid farewell to and pray for Fr Joy.



The entire MST family is saddened by the demise of Rev. Fr Joy Kochuparackal who was an exemplary philanthropist and Good Samaritan for all those who were in need irrespective of caste, creed and religion. When he was parish priest in Puthurvayal-Gudallur, he

was actively involved in the people's movement giving them leadership against extradition (Kudiyirakku) from Gudalloor area. The people who benefitted from his leadership in their struggles are still indebted to him and remember him with love and gratitude. He had been working all throughout his priestly ministry



for the poor and the needy. He worked on various projects to help the Society, the various religious congregations and the cause of the people around. The experiences he gained from FIMARC and his exposures as its chaplain to the farmers of numerous countries round the world helped him a lot in this ministry.

The members of the Society see in Fr Joy the compassionate Christ. His services are very much appreciated by the people whom he has helped to stand on their own legs. The MST was very close to his heart. His correspondences with the Society bear ample witness to his love for and commitment to the Society. The fact, that he was always on demand from the farmers of northern Kerala, indicate how much they loved him.

The 11th day commemoration was held on March 25, 2025 at the Generalate after Holy Qurbana in the public chapel and office for the dead at the cemetery.

We thank the Lord for the gift of Fr Jose to us and bow before His Holy Will and entrust him into the hands of the Lord whom he served faithfully as a priest for the past 47 years.

4. Rev. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam MST

Rev. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam MST, former Director General (1978-1988) of the MS, belonging to St Paul Mission Region, Ujjain, was called for his eternal reward at 7.15 am on Thursday April 10, 2025 at IHM hospital, Marygiri, Bharananganam.



Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was born to Kurian and Mariam on March 20, 1935 at Kalathookadavu as the 3rd child, and was baptised at Plassanal on March 25, 1935. The siblings are: Varkey (late), Fr Joseph, Mathai (late) and Annakutty. He had his primary and

middle school education at Edamaruku, and secondary education (SSLC) at Plassanal (1953) and intermediate from St Thomas College Palai in 1955.

Ecclesiastical Studies and Sacred Orders

Fr Kurian joined the Good Shepherd Minor Seminary in 1955 and he had his major seminary formation with Philosophy between 1957-1960 and theology studies, between 1960-1964, at Sacred Heart Seminary of the Salesians, in Poonamalee, Madras (Chennai). He received the minor orders and diaconate at Sacred Heart Seminary and he was ordained a priest for the eparchy of Palai on March 3, 1964 at Bharananganam from Mar Sebastian Vayalil, the first bishop of Palai and the founder of the MST.

Early Appointments and Higher Studies

After the priestly ordination, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was first appointed as Assistant Parish priest at Cherpunkal from 1964 to 1966. After securing BA and MA in Indian Philosophy (1966-1970) he was appointed vicar at St Gregorios Church, Kizhapazhayar from 1970 to 1971. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam did his graduation (BA) at Christian College, Lucknow (1966-1968) and secured Masters in Indian Philosophy in 1970 and Ph. D in Comparative religion in 1977 from Benares Hindu University (BHU), Varanasi, U. P. He secured a certificate in Sanskrit studies from Ujjain during 1971 to 1973.

Pioneer Member of the MST & Apostolate

Rev. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam is one of the first 16 pioneer members of the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle who made the first promise of Incorporation into the Missionary Society on July 16, 1968. As one of the pioneer members of the MST, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam started his life as an active missionary in 1971 in the exarchate of Ujjain, the first mission Region entrusted to the MST by the Holy See. In the Exarchate of Ujjain, he was appointed the vicar Holy Trinity Church on Dewas Road, Ujjain (1971-1973). Fr Kurian returned to Ujjain from Varanasi after securing Ph. D. in Comparative religion in 1977. He was then appointed Spiritual Father and Procurator at Vikas Maitri, the Missionary Orientation Centre at Kotra in the eparchy of Ujjain for the women Religious who were new to the north Indian Mission.

Director General of MST

In the General Assembly held from July 11-13, 1978, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was elected the third Director General of the Missionary Society of St Thomas the Apostle for the next five years from 1978-1983. In 1978, he also held for some time the office of the Rector of the Minor seminary until Fr Joseph Maliparampil was appointed Rector in December 1978.

Fr Kurian was a great missionary with a vision and the mission in Mandya was launched on September 22, 1978. A formal agreement was signed on Oct 19, 1980 between the Eparch of Mananthawady and the Director General of the MST regarding the apostolate of the Society in Mandya. During the Quinquennial General Assembly held from May 19 to 25, 1983, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was reelected as the Director General of the MST (1983-1988).

Fr Kurian was very much aware of the importance and need of the ecclesial formation of the Syro-Malabar faithful outside Kerala and the obligation of the Society to look after the less organised Syro-Malabar Catholic migrants. The Missionary Society was entrusted by the SMBC with the pastoral care of the Syro-Malabar migrants through Syro-Malabar Chaplaincy in the then diocese of Pune. Fr

Kurian Valiamangalam sent Fr George Kavukattu and Fr Lonappan Arangassery to Pune on June 9, 1984 as pioneer chaplains to be appointed by the Bishop of Pune.

Fr Kurian Valiamangalam, during the second term of his office as the Director General, started the process to realise the statutory vision and obligation of the MST to have its own Major Seminary. Although the Oriental Congregation denied permission to start its own philosophy advising to start a study house, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam, who initiated the process of starting the MST Major seminary, convinced the Oriental Congregation in person and secured permission in 1984. With the approval of the Dicastery for the Oriental Churches, Ruhalaya Philosophy seminary was inaugurated on July 3, 1986 with Fr Thomas Parayady as its first Rector at Kamed village on the Ujjain-Agar Road, after shifting the MOC temporarily to Rajgarh and permanently to Srirangapatna, Mandya.

Back to the Mission

When his second term of office as the Director General was over, Fr Kurian returned to Ujjain. He always loved to be in the mission and with the people. He initiated in a humble way *Ashram* life with the support of two other like-minded MST priests: Fr Francis Kandathil and Fr Joseph Karikilamthadam. They started *Ashram* life at Bachukheda naming it: *Jai Sleeva Ashram*. Fr Kurian practically remained a missionary at *Jai Sleeva Ashram*, Bachukheda leading a very simple and austere life till 2005. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was relieved of his responsibilities as the priest in charge from *Jai Sleeva Ashram*, Bachukheda, with effect from 26th September 2005.

At the request of Fr Xavier Koodapuzha, the superior of *Mar Thoma Sleeha* Monastery, Nallathanny, Fr Kurian Valiamangalam was sent there to serve as Spiritual Father for one year with effect from October 1, 2005. On his return to Ujjain after one year, he was appointed the Director of Catholic Information Centre, Ujjain. He was relieved of the responsibility as the Director of Catholic Information Centre, Ujjain on 27th June, 2007.

Thereafter, he was appointed professor and Spiritual Director at *Jeevan Jyothi*, the Missionary Orientation Centre of MST on July 1, 2007. In 2010, when he returned to Ujjain, he was appointed visiting Spiritual Father in the Theology section of Ruhalaya Major Seminary on November 8, 2010 till the end of the academic year. In 2011, when Fr Kurian reached the age of retirement, he withdrew from active ministry and came to *Aaram*. However, he continued to render pastoral service in the neighbourhood parishes whenever needed.

As a true missionary and member of the MST he was fully committed to the ad gentes mission of the Society. He was an ardent, simple, austere missionary and one who preached the gospel through life witness. He spent most of his missionary life at Jai Sleeva Ashram, Bachukheda with the limited facilities, spending his life in prayer, sacrifices, village visits, education of children and agriculture. He was a man of strong convictions about his priestly, missionary and ecclesial identity and he lived up to his convictions foregoing the allurements of the world. He was truly a vir ecclesiasticus: an ecclesial person who always stood for the cause of the mother Church and who appropriated the dictum: sentire cum ecclesiae totally committed and obedient to the ecclesiastical authorities. Although he himself lived a very austere life, he was tolerant of other's views, convictions and life style. With his calm and pleasant and welcoming nature, he endeared himself to all who came in contact with him and commanded their respect. He was a scholar in Indian Philosophy and Indian Scriptures and was visiting professor of theology and philosophy in various institutes.

Last Days of Fr Kurian

Fr Kurian was affected by COVID-19 pandemic and his health deteriorated during the post Covid period. He had to be admitted in various hospitals, particularly in Mar Sleeva Medicity, Palai and IHM hospital at Bharananganam for multiple health issues. In the beginning of 2022 he was admitted in the palliative care unit of Mar Kavukattu

Memorial Hospital, Pravithanam. As there was no significant improvement, he was brought back to *Aaram* in November 2022. Since then, he was looked after and nursed at *Aaram*. However, his heath condition did not improve significantly. Finally he slept in the Lord on April 10, 2025 at 7.15 am in IHM hospital, Bharananganam. We, the members of the Missionary Society of St Thomas are very much saddened at the demise of Fr Kurian Valiamangalam although he was bedridden after the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Funeral and Last Rites

The mortal remains of Rev. Fr Kurian Valiamangalam were kept at IHM hospital and the body was be brought to St Maria Vianney parish, Kalathookadavu for the first part of the funeral service on Saturday (12/04/2025) at 6.30. The body was brought to *Aaram* at 8.00 am. Thereafter, the body was kept for public viewing in the open auditorium at the MST Generalate. Mar Joseph Perumthotam,

Archbishop emeritus of Changanacherry prayed the office for the dead and paid respects to Fr Kurian at 10.30 am. Fr Lonappan Arangassery, the Secretary General read the condolence message of the Major Archbishop Mar Raphael Thattil at 1.20 pm.

1. Foundation Day 2025

The MST Foundation Day is at our door steps. The MST can be proud of 57 years of her meaningful existence. In tune with the spirit of the Constitutions, you are exhorted to celebrate the Foundation Day meaningfully giving due importance. I wish you all the greetings of the Foundation Day and invoke God's blessing in abundance on the Society and her Missions.

2. Fr Thuruthel Memorial Scholarship

It is a matter of great joy that two scholarships have been instituted in memory of late Fr Sebastian Thuruthel, one by the MST and the other by the students of the First Batch (1969-70) of Deepti Minor Seminary.

- Fr Sebastian Thuruthel has set apart a Burse to institute scholarships for the students of Deepti Minor seminary. As per his wish, one student, from all the three batches, who score the highest total marks in the examinations held during the year will be given a cash award every year.
- The students of the first batch (1969-1970) of Deepti Minor seminary, both ordained priests and those who discontinued, expressed their desire to cherish the memory of their Rector, Rev. Fr Sebastian Thuruthel. Accordingly, they have instituted a Burse in his memory to: 1) sponsor a theology student for priesthood continually and 2) give cash awards to three MST theologians who score the highest aggregate of marks for the B.Th. examinations.

The Society is very grateful to all the students of the first batch of Deepti Minor Seminary, especially to Mr Cherian Karinthakara for his initiative in this regard.

3. New Leader for African Mission

There was an online meeting of the African missionaries with the members of the General Administration on 10th February, 2025 at 6.00 p.m. The missionaries in Tanzania shared their views and concerns regarding the Mission with the Administration as well as shared matters related to the Society and the Members. Rev.Fr Kizhakkekureethadathil Joseph (Shaiju) was proposed as the leader of the Missionaries working in Tanzania and it was confirmed by the Director General with the consent of the Council. 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
